

Recipes for Cream and Sage Packages



Bridal Bouquet

- 7-9 White Roses
- 3 White Carnations
- 5-6 White Ranunculus
- 4-6 White Lisianthus
- 3-5 Cream Spray Roses
- Sprigs of Gunni, Silver Dollar Eucalyptus, and Baby Eucalyptus



Bridesmaid Bouquet

- 4-5 White Roses
- 2-3 White Carnations
- 2 White Ranunculus
- 2-3 White Lisianthus
- 2 Cream Spray Roses
- Sprigs of Gunni, Silver Dollar Eucalyptus, and Baby Eucalyptus



Bouts & Corsages

Average 1-2 spray rose buds per bout, and 3 buds per corsage. Add sprigs of lisianthus and your favorite greenery! Save a ranunculus for the groom's bout to make it special!

2 Large Ceremony Urns or 2 Large Foam Cages for Arch

- Per urn or cage:
- 13 White Carnations
- 13 White Roses
- 1 bunch Leatherleaf Fern
- 1 bunch Silver Dollar Eucalyptus
- 1 bunch of Baby Eucalyptus



10 Centerpieces with 5-6" Vase Diameter

- 4-5 White Roses
- 2-3 White Carnations
- 1 Cream Spray Rose
- 3 White Lisianthus Reflexed
- Sprigs of Gunni, Baby Euc, and Leatherleaf Fern

Recipes for Cream and Sage Packages



25–30 Mason Jars

–or–

3–4" Vase Diameter

- 2 White Roses
- 1 White Carnation
- 0–1 Cream Spray Rose
- 1–2 White Lisianthus
- Sprigs of Leatherleaf Fern, Gunni, and Baby Eucalyptus



50–60 Bud Vases

Each one will look different. I average 2–3 blooms per bud vase and a sprig of green. These are the flower allotted for centerpieces:

- 50 White Roses
- 25 White Carnations
- 30 White Lisianthus broken apart
- 10 Cream Spray Roses
- 2 bunches each of Leatherleaf Fern, Baby Eucalyptus, and Gunni Eucalyptus

Special Care Notes

Special Flower Care Notes for Items Specific to this Package

- ≡ **Roses and Lisianthus:** Reflexing your roses and lisianthus is a baller florist move! Not only does it create visual interest, it makes your product larger, getting you more bang for your buck! I do this right before I pull the flower into a design.
- **Ranunculus:** Have 22 gauge straight floral wire on hand in case they are heavily curved and bending under their own weight. We have a Youtube video on how to do this!
- **Carnations:** Sometimes these guys can come in closed, but with carnations, you can easily use thumbs to push or 'mash' them open. They are extremely tough and hardy, and the only flower you can manhandle in that way.
- **Gunni Eucalyptus:** The tops of this greenery can have young, tender leaves. Sometimes the tops will wilt and curl. This is normal and should be snipped or pinched off. The bunch is not bad when this occurs, it's just fresh, tender growth!
- **Bug Nibbles:** Remember that you are working with unprocessed greenery, so you may find some leaves that have been munched. Just snip those away! Nibbles are typically found on seeded euc and salal.
