The Parables of the Growing Seed and the Mustard Seed (11th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B)

Ezekiel 17:22-24—The Parable of the Cedar Tree

- 1. Cedar of Lebanon: used to build Royal Palace and Temple (cf. 2 Sam 5; 1 Kings 5-7)
 - a. Wealth: king's house is "paneled" with "cedar" (Jer 22:14)
 - b. Strength: the voice of the LORD "breaks the cedars of Lebanon" (Ps 29:5)
 - d. Height: "lofty and lifted up") (Isa 2:13; Pliny the Elder, up to 130 ft tall)

"Say to Pharaoh king of Egypt and to his multitude: "...Behold, I will liken you to a cedar in Lebanon, with fair branches and forest shade, and of great height, its top among the clouds... So it towered high above all the trees of the forest; its boughs grew large and its branches long... All the birds of the air made their nests in its boughs; under its branches all the beasts of the field brought forth their young; and under its shadow dwelt all great nations. It was beautiful in its greatness... The cedars in the garden of God could not rival it, nor the fir trees equal its boughs... no tree in the garden of God was like it in beauty. I made it beautiful in the mass of its branches, and all the trees of Eden envied it, that were in the garden of God. (Ezekiel 31:1-9)

- 2. <u>Cosmic Mountain</u>: the great mountain that fills the earth (cf. Dan 2:44-45)
- 3. Supernatural Tree: "bears fruit" and "birds and beast" dwell beneath it

Psalm 92—Lord, it is Good to Give Thanks to You

- 1. Palm Tree: the "righteous" flourishes like "the palm tree" (v. 12)
- 2. Temple Cedar: the righteous "grow" in "the house of the LORD" (v. 13)

2 Corinthians 5:6-10—Momentary Affliction vs. Eternal Weight of Glory

1. Faith: "we walk by faith, and not by sight" (5:7)

Mark 4:26-34—The Parables of Growing Seed and the Mustard Seed

- 1. Parable of the Growing Seed: Unique: only found in the Gospel of Mark
 - a. Title: ("Seed Growing Secretly," "Patient Farmer," "Earth Producing of Itself"
 - c. Sower: scatters Seed on the Grain
 - d. Growth: "he knows not how" (=Mystery)
 - d. Power of God: "the earth produces of itself"
- 2. Parable of the Mustard Seed:
 - a. OT Background: Empires (Dan 4:10-12; Ezek 31:1-16; Ezek 17:22-24)
 - b. Mustard Seed: "smallest of all the seeds" (1 millimeter in diameter; proverbial)
 - b. Mustard Tree: "greatest of all shrubs" or "vegetables" (lachanon) (ca. 10 ft tall)
 - c. Bird of the Air: the "birds" come to "make nests in its shade"

Vatican II on the Mystery of the Kingdom and the Church

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Christ inaugurated the Kingdom of heaven on earth and revealed to us the mystery of that kingdom... *The Church*, or, in other words, *the kingdom of Christ now present in mystery*, grows visibly through the power of God in the world. (Vatican II, Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, *Lumeng Gentium* no. 3)

3. Why does Jesus compare the Kingdom of God to a "mustard seed" and a "mustard tree"? Why not a "cedar of Lebanon)?
