

Recipes for Lavender and Cream Packages



Bridal Bouquet

- 5-6 Ocean Song Roses
- 3-4 White Carnations
- 3-4 Cream Spray Roses
- 1-2 Lavender Spray Roses
- 1-2 Lavender Button Poms
- 4-5 White Lisianthus
- Sprigs of Baby and Gunni Eucalyptus, and Leather Leaf



Bridesmaid Bouquet

- 2-3 Ocean Song Roses
- 2-3 White Carnations
- 2 Cream Spray Roses
- 1 Lavender Spray Rose
- 1-2 Lavender Button Poms
- 3 White Lisianthus
- Sprigs of Baby and Gunni Eucalyptus, and Leather Leaf



Bouts & Corsages

Average 1-2 spray rose or button pom buds per bout, more for corsages with sprigs of greenery.

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2 Large Ceremony Urns or 2 Large Foam Cages for Arch

Per Urn or Cage:

- 10-12 Ocean Song Roses
- 10-12 White Carnations
- 10 Mauve Snapdragons
- 1 bunch of Leather Leaf
- 1 bunch of Baby Eucalyptus
- 1 bunch of Gunni Eucalyptus



10 Centerpieces with 5-6" Vase Diameter

- 2-3 Ocean Song Roses
- 2-3 Lavender Button Poms
- 2 Cream Spray Roses
- 1 Lavender Spray Rose
- 2-3 White Lisianthus
- 2-3 White Carnations
- Base of Gunni and Baby Eucalyptus, and Leather Leaf for coverage

Recipes for Lavender and Cream Packages



25-30 Mason Jars

-or-

3-4" Vase Diameter

- 1 Ocean Song Rose
- 1 Lavender Button Pom
- 1 Cream Spray Rose
- 1 Lavender Spray Rose
- 1-2 White Lisianthus
- 1 White Carnation
- Sprigs of Gunni and Baby Eucalyptus, and Leather Leaf for coverage

60-70 Bud Vases

Each one will look different. I average 2-3 blooms per bud vase and a sprig of green. These are the flower allotted for budvases:

- 25 Ocean Song Roses
- 20 Lavender Button Poms
- 20 Cream Spray Roses
- 10 Lavender Spray Roses
- 30 White Lisianthus
- 25 White Carnations
- 2 bunches Baby Eucalyptus, 3 bunches of Gunni, and 2 bunches of Leather Leaf



Special Care Notes

Special Flower Care Notes for Items Specific to this Package

- **Reflex Roses and Lisianthus:** We adore reflexing roses and lisianthus! It's a baller florist move that gives you more bang for your buck!
- **Guard Petals:** Expect to have guard petals on your standard and spray roses. These are the outer, fugly petals that can easily be plucked off!
- **Carnations:** Sometimes these guys can come in closed, but with carnations, you can easily use thumbs to push or 'mash' them open. They are extremely tough and hardy, and the only flower you can manhandle in that way.
- **Break Apart Poms, Spray Roses, and Lisianthus:** So button poms, spray roses, and lisianthus comes with many buds on one stem. Therefore, florists often cut it apart to make it smaller (using leftover in bouts and corsages) or cut it apart to disperse in centerpieces. It feels weird to cut something apart, but it makes your product go further!
- **Bug Nibbles:** Remember that you are working with unprocessed greenery, so you may find some leaves that have been munched. Just snip those away! Nibbles are typically found on seeded euc and salal predominately.
- **Eucalyptus:** Seeded eucalyptus is off-crop and unavailable late March/June. Gunni euc typically has tender growth ends that shrivel and can be snipped or pinched off, this is normal and to be expected with this greenery.
