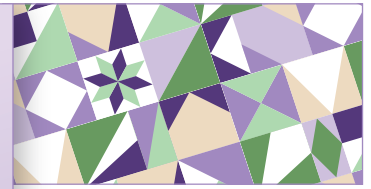

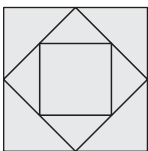
All the information you need to make the units in this block can be found in the instructions that came with your Stacked Squares and Off Set Four Patch technique sheets. Along with the technique sheets, you will also need the **Square Squared®** and **Four Patch Square Up®** tools for trimming your units. There are charts, step by step graphics, and directions. Use the table below to find the finished size of the unit you want to make, then work your way through the technique sheets to create your units.

When working with your Stacked Squares units, you will want to pay attention to the color placement of the final round of triangles. You'll sew on one background and one star point triangle as your first two triangles, then after you press, sew on another background triangle and a star point triangle. This will give you two background triangles that are side by side and two star points that are also next to each other.

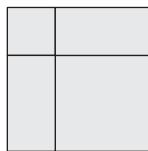
When sewing the block together, you will want to press the seams away from the Stacked Squares units to help reduce the bulk. This has the added benefit of giving you nested seams when you are sewing your block rows together. You can also chose to press the seams open if you would like. Pressing the seams open will also help to reduce the bulk.
