Knitting Classes

Beginning Knitting

This is the first class in our NPJ "Learn to Knit" series. In this class you will learn the basics of knitting. Techniques covered include casting on, binding off, how to read a pattern, and how to knit and purl. We promise you'll fall in love with knitting along with the rest of us!

Hansel Hap**

Let's knit a Hap! A hap is a Scottish dialect word for a simple shawl or wrap. Haps have a particular association with the Shetland islands where, for more than a century, they were knitted for everyday wear as well as for sale. If you've looked at large shawl or wrap designs during the past couple of years, you probably noticed an increase in their popularity. The hap is recognizable by its plain garter-stitch center, old shell lace border variations, and simple peaked edging. Join Tracy and learn how to knit a half version of the traditional Scottish hap and the beautiful old shell lace pattern.

Learn the basics of checking your gauge, how to follow and keep track of your knitting while working a more complex pattern, putting stitches on waste yarn, picking up stitches, weaving in ends, finishing, and blocking. You will learn a lot and have an adorable little sweater you'll be proud to keep or give away when you're all done!

Vests are classic outerwear that beautifully bridge the gap between winter and spring. The Stillwater Vest is knit in pieces and seamed. Learn to knit classic staghorn and honeycomb cables that create vertical appeal on the front. The vest has a cute, cropped fit that works great as a layering piece over dresses, tunics or high waisted pants. If you prefer a longer style, the vest can be lengthened to suit your taste.

Bobbin Lace Level Two

Students will learn the techniques of woven lace making including: vocabulary, patterns (prickings), lace-making bobbins, threads/yarns, pins, pillows, and other equipment. Students will make multiple projects over the eight-week period.

Tatting, Level Two

Weaving Classes

Beginning Rigid Heddle Weaving

Rigid heddle weaving is a great way to get started in weaving. It is a simple and portable loom with lots of potential. This class will include warping the loom and weaving at least one project. You must have your own rigid heddle loom. A variety of looms are for sale through the shop and a limited number are for rent. With the skills learned in this class you will be able to continue weaving on your own to make wonderful projects for yourself or to give as gifts.

Pick-Up Placemats or Table Runner

Play with pick up sticks as we make a set of placemats or a table runner for your kitchen table. In this class we will be learning to create more complex weave structures using simple tools. Wider looms are suited well for placemats and narrower looms are perfect for making a table runner, so any size rigid heddle loom is welcome! We will also talk about adding a fringe to all four sides of your fabric.

There is nothing as weaverly as sumptuous kitchen towels, and they make drying the dishes so much nicer! This weave along will guide you through the ins and outs of weaving fine thread towels on a rigid heddle loom with either one or two heddles. We will be using finer threads typically thought of as threads for use on floor looms, and then discuss and demonstrate hemming options and finishing.
