

Winged Four Patch

Made using Studio 180 Design's Wing Clipper® & Four Patch Square Up® tools



All the instructions you need to make the units required for this block can be found in the instructions that came with your Wing Clipper® I and Four Patch Square Up® tools. In the instructions you will find a chart, step by step graphics, and directions. Use the chart to find the information you need for the finished size of the units you want to make. Then work your way through the instructions. Easy as 1, 2, 3!

When you make this block you will have to pay attention to the color placement in your flying geese and four patch units - it's easy to get a color placed in the wrong spot. For this block you will need to make flying geese that have two different fabrics in the small outer triangles. Create two sets of 5 squares, 1 large background square, 2 small squares of color 1, and 2 small squares of color 2. Then, in step 1 on your Wing Clipper instruction set, place two squares of the same color on the base square. Then use the second color squares in step 5. It doesn't matter which order you use the colors in, just be consistent.

Something else that you might want to try when making your four patch units is to press the seams open. This will give you less bulk when you stitch the flying geese to the four patch units.
