## Recipes for Peaches and Cream Packages



### Bridal Bouquet

- 5-7 Juliet garden roses
- 3-5 White roses
- 3-5 white lisianthus
- 3 white carnations
- 3-5 peach ranunculus
- sprigs of white lisianthus
- sprigs of silver dollar, gunni, seeded, and baby eucalyptus



### Bridesmaid Bouquet

- 1 Juliet garden rose
- 2-3 White roses
- 2 white lisianthus
- 2 white carnations
- 2 peach ranunculus
- 1-2 peach spray roses
- sprigs of silver dollar, gunni, seeded, and baby eucalyptus



### Bouts & Corsages

Average 1-2 mini peach carnation buds per bout and 3 mini carnation buds per corsage. Add lisianthus buds and a mixture of greens! Save a ranunculus bloom for the groom's bout to make it special!

### 2 Large Ceremony Urns or 2 Large Foam Cages for Arch

- Perurn or cage:
- 5 peach stock
- 5 white stock
- 13 Tiffany roses
- 13 white carnations
- 1bunch salal
- 1 bunch silver dollar eucalyptus
- 1.2 bunch baby eucalyptus



# 10 Centerpieces with 5-6" Vase Diameter

- 2-3 Tiffany roses
- 2-3 white carnations
- 1/3 bunch white lisianthus
- 3 peach ranunculus
- sprigs of salal tips, seeded eucalyptus, gunni eucalyptus, and baby eucalyptus

## Recipes for Peaches and Cream Packages



### 25-30 Mason Jars -or-3-4" Vase Diameter

- 1 Tiffany peach rose
- 1 white carnation
- 1 white lisianthus reflexed
- 1 peach spray rose
- 1 peach ranunculus
- sprigs of salal tips, variegated pittosporum, and baby eucalyptus
- \*Each one will look slightly different!



#### 60-70 Bud Vases

Each one will look different. We average 2-3 blooms per bud vase and a sprig of greenery. These are the flowers allotted for bud vases:

- 25 Tiffany peach roses
- 25 white carnations
- 30 white lisianthus
- 30 peach ranunculus
- 1 bunch salal tips
- 2 bunches seeded eucalyptus
- 2 bunches gunni eucalyptus
- 1 bunch baby eucalyptus

## Special Care Notes

### Special Flower Care Notes for Items Specific to this Package

- **Garden roses:** Juliet garden roses tend to be more delicate than standard roses, so be sure to give them their own vase! Feel free to use the blow dryer, with the heating element OFF, to help blow them open if they do not start to open within a day or so.
- Reflex Roses and Lisianthus: We adore reflexing roses and lisianthus! It's
  a baller florist move that gives you more bang for your buck! <u>Check out</u>
  how to reflex on this page.
- Ranunculus: Have 22 gauge straight floral wire on hand in case your ranunculus are heavily curved and bending under their own weight. <u>Learn</u> <u>how to wire ranunculus on this page.</u>
- **Carnations**: Sometimes these guys can come in closed. With carnations, you can easily use your thumbs to push or gently 'mash' them open. They are extremely tough and hard, and the only flowers you can manhandle in that way.
- **Bug Nibbles:** Remember that you are working with unprocessed greenery, so you may find some leaves that have been munched. Just snip those away! Nibbles are typically found on seeded eucalyptus and salal.
- **Eucalyptus**: Seeded eucalyptus is off crop and unavailable late March-June. Gunni eucalyptus typically has tender growth on ends that shrivel and can be snipped or pinched off. This is normal and to be expected with greenery.
