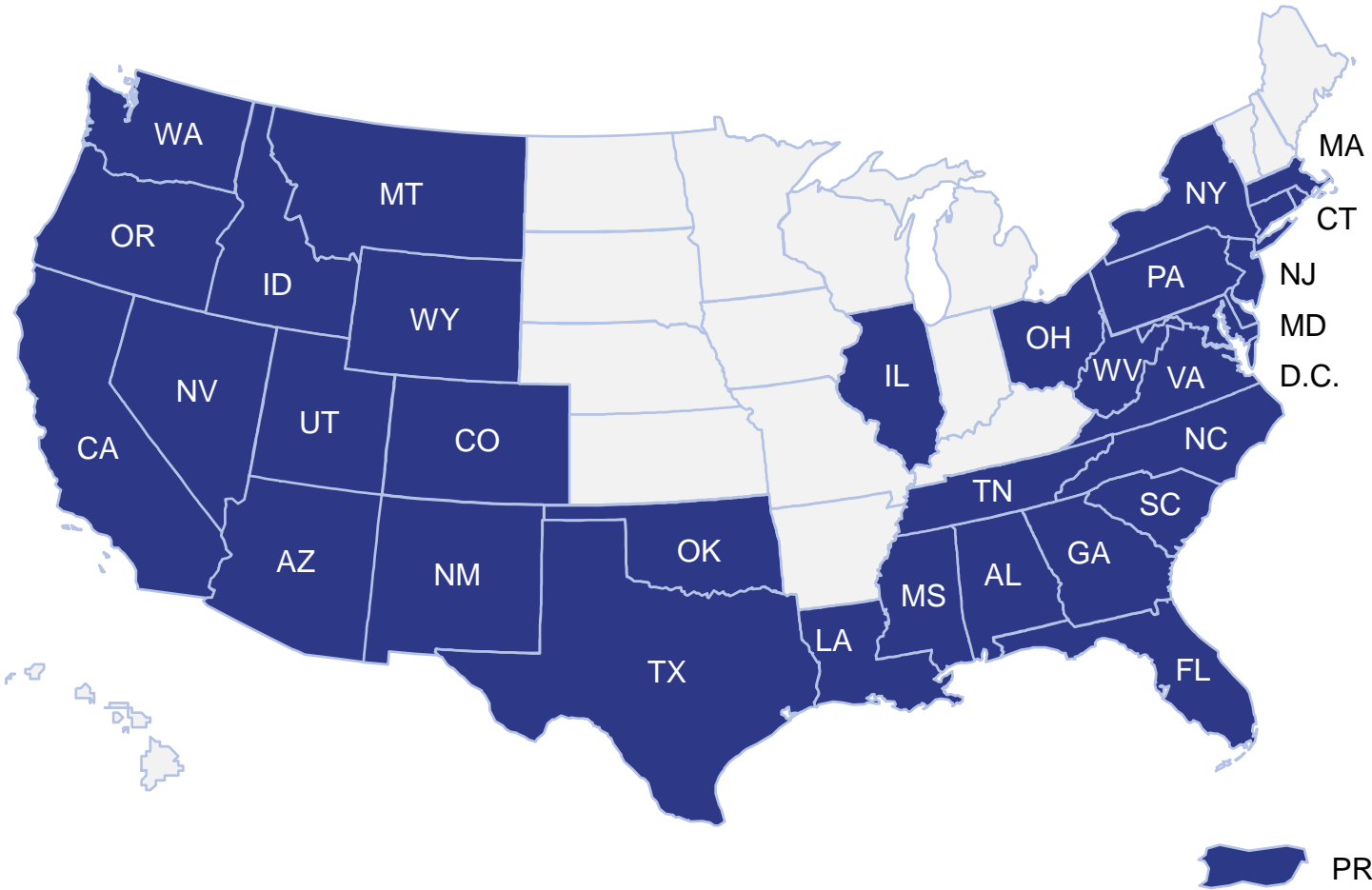

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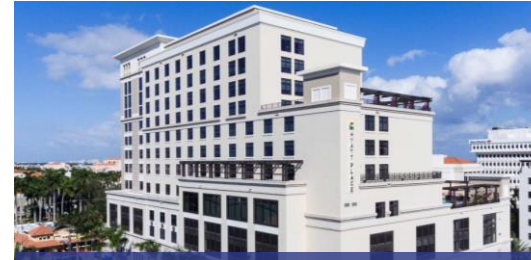

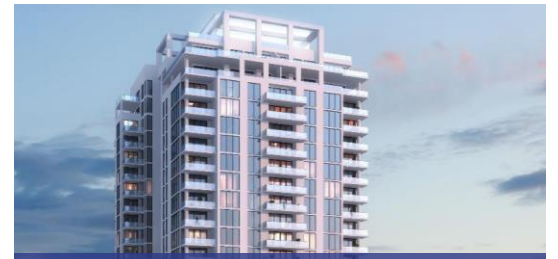

# Key Highlights of Rural Wohali Utah EB-5 Project at \$800,000 (1 of 2)

1 Under Construction in Prime Location with Phase 1 Almost Sold Out

Wohali Utah is located just north of Park City, Utah, one of the country's top vacation destinations. Wohali is under construction and Phase 1 is nearly sold out, with only six estate homesite lots remaining. **\$30M+ has already been spent on construction and land costs.**

The EB-5 loan will mature in individual \$800,000 tranches, meaning that EB-5 investors will receive their money back five years\* after investment, independent of other EB-5 investors' funding timelines.

4 EB-5 Jobs Already Created and Substantial Job Cushion

300+ jobs have already been created as of August 2022. When completed, Wohali will create 4,396 total jobs. Therefore, the project will create 44 jobs for each of the 99 EB-5 investors. Only 990 jobs are required for all investors to receive permanent green cards and all 990 jobs are expected to be created by September 2023.

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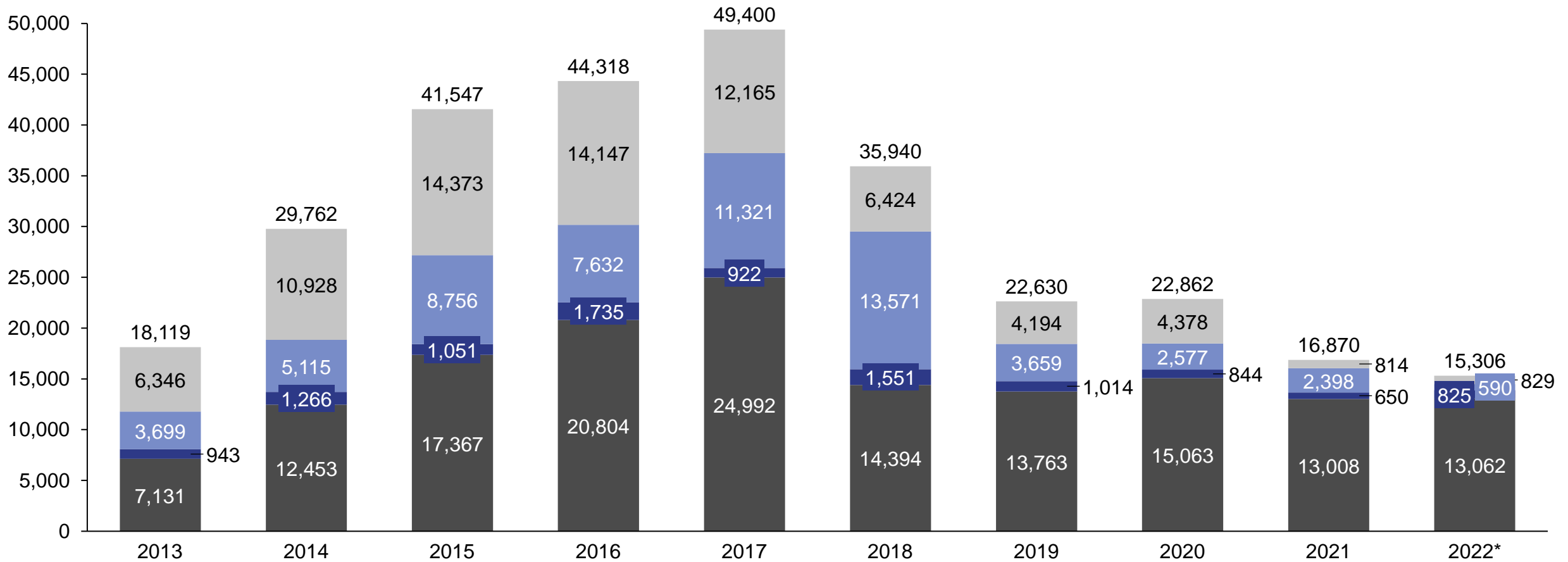

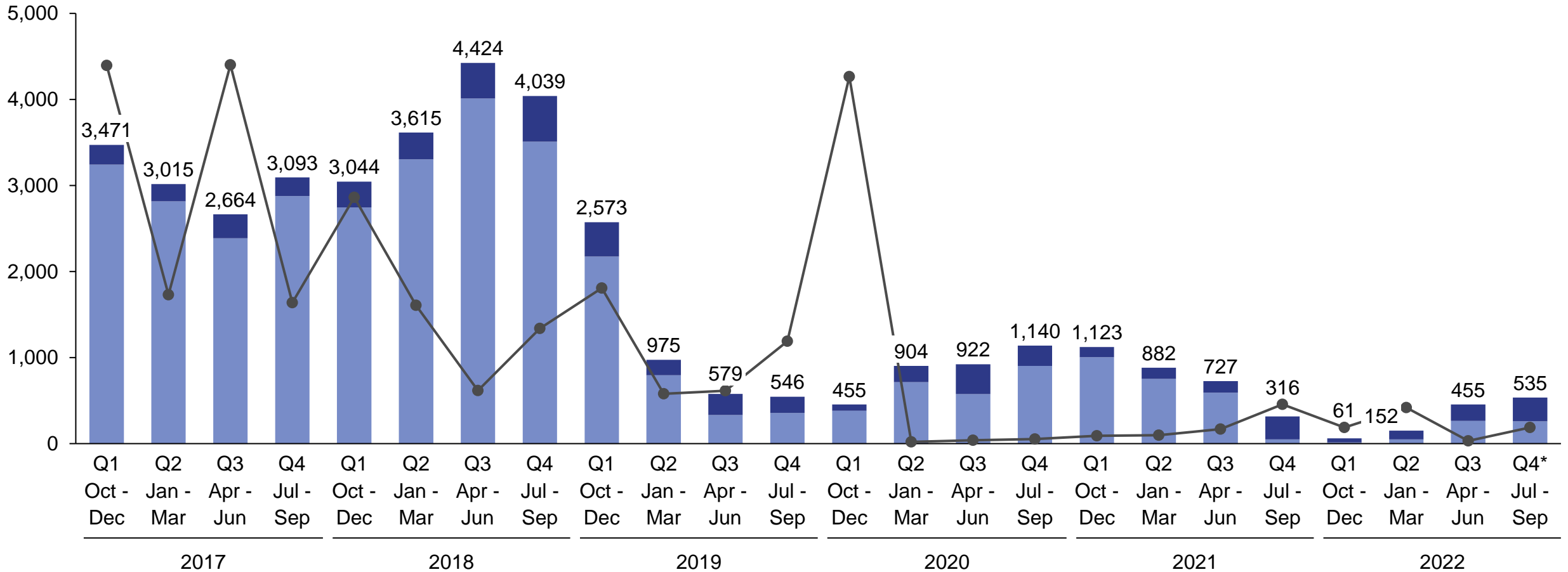

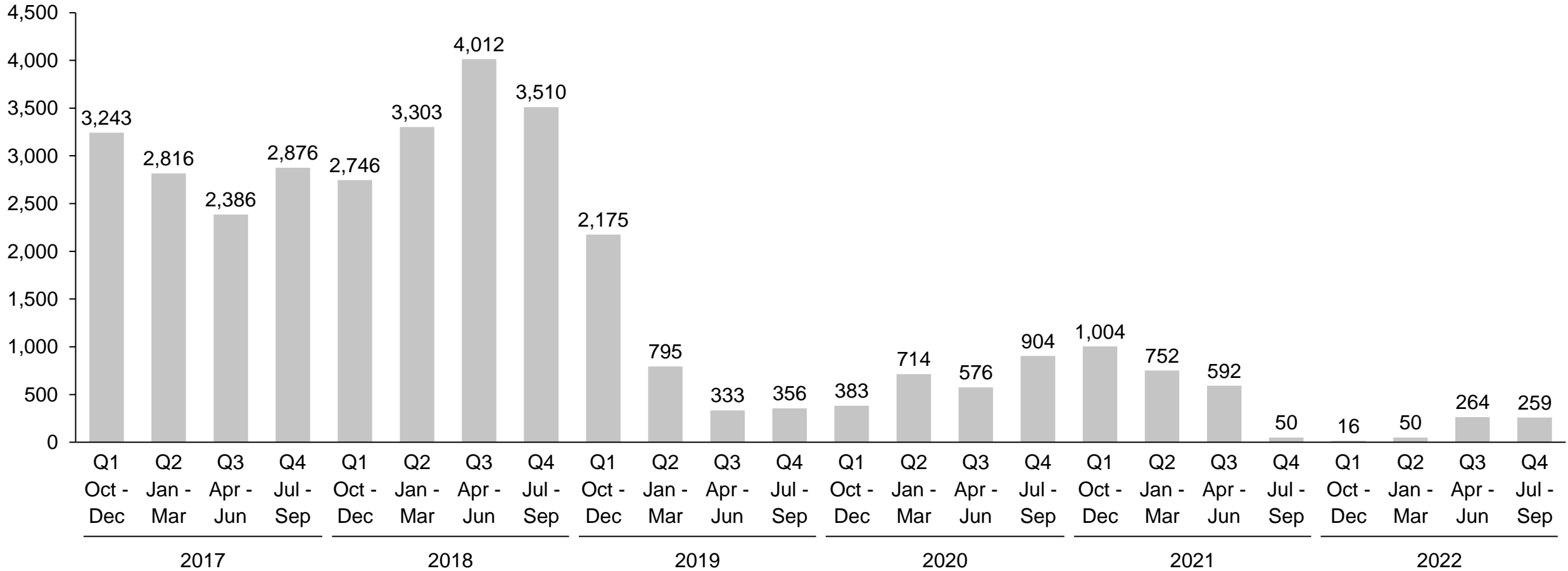

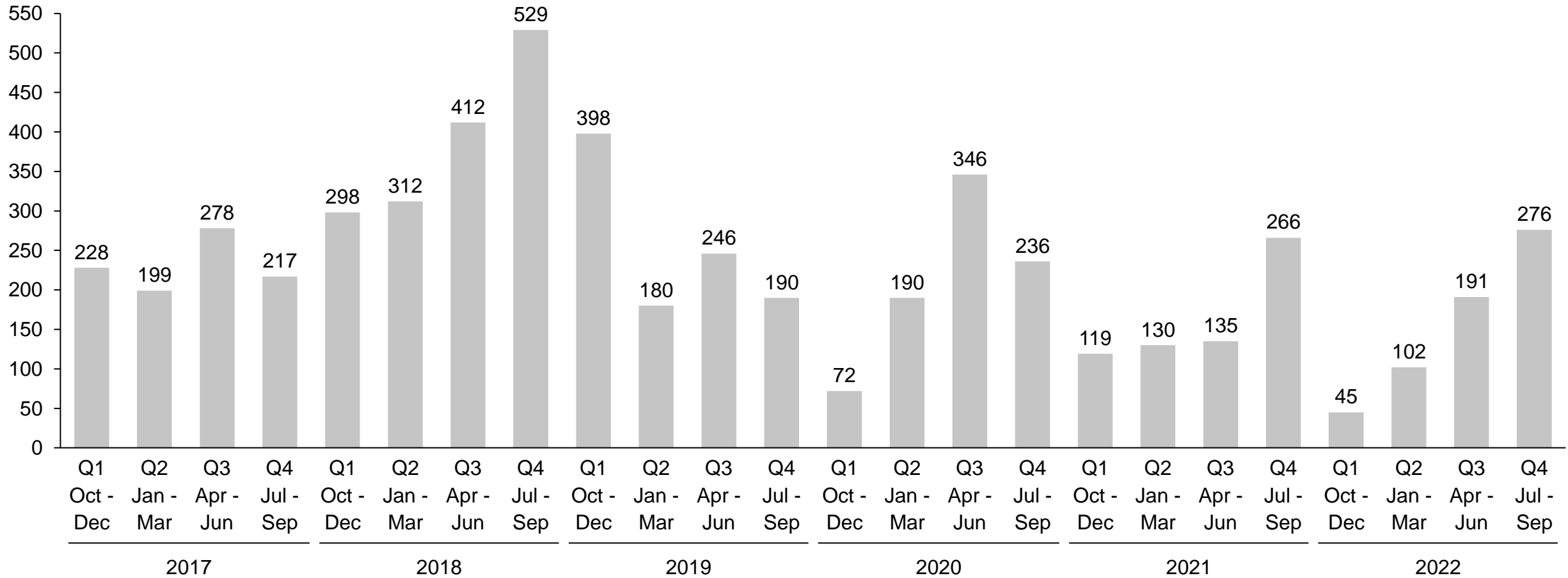

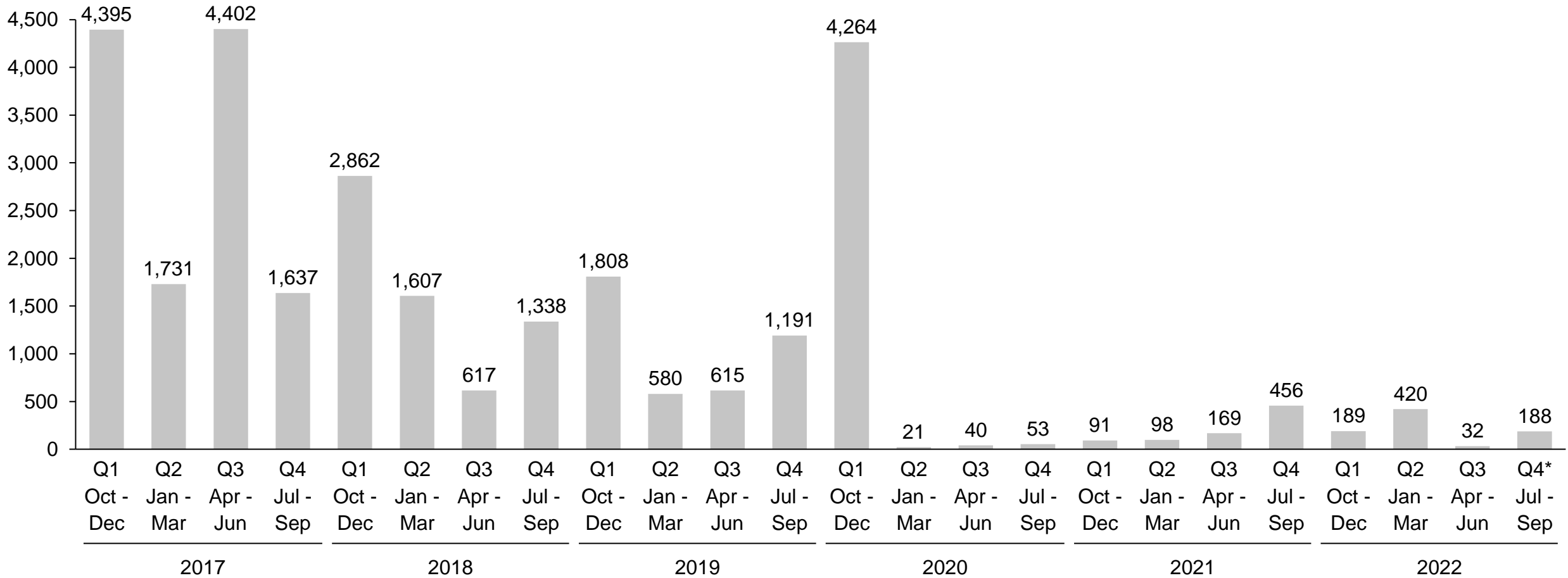

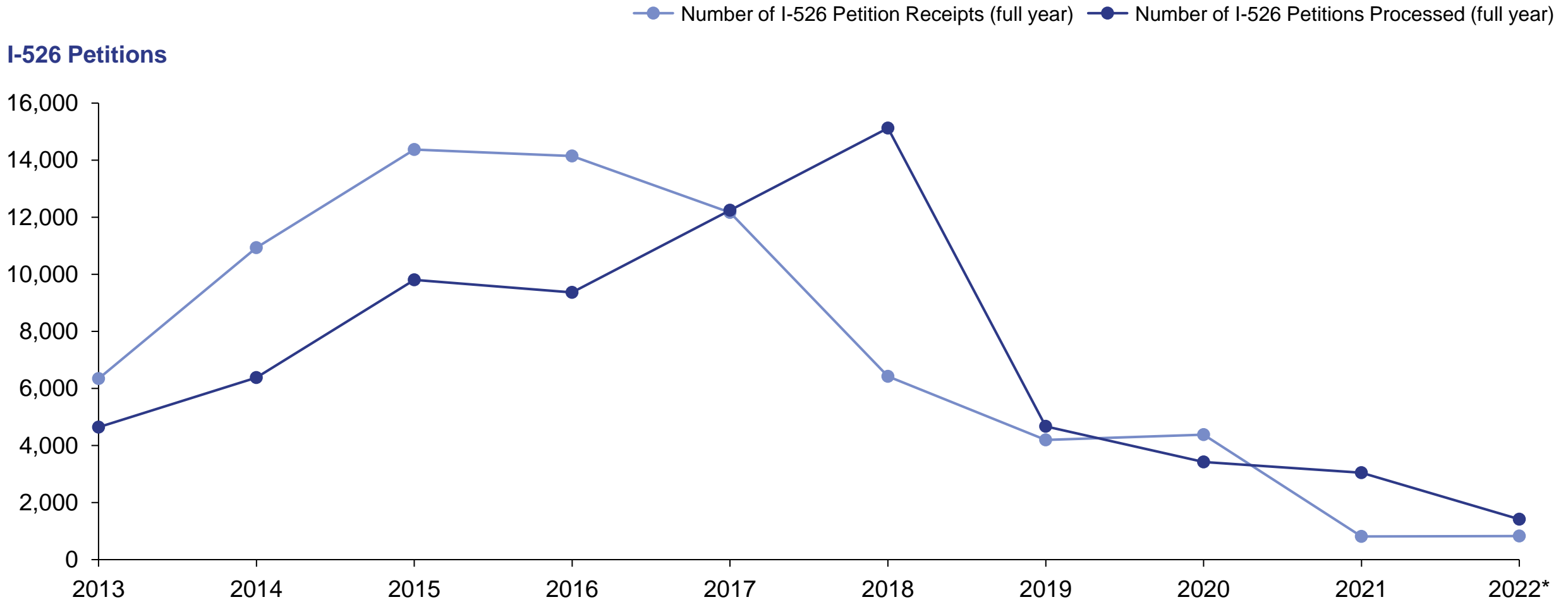

By fiscal year, FY2013-2022

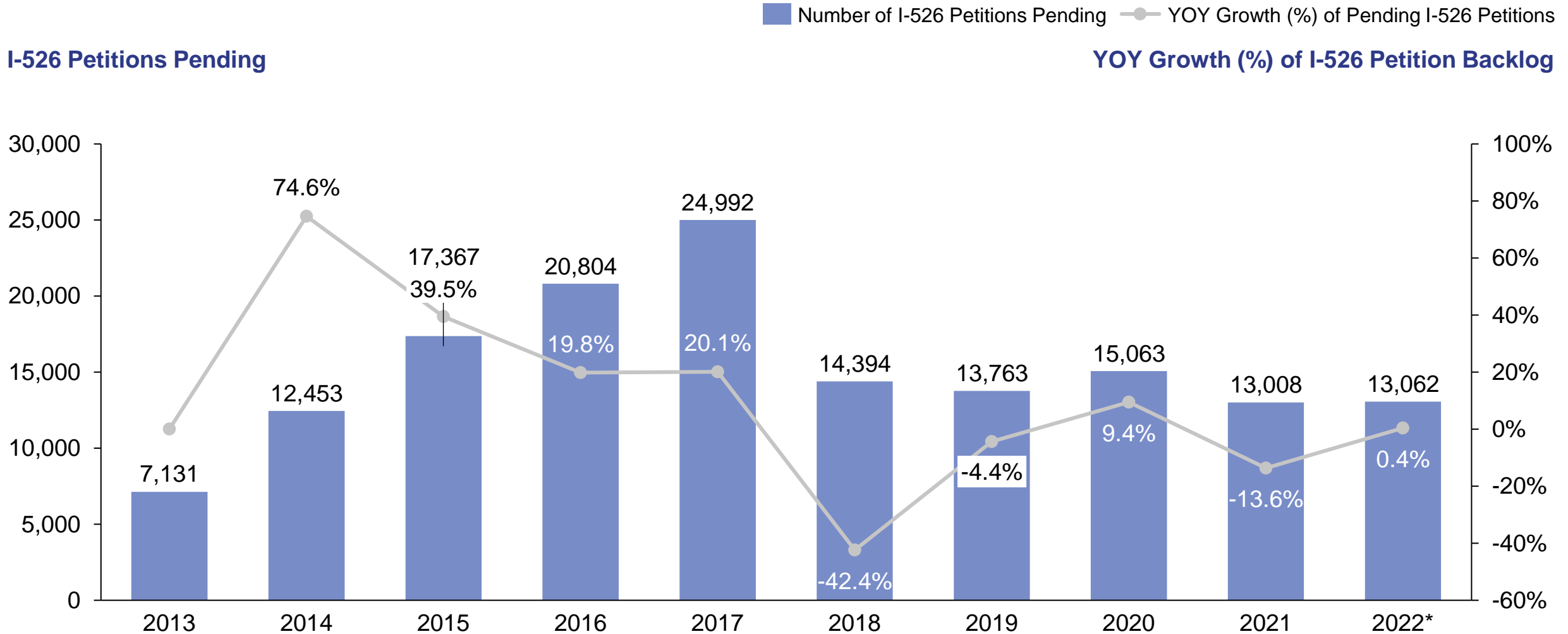

By fiscal year, FY2013-2022

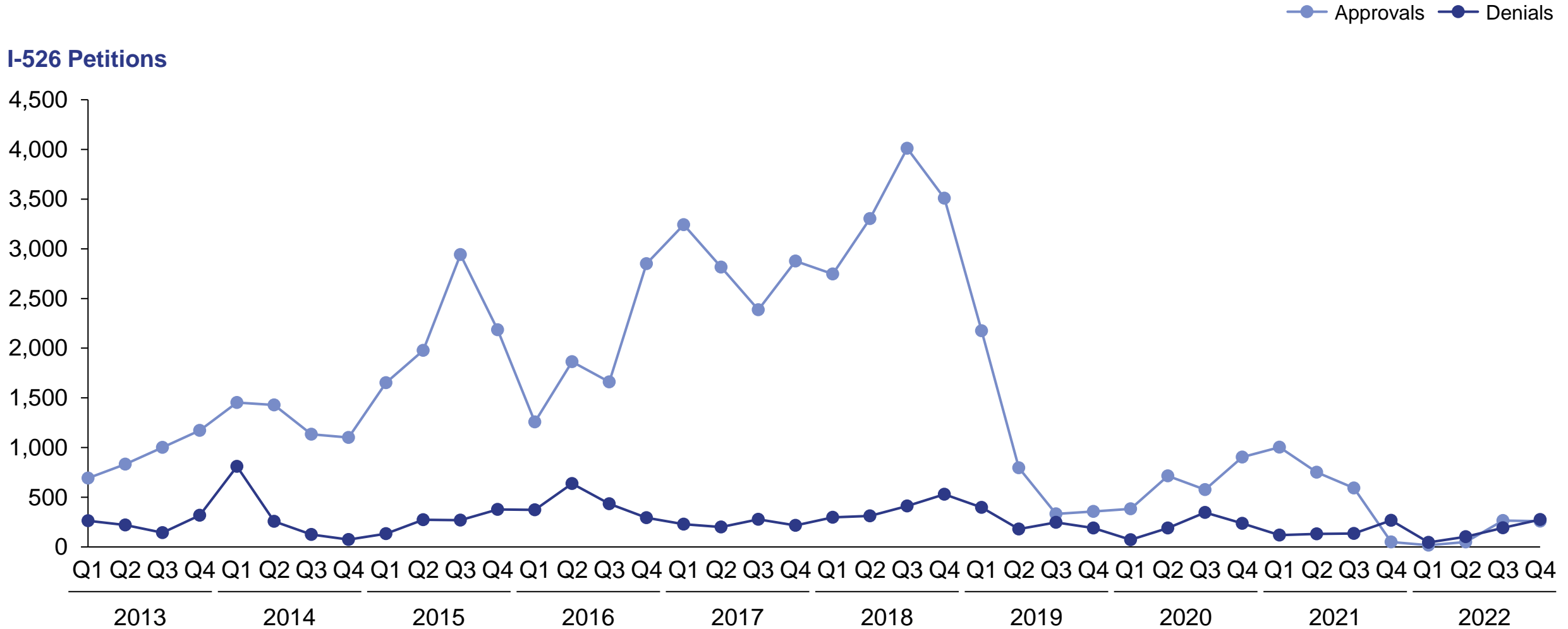

By quarter, FY2013-2022



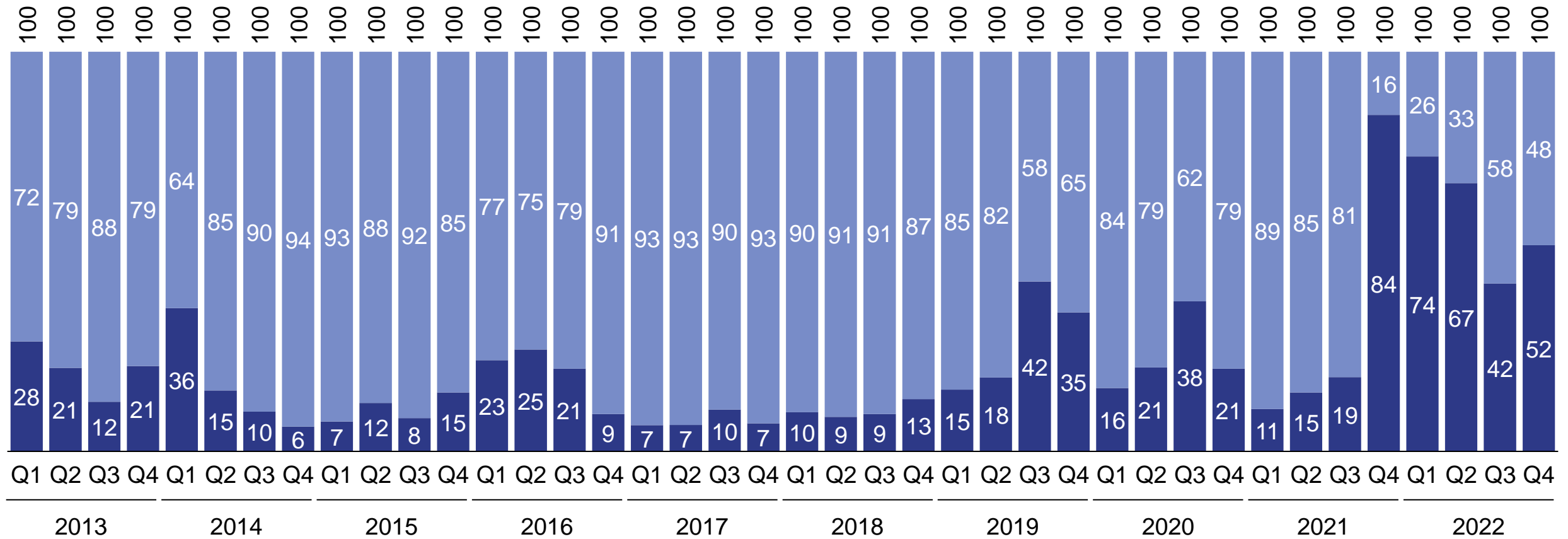

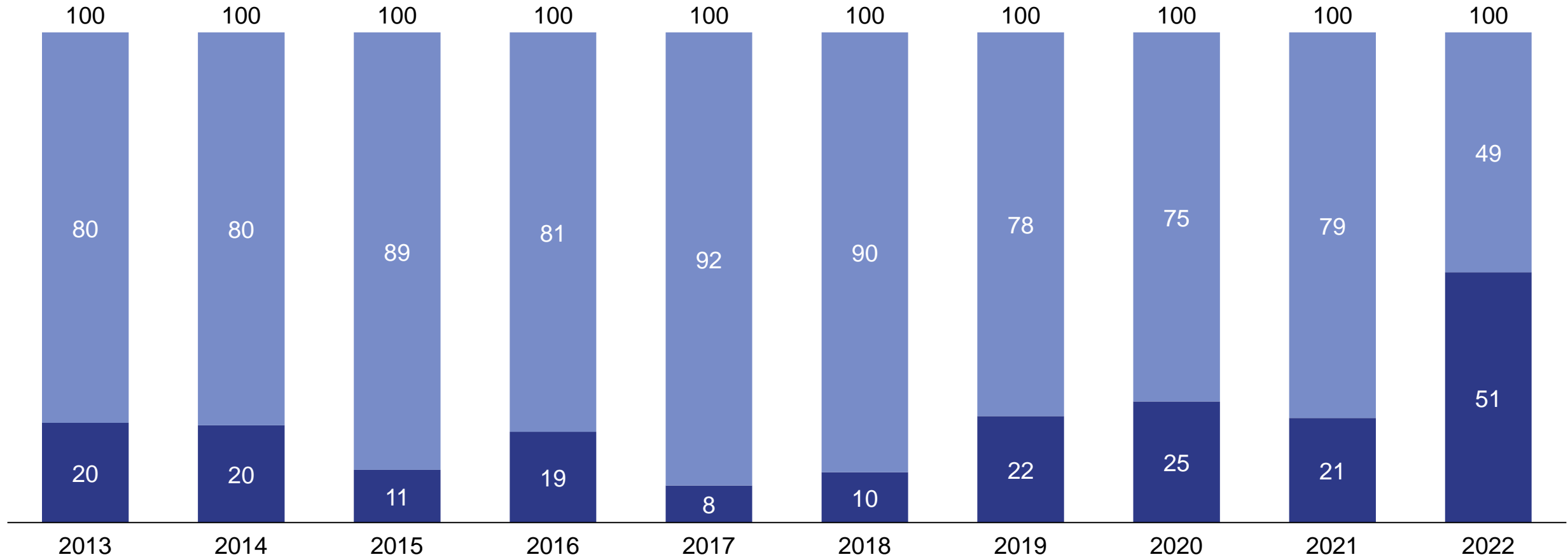

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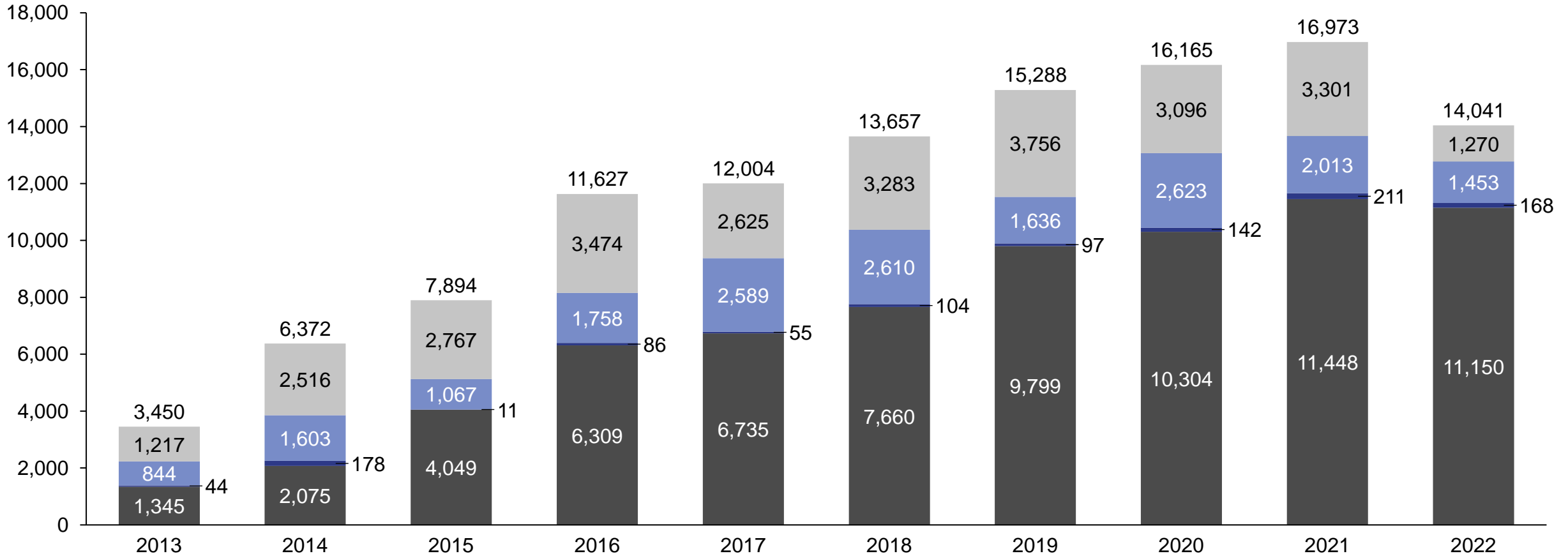


# I-829 Petitions by Case Status

Receipts Approvals Denials Pending

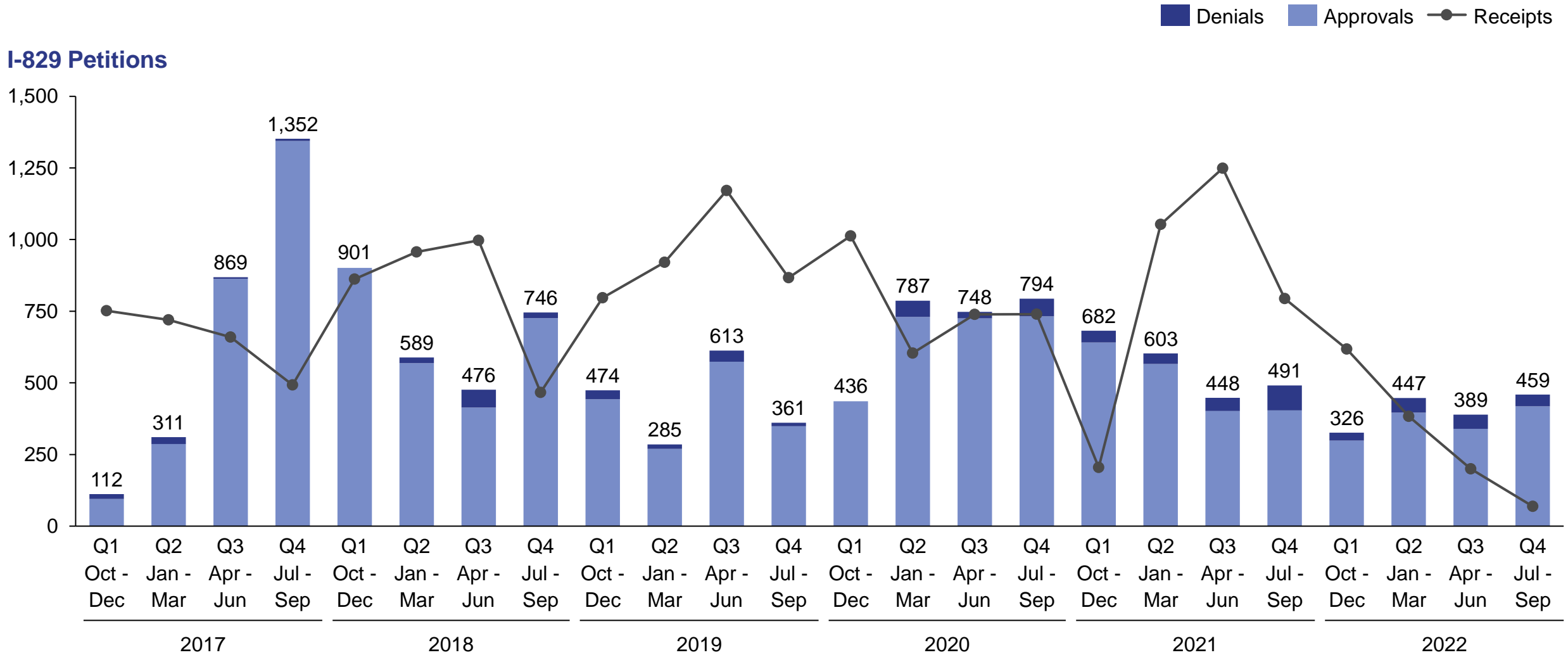
I-829 Petitions by Case Status

By quarter, FY2017-2022

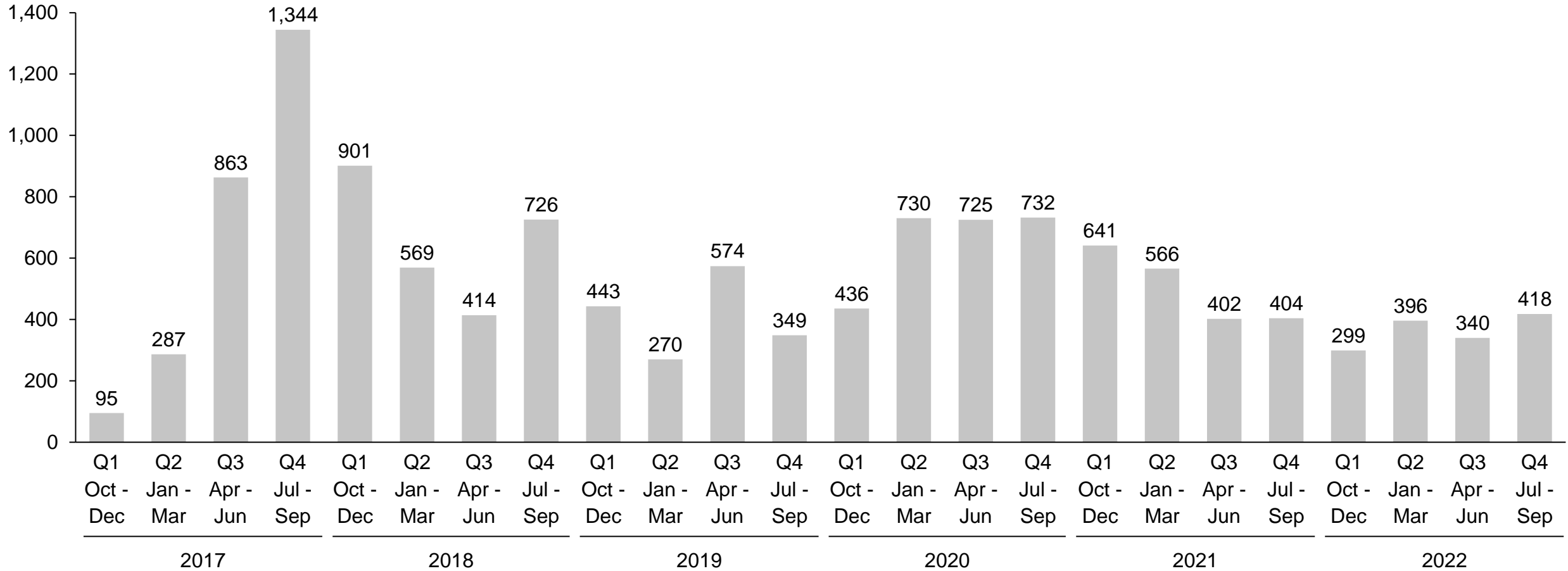

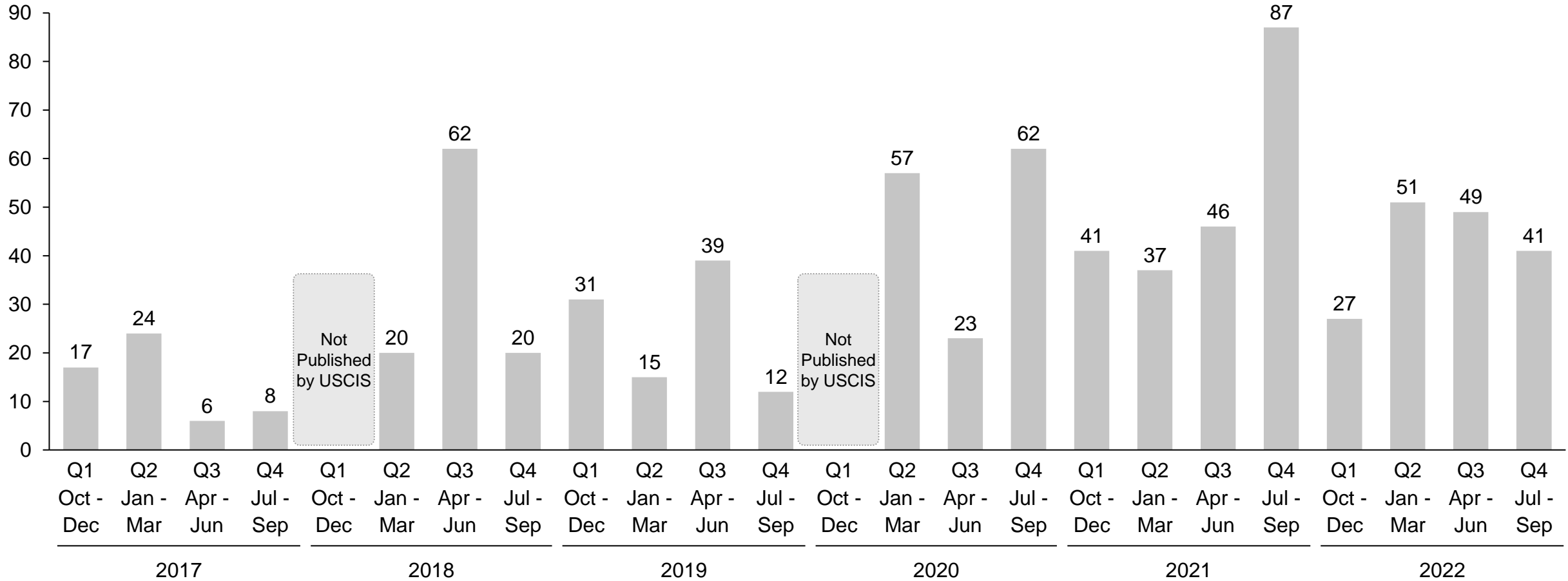

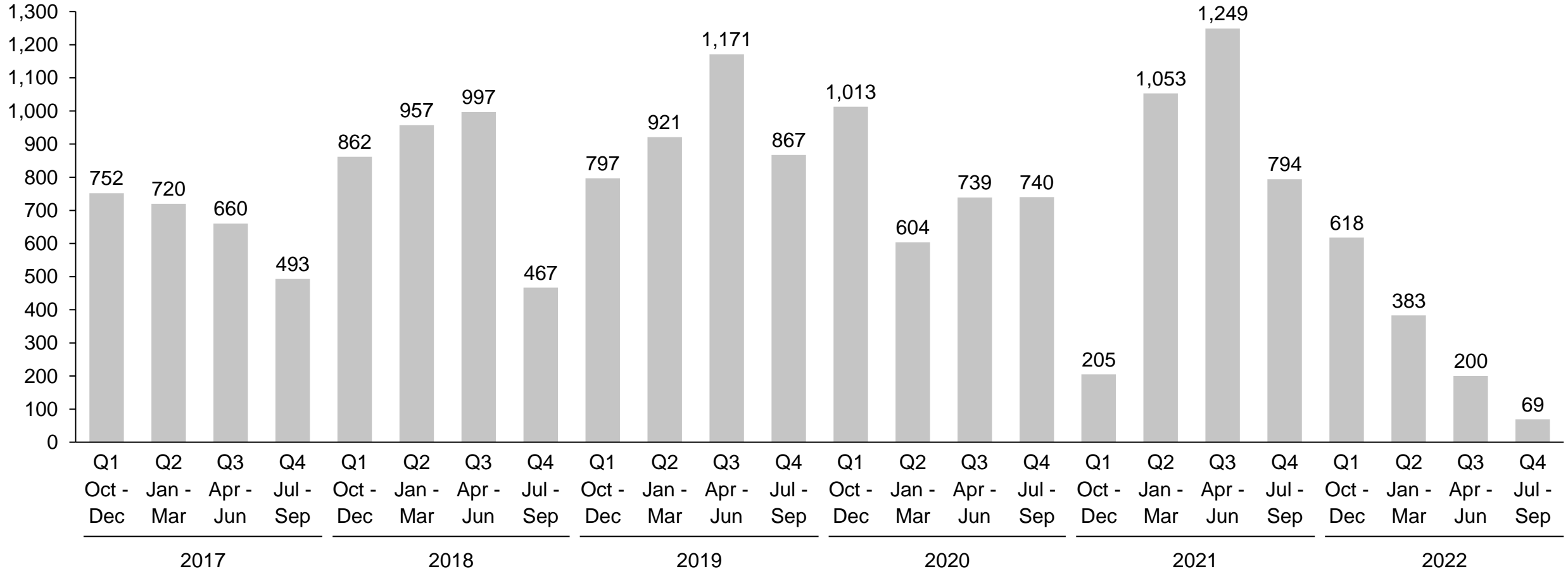

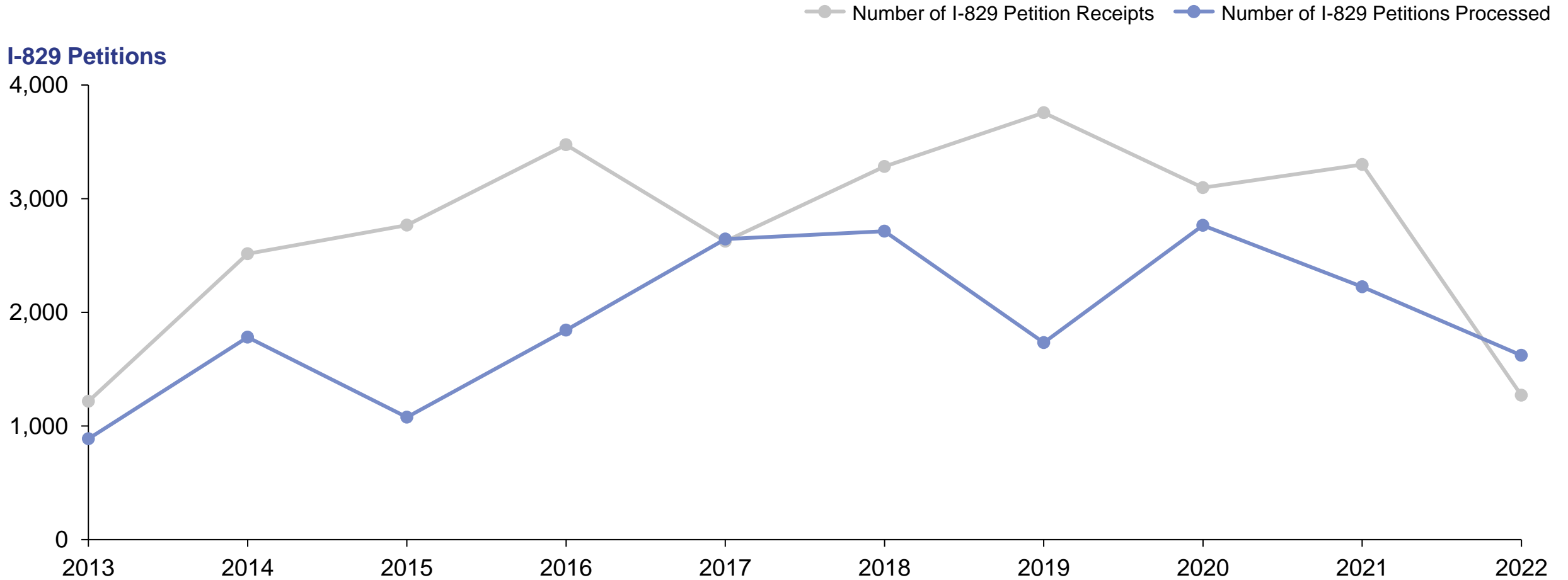

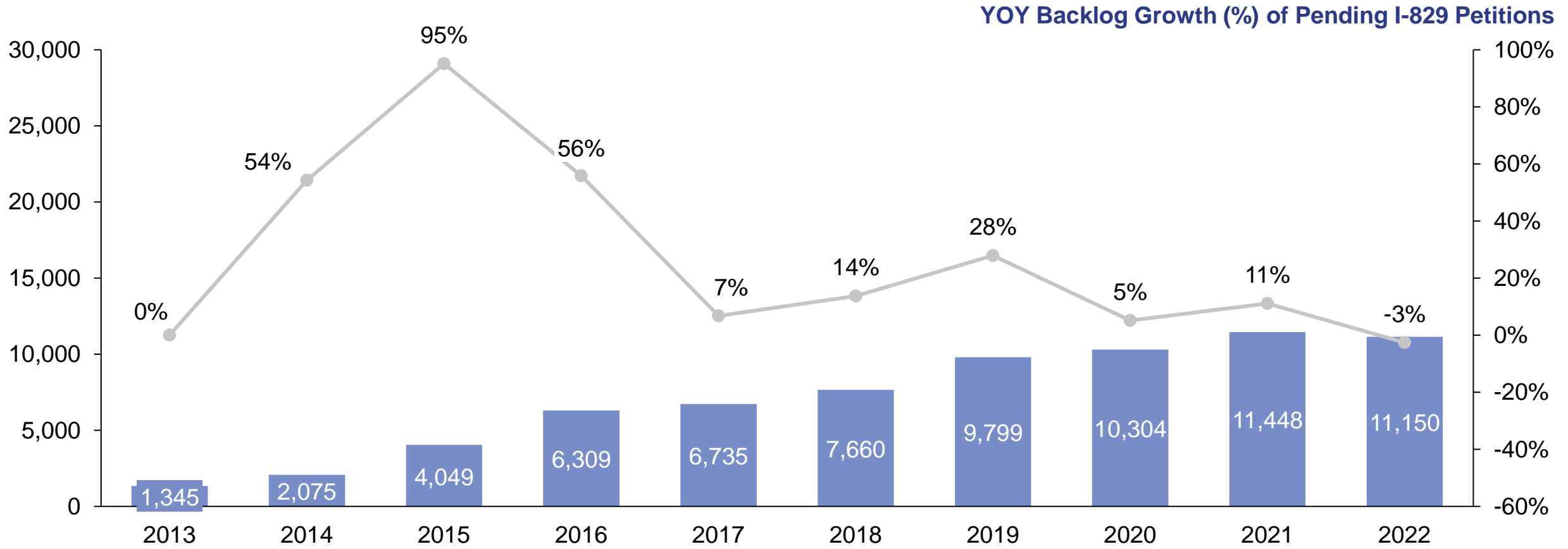


# I-829 Petitions Pending and Year-Over-Year Backlog Growth

■ Number of I-829 Petitions Pending ● YOY Backlog Growth (%) of Pending I-829 Petitions

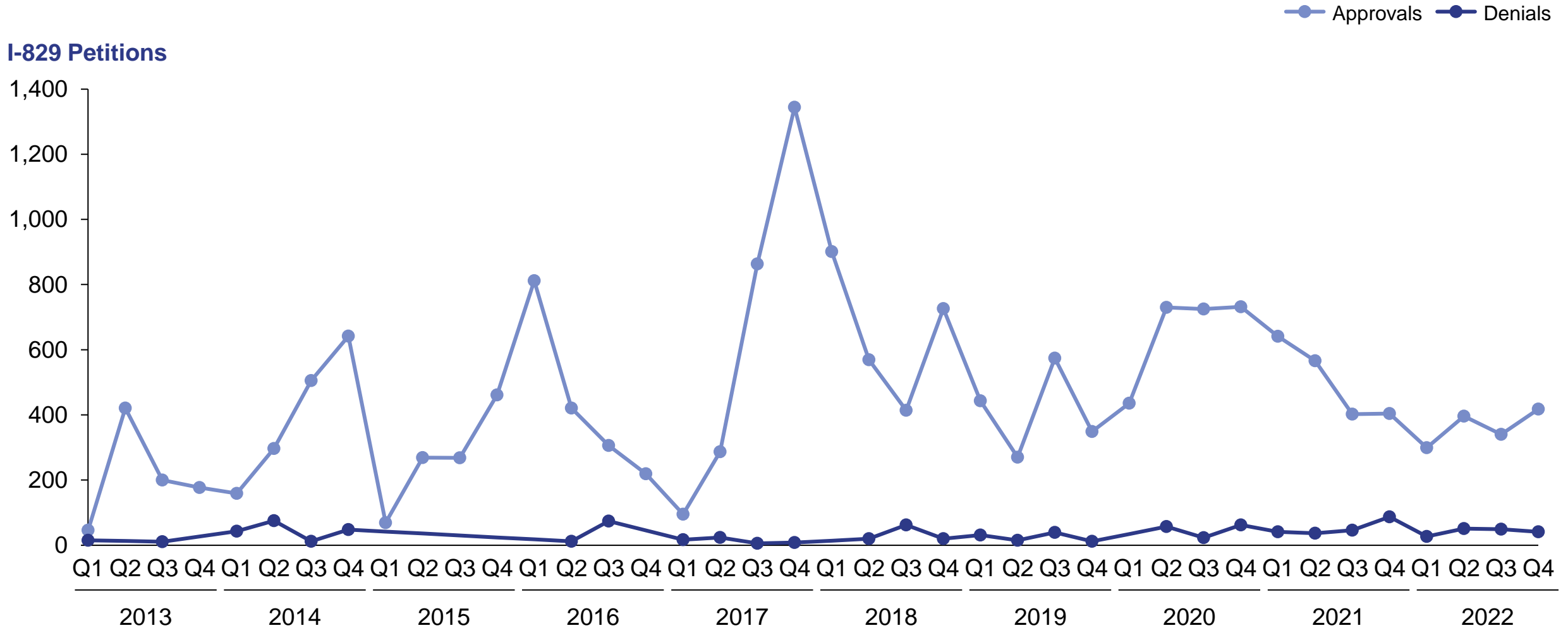

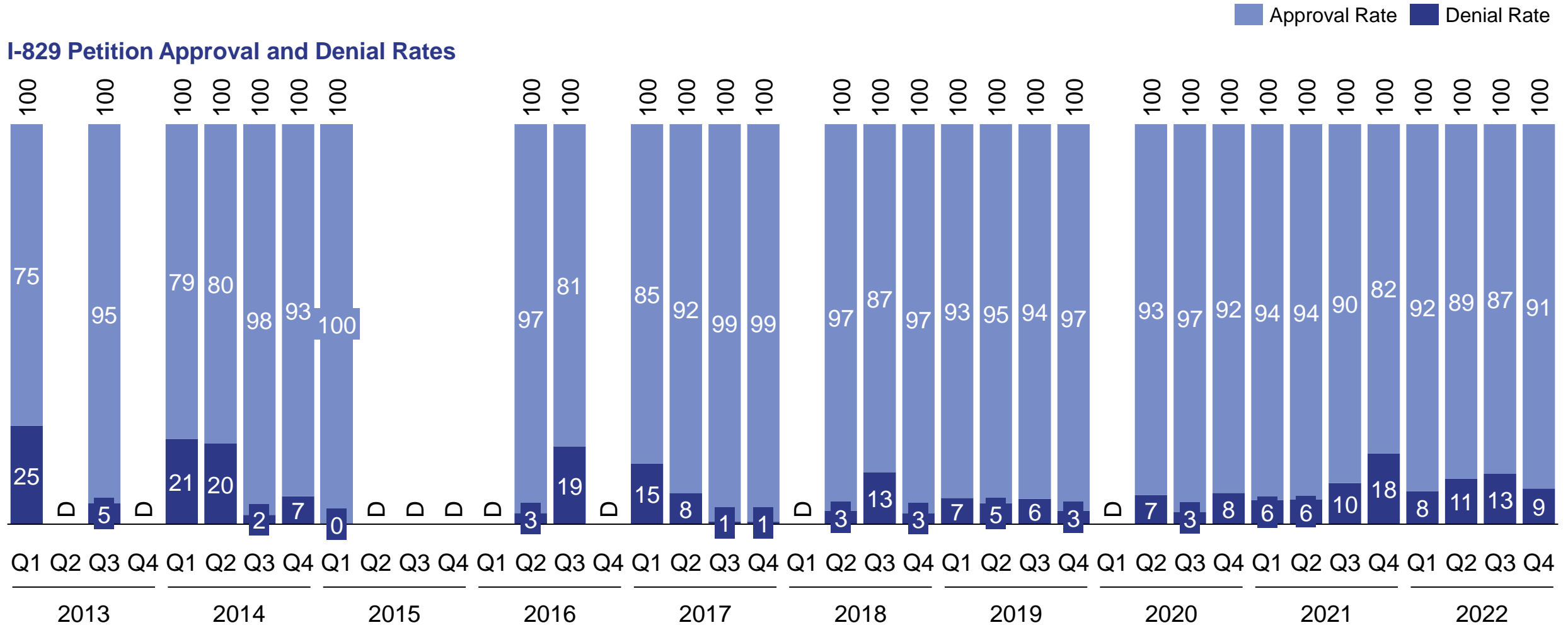
By quarter, FY2013-2022

By quarter, FY2013-2022

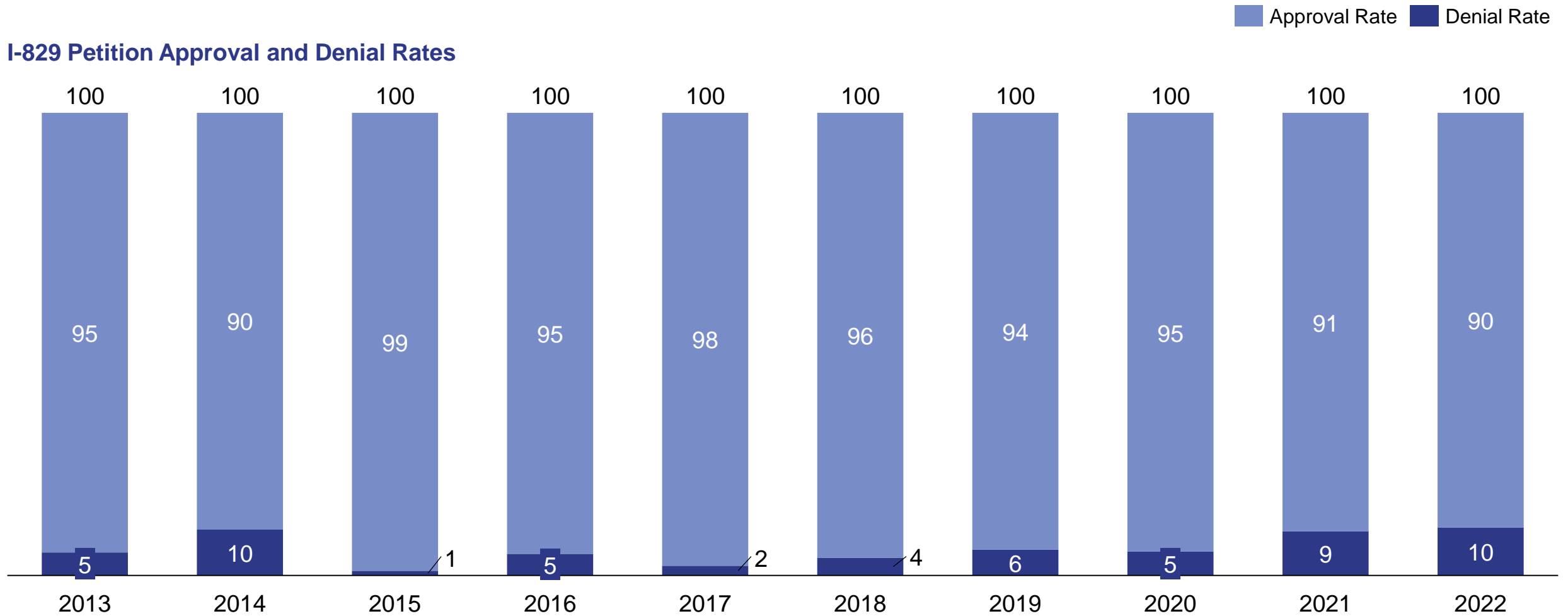

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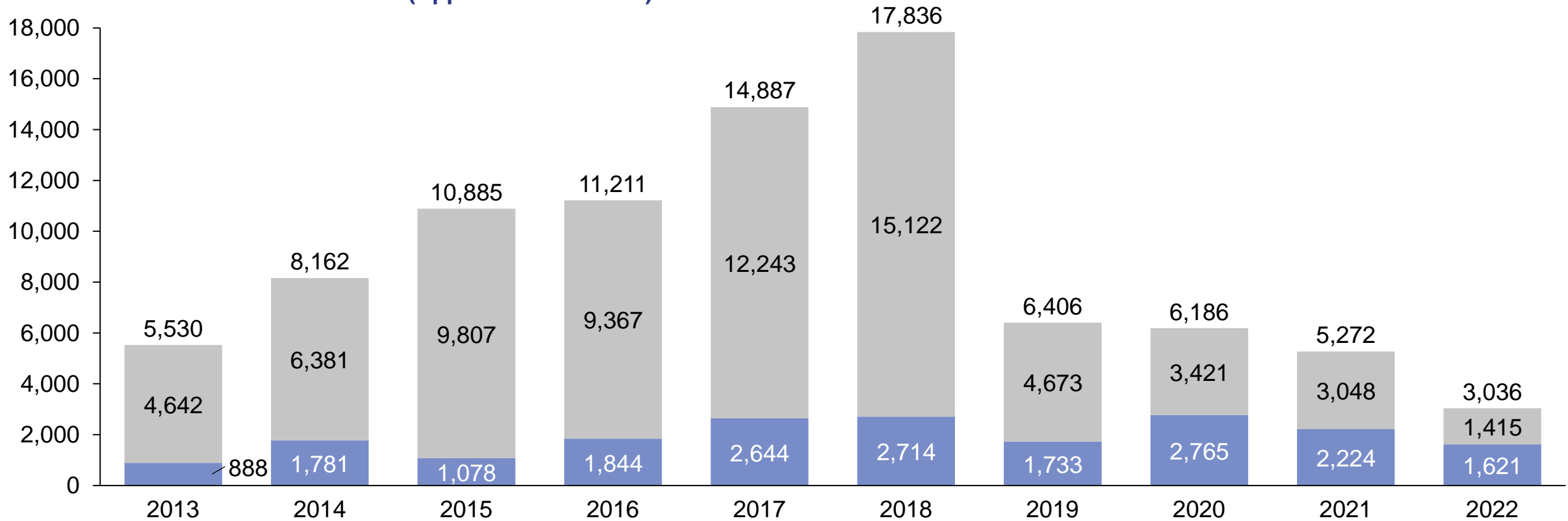

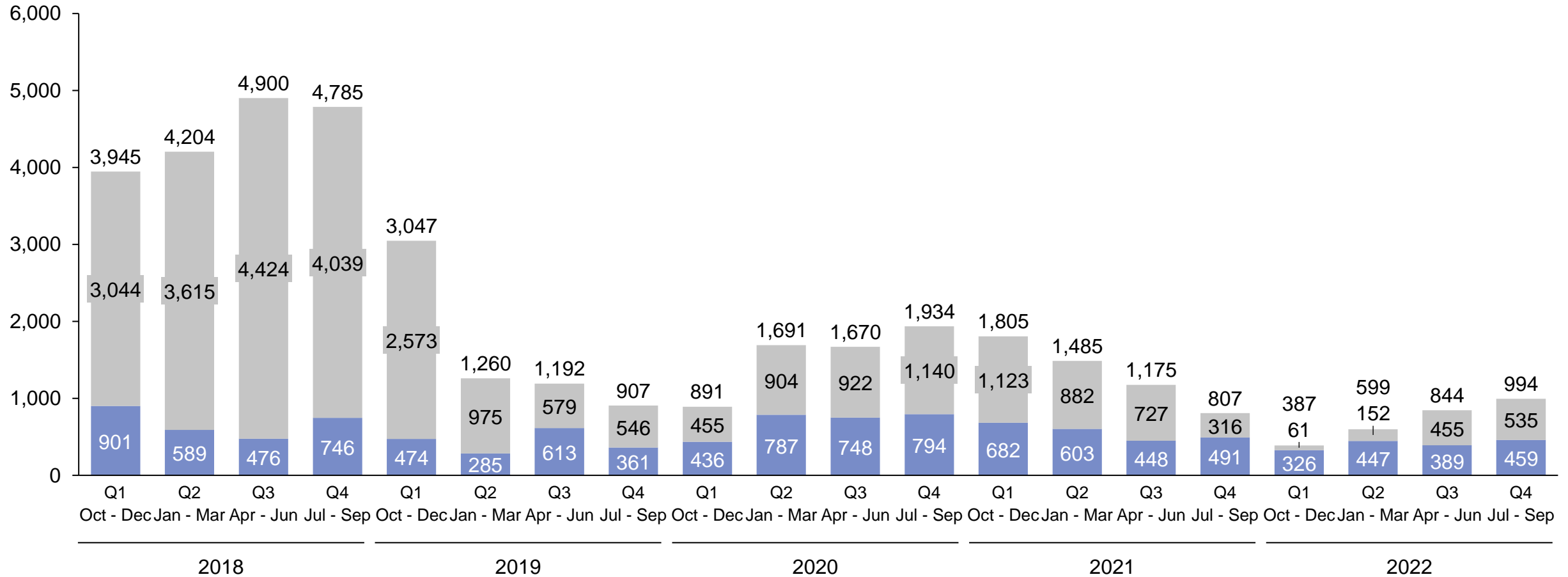

## I-526 and I-829 Petitions Processed (Approvals & Denials)



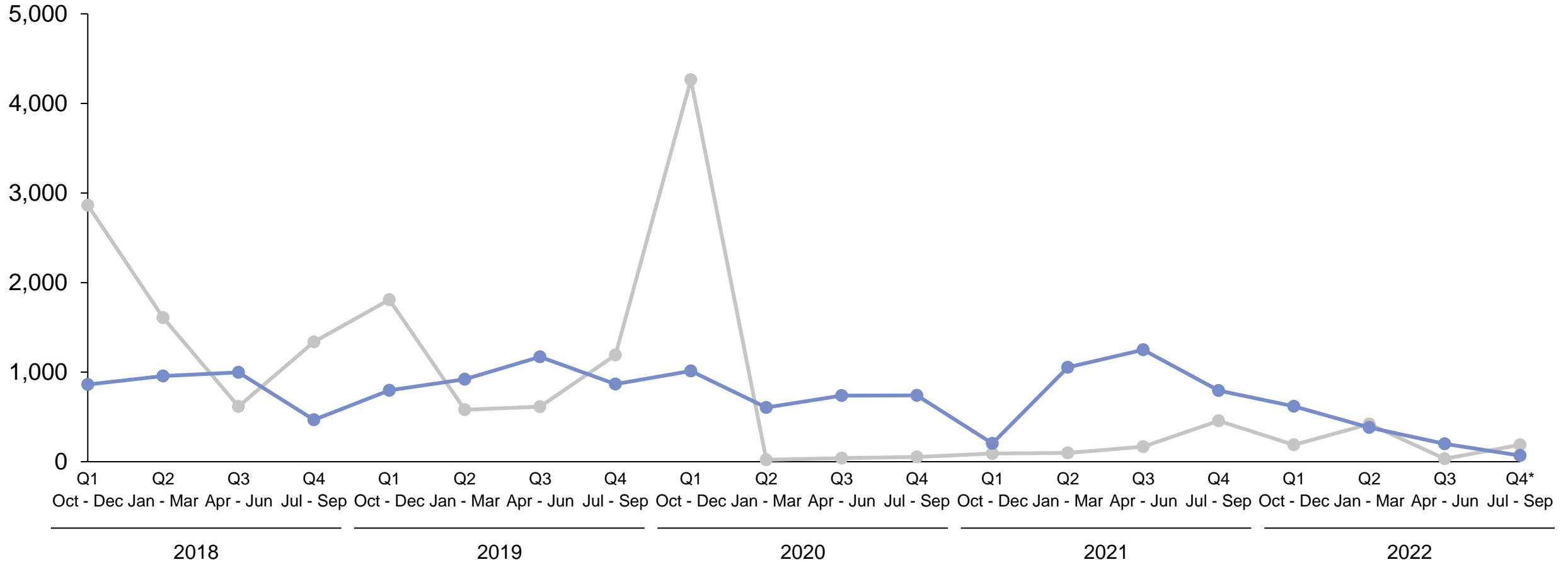

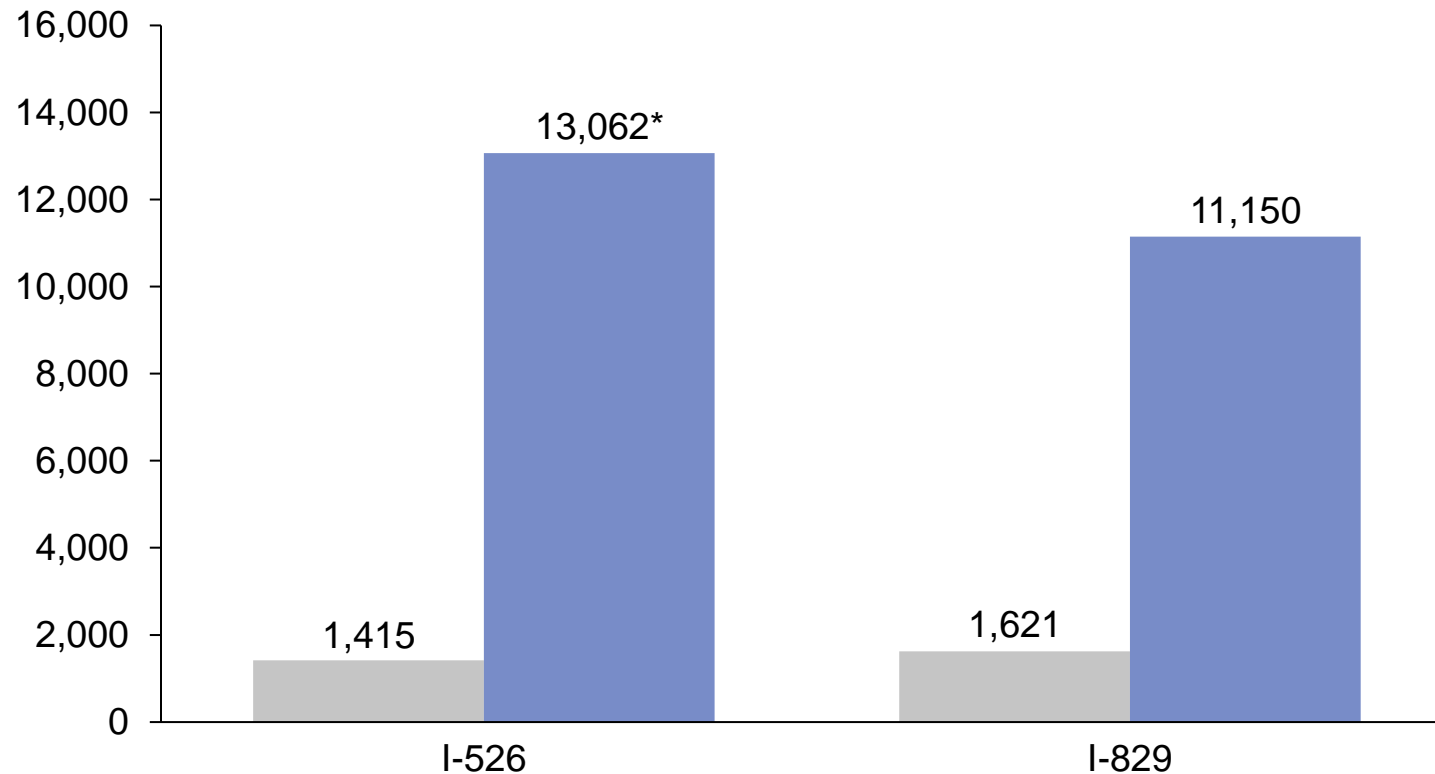

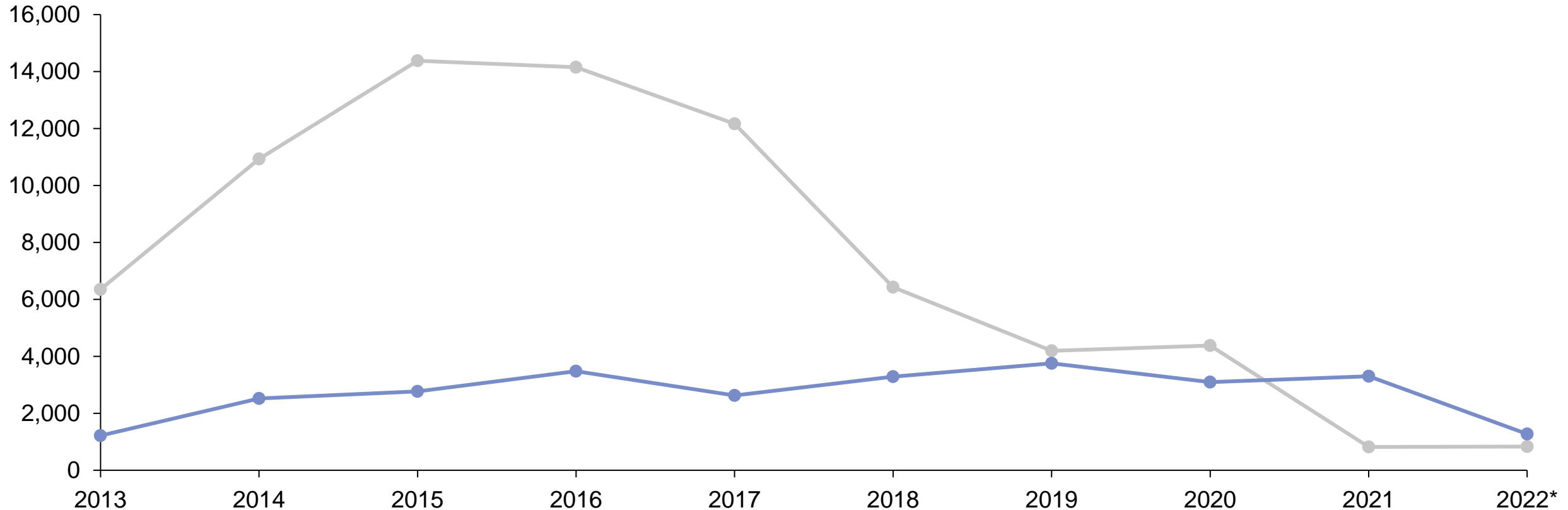

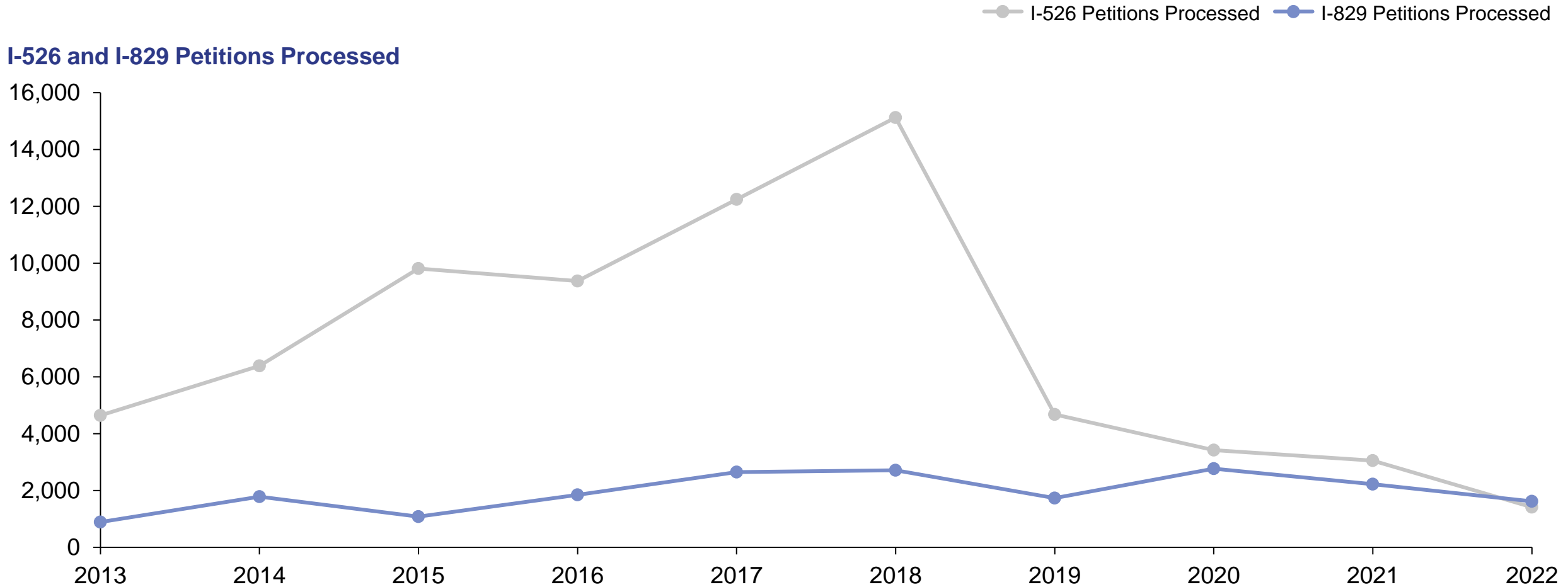

By fiscal year, FY2013-2022



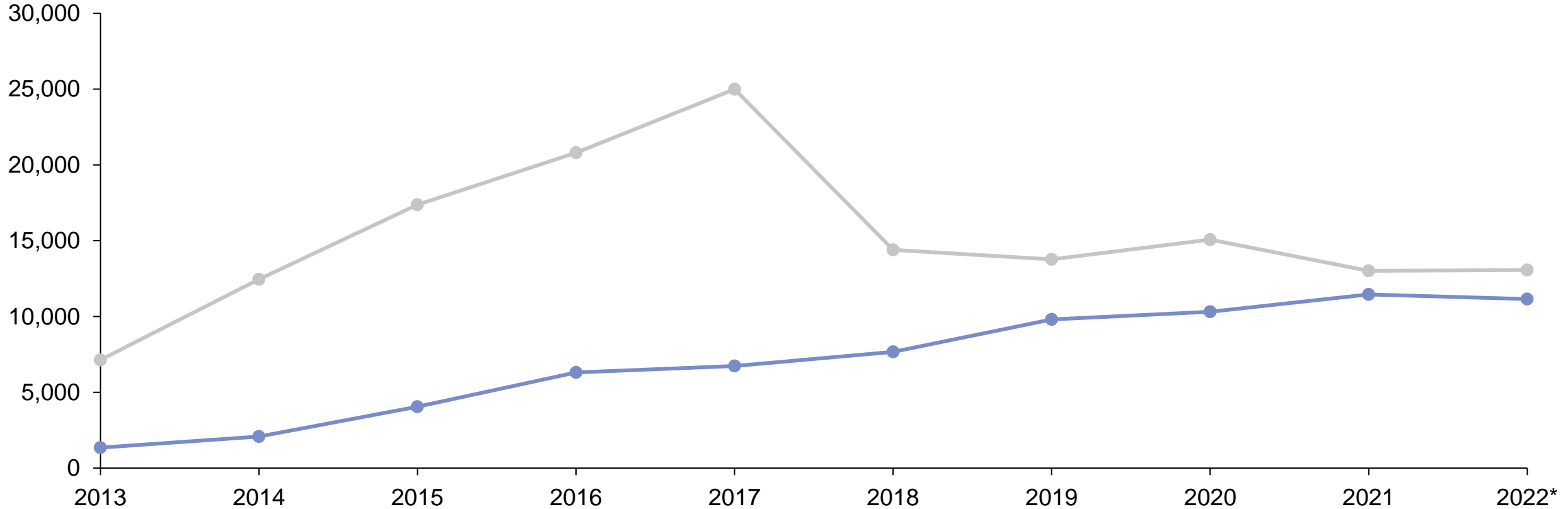
