## Recipes for Dusty Rose and Marsala Packages



### Bridal Bouquet

- 5 Quicksand Roses
- 5 Cream Ranunculus
- 3-4 Cream Spray Roses
- 4-6 Burgundy Scabiosa
- 4-6 Burgundy Carnations
- Sprigs of Leatherleaf Fern, Israeli Ruscus, and Gunni Eucalyptus



### Bridesmaid Bouquet

- 3 Quicksand Roses
- 2-3 Cream Ranunculus
- 2 Cream Spray Roses
- 3 Burgundy Scabiosa
- 3 Burgundy Carnations
- Sprigs of Greens



### Bouts & Corsages

I average 1-2 buds per bout, and 3 buds per corsage, with sprigs of greens. The flowers that will work for this are the cream spray roses, scabiosa, or ranunculus.

# 2 Large Ceremony Urns or2 Large Foam Cages for Arch

#### Per Urn or Cage:

- 13 Quicksand Roses
- 13 Burgundy Carnations
- 1 bunch Leather Leaf
- 1 bunch Silver Dollar Eucalyptus



# 10 Centerpieces with 5-6" Vase Diameter

- 2-3 Quicksand Roses
- 2-3 Burgundy Carnations
- 2 Cream Spray Roses
- 2 Burgundy Scabiosa
- 2-3 Pink Lisianthus
- Sprigs of Leather Leaf, Israeli Ruscus, and Gunni Eucalyptus

## Recipes for Dusty Rose and Marsala Packages



### 25-30 Mason Jars -or-3-4" Vase Diameter

- 1 Quicksand Rose
- 1 Burgundy Carnation
- 1 Cream Spray Rose
- 1 Burgundy Scabiosa
- 1 Pink Lisianthus
- Sprigs of Leather Leaf, Israeli Ruscus, and Gunni Eucalyptus



#### 60-70 Bud Vases

Each one will look different. I average 2-3 blooms per bud vase and a sprig of green. These are the flower allotted for budvases:

- 25 Quicksand Roses
- 25 Burgundy Carnations
- 20 Cream Spray Roses
- 20 Burgundy Scabiosa
- 20 Pink Lisianthus
- 2 bunches of Leather Leaf
- 3 bunches of Israeli Ruscus
- 2 bunch of Gunni Eucalyptus

## Special Care Notes

### Special Flower Care Notes for Items Specific to this Package

- Roses and Lisianthus: Reflexing your roses and Lisianthus is a baller florist move! Not only does it create visual interest, it makes your product larger, getting you more bang for your buck! I do this right before I pull the flower into a design.
- Scabiosa: Scabiosa often comes with clear straws on the stem. Leave these on, even in your designs, if possible. I only remove if I want the stem to curve or stick out of an arrangement. Burgundy scabiosa can have lavender pollen that can be pinched off if you don't enjoy. Sometimes throughout the year, the petals will not be popped and you're more working with a bud.
- Ranunculus: Have 22 gauge straight floral wire on hand in case they are heavily curved and bending under their own weight. We have a Youtube video on how to do this!
- Carnations: Sometimes these guys can come in closed, but with carnations, you can easily use thumbs to push or 'mash' them open. They are extremely tough and hardy, and the only flower you can manhandle in that way.
- Bug Nibbles: Remember that you are working with unprocessed greenery, so you may find some leaves that have been munched. Just snip those away!
