

# Recipes for Peach Burgundy Packages



## Bridal Bouquet

- 4-5 Symbol Roses
- 4-5 Peach Ranunculus
- 3-5 Tiffany Roses
- 4-6 Burgundy Carnations
- 3-4 Rubicon Spray Roses
- Sprigs of Leather Leaf, Israeli Ruscus, and Baby Eucalyptus



## Bridesmaid Bouquet

- 1-2 Symbol Roses
- 2 Peach Ranunculus
- 2-3 Tiffany Roses
- 2-3 Burgundy Carnations
- a few Mini Peach Carnations
- 1- 2 Rubicon Spray Roses
- Sprigs of Leather Leaf, Israeli Ruscus, and Baby Eucalyptus



## Bouts & Corsages

Average 1-2 blooms per bout a 2-3 per corsage. Use Mini Peach Carnations, Rubicon Spray Rose buds, sprigs of greens, and save a ranunculus for the groom's bout!

# Recipes for Peach Burgundy Packages



2 Large Ceremony Urns or  
2 Large Foam Cages for Arch

Per Urn or Cage:

- 12 Peach Tiffany Roses
- 12 Burgundy Carnations
- 12 Symbol Roses
- 1 bunch of Leatherleaf
- 2 Israeli Ruscus
- 1 bunch of Baby Eucalyptus



10 Centerpieces with  
5-6" Vase Diameter

- 2-3 Symbol Roses
- 2 Peach Ranunculus
- 2-3 Tiffany Roses
- 2-3 Burgundy Carnations
- 2 Rubicon Spray Roses
- a few Peach and Burgundy Mini Carnations
- Sprigs of Leather Leaf, Israeli Ruscus, and Baby Eucalyptus

# Recipes for Peach Burgundy Packages



25-30 Mason Jars

-or-

3-4" Vase Diameter

- 1 Symbol Rose
- 1 Peach Ranunculus
- 1 Tiffany Rose
- 1 Burgundy Carnation
- 1 Rubicon Spray Rose
- a few Peach and Burgundy Mini Carnations
- Sprigs of Leather Leaf, Israeli Ruscus, and Baby Eucalyptus



60-70 Bud Vases

Each one will look different. I average 2-3 blooms per bud vase and a sprig of green. These are the flower allotted for budvases:

- 25 Symbol Roses
- 20 Peach Ranunculus
- 25 Tiffany Roses
- 25 Burgundy Carnations
- 20 Rubicon Spray Roses
- 20 Burgundy Mini Carnations
- 20 Peach Mini Carnations
- 3 Leather Leaf, 3 Israeli Ruscus, and 2 Baby Eucalyptus

# Special Care Notes

## Special Flower Care Notes for Items Specific to this Package

- **Roses and Guard Petals:** All types of roses (Standard, Garden and Spray Roses) has guard petals which are fugly, spotted, brown petals on the outside of the rose to protect the inner layers. Don't freak, just pluck those off as it's a normal part of being a florist.
- **Reflex Roses:** We adore reflexing roses! It's a baller florist move that gives you more bang for your buck!
- **Ranunculus:** Have 22 gauge straight floral wire on hand in case they are heavily curved and bending under their own weight. We have a Youtube video on how to do this!
- **Carnations:** Sometimes these guys can come in closed, but with carnations, you can easily use thumbs to push or 'mash' them open. They are extremely tough and hardy, and the only flower you can manhandle in that way.
- **Bug Nibbles:** Remember that you are working with unprocessed greenery, so you may find some leaves that have been munched. Just snip those away! Nibbles are typically found on seeded euc and salal predominately.
