- 4-5 Tiffany Roses
- 4-5 Orange Crush Roses
- 4-6 Peach Ranunculus
- 3-4 Yellow Ranunculus
- Sprigs of Feverfew
- 4-5 Yellow Carnations
- 2 Yellow Button Poms
- 4-5 Peach Hypericum Berries
- Sprigs of Israeli Ruscus, and Variegated Pittosporum

Bridesmaid Bouquet

- 2 Tiffany Roses
- 2 Orange Crush Roses
- 1-2 Peach Ranunculus
- 1 Yellow Ranunculus
- Sprigs of Feverfew
- 2 Yellow Carnations
- 1 Yellow Button Pom
- 1-2 Peach Hypericum Berries
- Sprigs of Israeli Ruscus, and Variegated Pittosporum

Bouts & Corsages

Peach Hypericum Berry sprigs, Yellow Button Poms, sprigs of greenery. Save a ranunculus for the groom to make it special!

2 Large Ceremony Urns or 2 Large Foam Cages for Arch

Per Urn or Cage:

- 1 bunch of Leatherleaf Fern
- 1 bunch of Variegated Pittosporum
- 12 Orange Crush Roses
- 12 Peach Carnations
- 10 Yellow Button Poms



10 Centerpieces with 5-6" Vase Diameter

- 3 Tiffany Roses
- 3 Orange Crush Roses
- 2 Peach Ranunculus
- Sprigs of Feverfew
- 3 Yellow Carnations
- 2 Yellow Button Poms
- 2 Peach Hypericum Berries
- Sprigs of Brillantina, Israeli Ruscus, and Variegated Pittosporum

Recipes for Citrus Crush Packages



25-30 Mason Jars -or-3-4" Vase Diameter

- 1Tiffany Rose
- 1 Orange Crush Rose
- 1Peach Ranunculus
- Sprigs of Feverfew
- 1 Yellow Carnation
- 1 Yellow Button Pom
- 1 Peach Hypericum Berry
- Sprigs of Brillantina, Israeli Ruscus, and Variegated Pittosporum



60-70 Bud Vases

Each one will look different. We average 2-3 blooms per bud vase and a sprig of greenery. These are the flowers allotted for bud vases:

- 25 Tiffany Roses
- 25 Orange Crush Roses
- 20 Peach Ranunculus
- 3 bunches Feverfew
- 25 Yellow Carnations
- 20 Yellow Button Poms
- 20 Peach Hypericum Berries
- 2 bunches Brillantina
- 3 bunches Israeli Ruscus
- 2 bunches Variegated Pittosporum

Special Care Notes

Special Flower Care Notes for Items Specific to this Package

- Garden Roses: Garden Roses tend to be a bit more delicate that standard roses, and need their own vase.
- Ranunculus: Have 22 gauge straight floral wire on hand in case they are heavily curved and bending under their own weight. We have a Youtube video on how to do this!
- **Feverfew**: Feverfew is a bit delicate, and I tend to have more loss, so that should be expected. Keep in a cool location, and give it its own vase. Keep away from heat.
- **Carnations**: Sometimes these guys can come in closed, but with carnations, you can easily use thumbs to push or 'mash' them open. They are extremely tough and hardy, and the only flower you can manhandle in that way.
- **Poms and Thistle:** As a designer, I often break this product apart to not only make it go further, but to reduce the size and visual weight. I love pulling off lower sprigs to then be used in bouts or a corsage!
- **Bug Nibbles:** Remember that you are working with unprocessed greenery, so you may find some leaves that have been munched. Just snip those away! Nibbles are typically found on seeded eucalyptus predominately
