### Bridal Bouquet

- 5-6 Pink O'Hara Garden Roses
- 3-5 Red Spray Roses
- 3-5 Red Ranunculus
- 5-6 Beige Roses
- 3-4 Burgundy Carnations
- 3-4 Light Pink Lisianthus
- Sprigs of Leatherleaf Fern, Israeli Ruscus and Gunni Eucalyptus



## Bridesmaid Bouquet

- 1 Pink O'Hara Garden Rose
- 2 Red Spray Roses
- 2 Red Ranunculus
- 3-4 Beige Roses
- 2-3 Burgundy Carnations
- 1-2 Light Pink Lisianthus
- Sprigs of Greens



### Bouts & Corsages

Average 1-2 spray rose buds per bout, and 3 buds per corsage.

\*\*Pro-Tip: Save a sexy ranunculus for the groom's bout!

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### 2 Large Ceremony Urns or 2 Large Foam Cages for Arch

#### Per Urn or Cage:

- 13 Freedom Roses
- 13 Beige Roses
- 13 Burgundy Carnations
- 1 bunch of Leatherleaf Fern
- 1 bunch of Baby Eucalyptus



# 10 Centerpieces with 5-6" Vase Diameter

- 2-3 Freedom Roses
- 2-3 Beige Roses
- 2-3 Burgundy Carnations
- 3 Red Ranunculus
- 2 Light Pink Lisianthus
- Sprigs of Leatherleaf, Israeli Ruscus and Gunni Eucalyptus

# Recipes for Red Currant Packages



## 25-30 Mason Jars -or-3-4" Vase Diameter

- 1Freedom Rose
- 1Beige Rose
- 1 Burgundy Carnation
- 1Red Ranunculus
- 1 Light Pink Lisianthus
- Sprigs of Leatherleaf Fern, Israeli Ruscus and Gunni Eucalyptus



### 60-70 Bud Vases

Each one will look different. I average 2-3 blooms per bud vase and a sprig of green. These are the flower allotted for budvases:

- 25 Freedom Roses
- 25 Beige Roses
- 25 Burgundy Carnations
- 30 Red Ranunculus
- 20 Light Pink Lisianthus
- 1 bunch Leatherleaf Fern
- 2 bunches of Gunni Eucalyptus and Israeli Ruscus

## Special Care Notes

## Special Flower Care Notes for Items Specific to this Package

- Roses and Lisianthus: Reflexing your roses and lisianthus is a baller florist
  move! Not only does it create visual interest, it makes your product
  larger, getting you more bang for your buck! I do this right before I pull
  the flower into a design.
- **Ranunculus**: Have 22 gauge straight floral wire on hand in case they are heavily curved and bending under their own weight. We have a Youtube video on how to do this!
- **Carnations**: Sometimes these guys can come in closed, but with carnations, you can easily use thumbs to push or 'mash' them open. They are extremely tough and hardy, and the only flower you can manhandle in that way.
- Bug Nibbles: Remember that you are working with unprocessed greenery, so you may find some leaves that have been munched. Just snip those away! Nibbles are typically found on seeded euc predominately
