## Recipes for Peach and Blue Packages



### Bridal Bouquet

- 5-6 Shimmer roses
- 5-6 White roses
- 3 White lisianthus
- 3 White carnations
- 4-6 Peach ranunculus
- 3-5 Light blue delphinium
- Sprigs of thistle, gunni, baby eucalyptus, and leatherleaf fern.

### Bridesmaid Bouquet

- 2-3 Shimmer roses
- 3 White roses
- 1 White lisianthus
- 2-3 White carnations
- 2 Peach ranunculus
- 2 Light blue delphinium
- Sprigs of mini peach carnations, thistle, and greenery

### Bouts & Corsages

Average 1-2 mini peach carnation buds per bout and 3 mini carnation buds per corsage. Use a mixture of thistle, lisianthus buds, and greenery. Save a peach ranunculus for the groom's bout to make it special!





## Recipes for Peach and Blue Packages



### 2 Large Ceremony Urns or 2 Large Foam Cages for Arch

- Per urn or cage:
- 13 Shimmer roses
- 13 White carnations
- 10 Light blue delphinium
- 1 bunch silver dollar eucalyptus
- 1/2 bunch baby eucalyptus
- 1 bunch leatherleaf fern



#### 10 Centerpieces with 5-6" Vase Diameter

- 2-3 shimmer roses
- 2-3 white carnations
- 2 light blue delphinium
- Sprigs of thistle
- 2 peach ranunculus
- 2 white lisianthus
- Sprigs of leatherleaf, parvifolia eucalyptus, and baby eucalyptus

## Recipes for Peach and Blue Packages



#### 25-30 Mason Jars -or-3-4" Vase Diameter

- 1 shimmer rose
- 1 white carnation
- 1 light blue delphinium
- Sprigs of thistle
- 1 peach ranunculus
- 1 white lisianthus
- Sprigs of greenery



#### 60-70 Bud Vases

Each one will look different. We average 2-3 blooms per bud vase and a sprig of greenery. These are the flowers allotted for bud vases:

- 25 shimmer roses
- 25 white carnations
- 20 light blue delphinium
- 2 bunches thistle
- 20 peach ranunculus
- 2 bunches white lisianthus
- 1 bunch leatherleaf
- 2 parvifolia eucalyptus
- 2 baby eucalyptus

# Special Care Notes

#### Special Flower Care Notes for Items Specific to this Package

- **Garden roses:** Juliet garden roses tend to be more delicate than standard roses, so be sure to give them their own vase! Feel free to use the blow dryer, with the heating element OFF, to help blow them open if they do not start to open within a day or so.
- **Reflex Roses and Lisianthus:** We adore reflexing roses and lisianthus! It's a baller florist move that gives you more bang for your buck! <u>Check out how to reflex on this page.</u>
- **Ranunculus**: Have 22 gauge straight floral wire on hand in case your ranunculus are heavily curved and bending under their own weight. <u>Learn how to wire ranunculus on this page.</u>
- **Tweedia**: This is a more delicate flower that needs to be in its own vase, in a cool location. The leaves are often chew and unattractive, and when pinched off seeps a sticky, milky sap. This is normal but a good reason to give the flowers their own vase before designing.
- **Bug Nibbles:** Remember that you are working with unprocessed greenery, so you may find some leaves that have been munched. Just snip those away! Nibbles are typically found on seeded eucalyptus and salal.
- **Eucalyptus**: Seeded eucalyptus is off crop and unavailable late March-June. Gunni eucalyptus typically has tender growth on ends that shrivel and can be snipped or pinched off. This is normal and to be expected with greenery.
