# Recipes for Mauve and Plum Packages







### Bridal Bouquet

- 3-5 Amnesia Roses
- 3-5 Faith Roses
- 3-5 White Carnations
- 3 White Spray Roses
- 3-5 White Lisianthus
- 3-5 Brown Lisianthus
- 3-5 Deep Violet Ranunculus
- Sprigs of Seeded Eucalyptus, Leather Leaf and Baby Eucalyptus

### Bridesmaid Bouquet

- 2 Amnesia Roses
- 2 Faith Roses
- 2-3 White Carnations
- 1 White Spray Roses
- Any leftover White Lisianthus
- 2 Brown Lisianthus
- 2 Deep Violet Ranunculus
- Sprigs of Seeded Eucalyptus, Leather Leaf and Baby Eucalyptus

### Bouts & Corsages

I average 1-2 spray rose buds per bout, and 3 buds per corsage. Use lisianthus buds, cream spray rose and sprigs of greens! I like to save a plum ranunculus for the groom's bout.

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#### 2 Large Ceremony Urns or 2 Large Foam Cages for Arch

Per Urn or Cage:

- 13 Faith Roses
- 10 Mauve Snapdragons
- 1 bunch of Leather Leaf
- 1 bunch of Baby Eucalyptus
- 1 bunch of Silver Dollar Eucalyptus



#### 10 Centerpieces with 5-6" Vase Diameter

- 2 Amnesia Roses
- 2 Faith Roses
- 2-3 White Carnations
- 3-5 White Lisianthus
- 2 Deep Purple Ranunculus
- 2 Brown Lisianthus
- Sprigs of Baby Blue Eucalyptus, Seeded Eucalyptus, and Leather Leaf

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#### 25-30 Mason Jars -or-3-4" Vase Diameter

- 1 Amnesia Rose
- 1 Faith Rose
- 1 White Carnation
- 1 White Lisianthus
- 1 Deep Purple Ranunculus
- 1 Brown Lisianthus
- Sprigs of Baby Blue Eucalyptus, Seeded Eucalyptus, and Leather Leaf



#### 60-70 Bud Vases

Each one will look different. I average 2-3 blooms per bud vase and a sprig of green. These are the flower allotted for budvases:

- 25 Amnesia Roses
- 25 Faith Roses
- 25 White Carnations
- 20 White Lisianthus
- 20 Deep Purple Ranunculus
- 20 Brown Lisianthus
- 2 bunches of Seeded Eucalyptus, Leather Leaf, and Baby Eucalyptus

# Special Care Notes

#### Special Flower Care Notes for Items Specific to this Package

- Roses and Lisianthus: Reflexing your roses and Lisianthus is a baller florist move! Not only does it create visual interest, it makes your product larger, getting you more bang for your buck! I do this right before I pull the flower into a design. =
- **EMauve Snapdragons:** Expect for these guys to curve. By keeping the upright, or propped against a corner wall will help prevent this.
- **ERanunculus**: Have 22 gauge straight floral wire on hand in case they are heavily curved and bending under their own weight. We have a Youtube video on how to do this!
- **Carnations**: Sometimes these guys can come in closed, but with carnations, you can easily use thumbs to push or 'mash' them open. They are extremely tough and hardy, and the only flower you can manhandle in that way.
- **Gunni Eucalyptus:** Often the tops of gunni can have new, tender growth. The problem is new growth will often shrivel up and need to be snipped off. This does not mean you have a bad bunch, just pinch off the fugly top and you'll be good to go!
- **Bug Nibbles:** Remember that you are working with unprocessed greenery, so you may find some leaves that have been munched. Just snip those away! Nibbles are typically found on seeded euc and salal predominately
