- 4-5 Brown Lisianthus
- 3-4 Burgundy Scabiosa
- Sprigs of Israeli Ruscus, Italian Ruscus, Leather Leaf, and Baby Eucalyptus



Bridesmaid Bouquet

- 2-3 Amnesia Roses
- 2-3 Minerva Carnations
- 2 Deep Violet Ranunculus
- Brown Lisianthus Sprigs
- 2 Burgundy Scabiosa
- Sprigs of Israeli Ruscus, Leather Leaf, and Baby Eucalyptus



Bouts & Corsages

Sprigs of greenery, and leftover scabiosa, lisianthus, ranunculus, and carnations

2 Large Ceremony Urns or 2 Large Foam Cages for Arch

Per Urn or Cage:

- 12-13 Amnesia Roses
- 12-13 Minerva Carnations
- 1 bunch of Leather Leaf
- 1/2 bunch of Salal
- 1 bunch of Baby Eucalyptus



10 Centerpieces with 5-6" Vase Diameter

- 2-3 Amnesia Roses
- 2-3 Minerva Carnations
- 2 Deep Violet Ranunculus
- Sprigs of Brown Lisianthus
- 2 Burgundy Scabiosa
- Sprigs of Israeli Ruscus, Leather Leaf, and Baby Eucalyptus

25-30 Mason Jars -or-3-4" Vase Diameter

- 1Amnesia Rose
- 1 Minerva Carnation
- 1 Deep Violet Ranunculus
- 1 Burgundy Scabiosa
- 1 Brown Lisianthus
- Sprigs of Israeli Ruscus, Leather Leaf, and Baby Eucalyptus



60-70 Bud Vases

Each one will look different. I average 2-3 blooms per bud vase and a sprig of green. These are the flower allotted for budvases:

- 25 Amnesia Roses
- 25 Minerva Carnations
- 20 Deep Violet Ranunculus
- 20 Brown Lisianthus
- 20 Burgundy Scabiosa
- 3 bunches of Israeli Ruscus, 2 Leather Leaf, and 2 Baby Eucalyptus

Special Care Notes

Special Flower Care Notes for Items Specific to this Package

It's helpful to have a can of Burgundy Design Master Floral Spray paint to spray out some greenery to be darker!

- \(\) \(\) Roses and Lisianthus: Reflexing your roses and lisianthus is a baller florist move! Not only does it create visual interest, it makes your product larger, getting you more bang for your buck! I do this right before I pull the flower into a design.
- Chocolate Queen Anne's Lace: QAL always ships in looking really smashed and sad, and then it will droop. However, no fear! Just recut the stem, I like to cut around 3-4" off and pop it in its own vase of water. 90% of the time it will perk up and be utter perfection within a day. It does shed a little, so don't let that be of concern. ≡
- Scabiosa: Scabiosa often comes with clear straws on the stem. Leave these on, even in your designs, if possible. I only remove if I want the stem to curve or stick out of an arrangement. Burgundy scabiosa can have lavender pollen that can be pinched off if you don't enjoy. Sometimes throughout the year, the petals will not be popped and you're more working with a bud.

- **Ranunculus**: Have 22 gauge straight floral wire on hand in case they are heavily curved and bending under their own weight. We have a Youtube video on how to do this!
- Carnations: Sometimes these guys can come in closed, but with carnations, you can easily use thumbs to push or 'mash' them open. They are extremely tough and hardy, and the only flower you can manhandle in that way. ≡
- Bug Nibbles: Remember that you are working with unprocessed greenery, so you may find some leaves that have been munched. Just snip those away! Nibbles are typically found on seeded euc and salal predominately.
