- Sprigs of Thistle, Leather Leaf, and 2-3 Israeli Ruscus

## 2 Large Ceremony Urns or 2 Large Foam Cages for Arch

Per Urn or Cage:

- 13 Minerva Carnations
- 6 Reflexed Golden Mustard Garden Roses
- 10 Dark Blue Delphinium
- 10 Dark Purple Delphinium
- 1 bunch of Leather Leaf
- 1bunch of Brillantina



## 10 Centerpieces with <br> 5-6" Vase Diameter

- 2-3 Minerva Carnations
- 2-3 Golden Mustard Roses
- 2-3 Queen's Crown Roses
- 2 Deep Purple Lisianthus
- 1-2 Rubicon Spray Roses
- 2 Dark Blue Delphinium
- Sprigs of Thistle, Leather Leaf, and 2-3 Israeli Ruscus

> 25-30 Mason Jars
> -or-

3-4" Vase Diameter

- 1 Minerva Carnation
- 1 Golden Mustard Rose
- 1 Queen's Crown Rose
- 1 Deep Purple Lisianthus
- 1 Rubicon Spray Roses
- 1Dark Blue Delphinium
- Sprigs of Thistle, Leather Leaf, Brillantina, and 1 Israeli Ruscus


## 60-70 Bud Vases

Each one will look different. We average 2-3 blooms per bud vase and a sprig of greenery. These are the flowers allotted for bud vases:

- 25 Minerva Carnations
- 25 Golden Mustard Roses
- 25 Queen's Crown Roses
- 20 Purple Lisianthus
- 20 Rubicon Spray Roses
- 20 Dark Blue Delphinium
- 2 bunches of Thistle, 1 bunch of Brillantina, 2 bunches of Israeli Ruscus, and 2 bunches of Leather Leaf


## Special Flower Care Notes for Items Specific to this Package

- Reflex Rose and Lisianthus: We adore reflexing roses and lisianthus! It's a baller florist move that gives you more bang for your buck!
- Guard Petals on Roses and Spray Roses: Fugly petals are a part of the florist hustle, just pluck 'em off!
- Carnations: Sometimes these guys can come in closed, but with carnations, you can easily use thumbs to push or 'mash' them open. They are extremely tough and hardy, and the only flower you can manhandle in that way.
- Delphinium: Delphinium is a weaker flower that does not have a long vase life. It tends to shed so don't let that alarm you. Keep it in a cool location and baby the hell outta it!
- Bug Nibbles: Remember that you are working with unprocessed greenery, so you may find some leaves that have been munched. Just snip those away! Nibbles are typically found on seeded eucalyptus predominately.
