Beginning Knitting

This is the first class in our NPJ "Learn to Knit" series. In this class you will learn the basics of knitting. Techniques covered include casting on, binding off, how to read a pattern, and how to knit and purl. We promise you'll fall in love with knitting along with the rest of us!

Harriet's Hat MRI Scanner Appeal KAL**

We love Fair Isle knitting, Shetland Wool and Shetland! That is why we are hosting a Knit-Along to help Shetland raise money to purchase a much needed MRI Scanner. Right now, patients must travel between 1 and 2 hours by air, or 12 to 14 hours by ferry one-way for an appointment. Travel is often disrupted by weather and this can mean missed scan appointments causing a delay of several weeks for the next available slot. Many patients requiring a scan must make this journey in extreme agony or find travel difficult in other ways due to their condition. Through a combination of grant funding and a public fundraising campaign, the Shetland Health Board Endowment Fund aims to raise £2 million for an MRI Scanner located at the Gilbert Bain. This would bring quicker access to diagnostic tests and reduce unnecessary patient travel, stress and inconvenience. All proceeds from the sale of Harriet's Hat pattern go toward the MRI Scanner Appeal. This class is an introduction to stacked increases and decreases, with tips and tricks to keep your stitch counts even and your paws tidy.

Tatting

Needle Tatting

Learn to tat with a needle instead of a tatting shuttle. Needle Tatting (Direct Method) differs from Shuttle Tatting (Indirect Method) and is easier to learn. Needle tatting also allows you to tat with materials that shuttle tatters cannot use such as yarn. In this class you will learn how to prepare your materials, understand vocabulary terms, and make rings, thread bars and scrolls. Students may complete two small samples during the class.

Tatting, Level Two

A hands-on practicum of Tatted Lace Making. Students must have completed Level One or demonstrate all necessary techniques and show enough knowledge to enroll. Students will learn additional patterning, beginning/ending techniques, how to correct mistakes (missed joins, opening a closed ring), set stitch, basic beading, lock stitch/linking loop, shuttle lock joins, joining/twisted/turned/frayed picots, how to use a gauge, mock rings, Josephine rings/chains, mignonette and pearl tatting. Students will be required to complete seventeen individual pieces while meeting once per week over an eight-week period. Course demands timely completion of homework.

Bobbin Lace, Level Two

This class is a continuation of Bobbin Lace Level One. Over an eight-week period students will continue to learn the basics of bobbin lace. Students will make an additional six (6) bookmarks, learn how to spangle a bobbin, and make an additional one or two lace pieces.
