## Peaches and Coral

## \*\*recipes broken down per bouquet/centerpiece

- <u>1 Large Bridal Bouquet:</u> 4-6 Shimmer roses, 4-6 coral Moviestar roses, 3-5 white carnations, 3-5 peach ranunculus, 2-3 coral spray roses, 5-6 white lisianthus, sprigs of variegated pittosporum and Israeli ruscus
- <u>6-7 Bridesmaid Bouquets:</u> 2-3 Shimmer roses, 2-3 coral Moviestar roses, 2 white carnations, 2 peach ranunculus, 1-2 coral spray roses, 2-3 white lisianthus, sprigs of variegated pittosporum and Israeli ruscus
- <u>Bouts and Corsages:</u> 1-2 Coral spray rose buds and mini peach carnation bud with sprigs of lisianthus buds and greenery. We like to save a ranunculus for the groom's bout to make his special!
- <u>2 Large Ceremony Urns or 2 Large Foam Cages for Arch:</u> 13 coral Moviestar roses, 13 peach carnations, 1 bunch of salal and 1 bunch of variegated pittosporum per urn or cage
- <u>10 Centerpieces with 5-6" Vase Diameter:</u> 2-3 Moviestar, 2-3 Shimmer roses, 2-3 peach carnations, 2 peach ranunculus, few white lisianthus buds, sprigs of salal and variegated pittosporum
- <u>25 Mason jar or 3-4" Vase Diameter:</u> 1 Moviestar rose, 1 Shimmer rose, 1 peach carnation, peach ranunculus, few white lisianthus buds, sprigs of salal and variegated pittosporum \*\*Each one will look different
- <u>60-70 Budvases:</u> Each one will look different. I average 2-3 blooms per bud vase and a sprig of green. These are the flower allotted for budvases: 25 Moviestar, 25 Shimmer roses, 25 peach carnations, 20 peach ranunculus, 20 white lisianthus, 2 bunches of salal, and 3 bunches of variegated pittosporum

## SPECIAL FLOWER CARE NOTES FOR ITEMS SPECFIC TO THIS PACKAGE:

- Reflex Rose and Lisianthus: We adore reflexing roses and lisianthus! It's a baller florist move that gives you more bang for your buck!
- **Guard Petals on Roses and Spray Roses**: Fugly petals are a part of the florist hustle, just pluck'em off!
- **Ranunculus**: Have 22 gauge straight floral wire on hand in case they are heavily curved and bending under their own weight. We have a Youtube video on how to do this!
- **Carnations:** Sometimes these guys can come in closed, but with carnations, you can easily use thumbs to push or 'mash' them open. They are extremely tough and hardy, and the only flower you can manhandle in that way.
