General supplies and materials that you will need to DIY your blooms:

- Multiple pairs of floral shears, have extra for helpers.
- Scissors to cut the ribbon.
- Trash cans for mess.
- Workspace or table. If possible, borrow a 6-foot plastic table to hold more flowers and wine.
- Short hydration buckets for flowers and greenery.
- Small vases or jars for delicate blooms.

If an item as an asterisk*, no need to buy multiples; one will cover your entire event. If there is not an asterisk then you may need to buy multiples depending on how many you're making. Each product page gives guidance on this.
