## Bridal Bouquet

- 1/3 bunch of Feverfew
- 2 Lavender Button Poms
- 3-4 Yellow Solidago
- 5-6 Peach Ranunculus
- Sprigs of Blue Statice
- 3-4 Dark Blue Delphinium
- 1-2 Purple Orinoco Daisies
- 3 Deep Purple Lisianthus
- 2-3 Deep Pink Spray Roses
- 3-5 Yellow Billy Balls
- 3-5 Israeli Ruscus



## Bridesmaid Bouquet

- Sprigs of Feverfew
- 1 Lavender Button Poms
- 1-2 Yellow Solidago
- 1 Peach Mini Carnation
- Sprigs of Blue Statice
- 1-2 Dark Blue Delphinium
- 1 Purple Orinoco Daisy
- 2 Deep Purple Lisianthus
- 1 Deep Pink Spray Roses
- 1-2 Yellow Billy Balls
- 2 Israeli Ruscus



## Bouts & Corsages

Mixture of solidago, billy balls, lavender button poms, spray roses and greens. Each one can be different! I like to save a ranunculus for the groom's bout to make his special!

2 Large Ceremony Urns or  
2 Large Foam Cages for Arch

Per Urn or Cage:

- 12 Peach Carnations
- 1 bunch of Yellow Solidago
- 10 Dark Blue Delphinium
- 5 Purple Poms
- 5 Deep Pink Spray Roses
- 1 bunch of Brillantina



10 Centerpieces with  
5-6" Vase Diameter

- 2-3 Peach Carnations
- 2 Lavender Button Poms
- 2 Yellow Solidago
- Sprigs of Blue Statice
- 2 Orinoco Daisies
- 2 Purple Lisianthus
- 2 Pink Spray Roses
- 2 Peach Ranunculus
- Sprigs of Brillantina

# Recipes for Wildflowers Packages



25-30 Mason Jars

-or-

3-4" Vase Diameter

- 1 Peach Carnation
- 1 Lavender Button Pom
- 1 Yellow Solidago
- Sprigs of Blue Statice
- 1 Orinoco Daisy Pom
- 1 Purple Lisianthus
- 1 Pink Spray Rose
- 1 Peach Ranunculus
- Sprigs of Brilliantina

\*\*each one will look a bit different!



60-70 Bud Vases

Each one will look different. We average 2-3 blooms per bud vase and a sprig of greenery. These are the flowers allotted for bud vases:

- 25 Peach Carnations
- 2 bunches Lavender Button Poms
- 2 bunches of Yellow Solidago
- 2 bunches of Blue Statice
- 2 bunches of Orinoco Daisies
- 2 bunches of Purple Lisianthus
- 2 bunches of Pink Spray Roses
- 2 bunches of Peach Ranunculus
- 2 bunches of Brilliantina

# Special Care Notes

## Special Flower Care Notes for Items Specific to this Package

- **Feverfew:** This is a more delicate type of 'daisy'. Keep in it's own vase, give a fresh cut, and store in a cool location. As a designer, I typically have a bit more loss with feverfew, as it's more delicate.
- **Lisianthus:** Reflexing the Lisianthus petals is a baller florist move! Although the petals look delicate, they reflex beautifully.
- **Ranunculus:** Have 22 gauge straight floral wire on hand in case they are heavily curved and bending under their own weight. We have a Youtube video on how to do this!
- **Snapdragons:** Snaps like to curve, to avoid this, I often prop them in a corner so they are better supported. If they are leaning in a bucket, you can expect more curve.
- **Poms and Solidado:** As a designer, I often break this product apart to not only make it go further, but to reduce the size and visual weight. I love pulling off lower sprigs to then be used in bouts or a corsage!
- **Bug Nibbles:** Remember that you are working with unprocessed greenery, so you may find some leaves that have been munched. Just snip those away! Nibbles are typically found on seeded euc and salal predominately.
- **Delphinium:** Delphinium is a bit more delicate, with a shorter vase-life, and often sheds. Do not be alarmed by this. Keep in a cool location of the house. Expect more loss with Delphinium in general.
- **Carnations:** Carnations often come 'closed' but they can easily be manhandled! Use your thumbs to smooch open the flower petals to open and 'fluff' it up all the way. This is the only flower that's tough enough
