Bridal Bouquet

- 5-6 Ocean Song Roses
- 3-5 Dark Purple Carnations
- 3-4 Cream Spray Roses
- 4-5 Dark Purple Lisianthus
- 3-4 Dark Purple Stock
- Sprigs of Baby Eucalyptus, Italian Ruscus, and Leather Leaf Greenery



Bridesmaid Bouquet

- 2-3 Ocean Song Roses
- 2 Dark Purple Carnations
- 2 Cream Spray Roses
- 2-3 Dark Purple Lisianthus
- 2 Dark Purple Stock
- Sprigs of Baby Eucalyptus, Italian Ruscus, and Leather Leaf Greenery



Bouts & Corsages

Average 1-2 spray rose buds per bout, and 3 buds per corsage. Add sprigs of your favorite green! The purple lisianthus and carnations could also be used!

2 Large Ceremony Urns or
2 Large Foam Cages for Arch

Per Urn or Cage:

- 12 Ocean Song Roses
- 10 Dark Purple Carnations
- 1 bunch of Leather Leaf
- 1 bunch of Baby Eucalyptus
- 1/2 bunch of Brillantina



10 Centerpieces with
5-6" Vase Diameter

- 2-3 Ocean Song Roses
- 2 Dark Purple Carnations
- 2-3 Dark Purple Lisianthus
- 2 Cream Spray Roses
- 2 Dark Purple Stock
- Sprigs of Brillantina, Baby Eucalyptus, and Leather Leaf

Recipes for Eggplant and Lavender Packages



25-30 Mason Jars

-or-

3-4" Vase Diameter

- 1 Ocean Song Rose
 - 1 Dark Purple Carnation
 - 1 Dark Purple Lisianthus
 - 1 Cream Spray Rose
 - 1 Dark Purple Stock
 - Sprigs of Brillantina, Baby Eucalyptus, and Leather Leaf
- **each one can be a bit different



60-70 Bud Vases

Each one will look different. I average 2-3 blooms per bud vase and a sprig of green. These are the flower allotted for budvases:

- 25 Ocean Song Roses
- 20 Dark Purple Carnations
- 30 Dark Purple Lisianthus
- 20 Cream Spray Roses
- 20 Dark Purple Stock
- 2 bunches of Brillantina, Leather Leaf, and Baby Eucalyptus

Special Care Notes

Special Flower Care Notes for Items Specific to this Package

- **Roses and Lisianthus:** Reflexing your roses and Lisianthus is a baller florist move! Not only does it create visual interest, it makes your product larger, getting you more bang for your buck! I do this right before I pull the flower into a design.
- **Carnations:** Sometimes these guys can come in closed, but with carnations, you can easily use thumbs to push or 'mash' them open. They are extremely tough and hardy, and the only flower you can manhandle in that way.
- **Stock:** Stock is pretty hardy, however, since the lower buds bloom first, they tend to be the first to die. Therefore, it's not uncommon to need to pinch off the lower buds that look 'chewy'. Keep in a cool location.
- **Bug Nibbles:** Remember that you are working with unprocessed greenery, so you may find some leaves that have been munched. Just snip those away! Nibbles are typically found on seeded eucalyptus predominately
