diesel (n) a type of heavy oil used as fuel 柴油 | 柴油

flimsy (adj) very thin or easily broken 單薄 | 单薄

harpoon (v) to shoot using a long pointed weapon with a rope attached to it 使用捕魚叉 | 使用捕鱼叉

hull (n) the main part of a ship that goes in the water 船體 | 船体

iceberg (n) a large mass of ice floating in the sea 冰山 | 冰山

mast (n) the tall upright pole for supporting the sail on a boat 桅杆 | 桅杆

missile (n) a flying weapon with its own engine that can travel a long distance 導彈 | 导弹

naval (adj) relating to the navy 海軍的 | 海军的

oar (n) a long pole used for rowing a boat 船槳 | 船桨

ocean liner (n) a large commercial ship 郵輪 | 邮轮

pierce (v) to make a hole using a sharp point 刺穿 | 刺穿

plank (n) a long, flat, rectangular board 木板 | 木板

pulley (n) a piece of equipment consisting of blocks and ropes for lifting heavy objects 滑輪 | 滑轮

right angle (n) an angle of 90° 直角 | 直角

rudder (n) a flat piece of material at the back of a boat that is moved from side to side to control the direction 舵 | 舵

shoal (n) a large group of fish swimming together 魚群 | 鱼群

sonar (n) a technology that uses sound waves to detect objects 聲吶 | 声呐

steer (v) to control the direction that a ship is going 掌舵 掌舵

sturdy (adj) strong 結實 | 结实

submarine (n) a type of ship that can travel underwater 潛艇 | 潜艇

ultimate (adj) most extreme or important 終極 | 终极

water-tight (adj) not allowing water to pass through 水密 | 水密

winch (n) a machine for lifting heavy objects by turning a chain or a rope round a drum 絞車 | 绞车
