Expand your knitting skills and go subtle or go bold with this fun garter stitch shawl. Opt for gentle stripes for a neutral shawl, perfect for any occasion or go bold with two highly contrasting fingering weight yarns. "Kallara" features a slightly asymmetrical, shallow triangular shape with long tapered ends. In this class you will learn how to make increases and decreases, a center double decrease, and how to carry the non-working yarn up the side. This class is suitable for those who have completed the beginning knitting class or equivalent and would like to make a bigger project.

Are you ready to knit your first sweater or have you knit a sweater that didn't quite work out? This class will cover sweater-making essentials and focus on getting started right, so you have a successful experience. From choosing the right yarn and making a gauge swatch, to keeping track of your progress in your project and pattern, to finally finishing and blocking, this class has it all. There will be five workshop sessions spread over eight weeks that will take you from the planning of your sweater to the finishing stages. Students will learn the techniques in woven lace making including: vocabulary, patterns (prickings), lace-making bobbins, threads/yarns, pins, pillows, and other equipment while making multiple projects over the eight week period.

Tatting, Level One

This class is a hands-on practicum of Tatted Lace Making. Starting with no prior knowledge and minimal supplies, students will learn definition, history, vocabulary, material preparation, chains, picots, rings, joins, pattern interpretation, basic formations (to include medallions, edgings and insertions), changing threads, ending techniques, cleaning, blocking, storing and using lace. Students will be required to complete eight assignments consisting of eight individual pieces while meeting once per week over an eight-week period. Course demands timely completion of homework.

Beginning Rigid Heddle Weaving

Rigid heddle weaving is a great way to get started in weaving. It is a simple and portable loom with lots of potential. This class will include warping the loom and weaving at least one project. You must have your own rigid heddle loom. A variety of looms are for sale through the shop and a limited number are for rent. With the skills learned in this class you will be able to continue weaving on your own to make wonderful projects for yourself or to give as gifts.
