➤ Rosemary Care Instructions

SIZE: 2 to 6 feet tall. Mediterranean native. Aromatic leaves are often used in cooking. Small clusters of blue flowers bloom during the winter and spring, attracting birds and bees.

PLANTING GUIDE: Enjoy indoors for a month or two but eventually should be outdoors in containers or the garden. Well drained soil. Prune to shape as desired. Rosemary plant care is easy. These plants thrive in warm, humid environments and cannot take extremely cold temperatures. Thoroughly water rosemary plants when the soil is dry to the touch but allow the plants to dry out between watering intervals. Even indoors, rosemary plants will require lots of light, at least six hours, so place the plant in a suitable location free of drafts.

LIGHT: Bright light. 6-8 hours of sun.

TEMPERATURE: Established plants in the ground can tolerate 20 degrees F but protect or bring in smaller containers when below 30 degrees F as roots are more sensitive to cold.

WATER: When watering your Rosemary remove the burlap cover, water with only the grower pot exposed. This will allow the water to drain well. Once the water has drained out of the grower pot then place it back into the burlap cover. Let dry between waterings. Rosemary can suffer if soil remains waterlogged, it requires excellent drainage. Letting it dry between waterings does not mean let it sit dry for a week. Our experience has been as soon as the soil dries; it is time to water. Do not let the Rosemary sit dry for more than a day or two. In pot, water thoroughly but allow soil to dry slightly between watering. In the garden, keep on the dry side.

FERTILIZER: Feed lightly during periods of growth.

➤ Lemon Cypress Care Instructions

SIZE: Up to 100 ft tall and 20 ft wide. Native to California's Monterey Peninsula, this fast growing, lemon scented plant has multiple uses in the home, patio and landscape. It will keep its conical shape until 30 ft tall.

PLANTING GUIDE: Best to plant in early spring to establish before heat of summer, or plant in early Fall. Among the easiest of evergreens to transplant successfully. Needs little or no pruning. Best in partial shade. Full sun is good as long as it does not lack for water. Under-watered foliage burns in freezing wind and hot sun. It will thrive indoors but does not tolerate exposure to heaters. In the garden, plant in well-drained soil in early spring before the heat of summer, or plant in early fall. Prune if needed for hedges or to keep smaller. For container growing, transplant to a larger pot to allow for growth and easier water management.

LIGHT: Partial shade in hot areas. Full sun in moderate coastal zones.

TEMPERATURE: Minus 10 degrees F to 105 degrees F.

WATER: Water immediately upon receipt. Afterwards, water regularly to keep soil moist but not soggy. In hot, dry weather, water deeply once a week. Can dry quickly in the pot. Be careful to avoid excessive drying or plant may not recover.

FERTILIZER: After the last spring frost, or during spring and summer growth, feed with a well-balanced, granular fertilizer.
