- <u>You may begin registering for classes at any time</u> after receiving the brochure. <u>EVERY registration postmarked by August 15, 2019 will be considered a "1st Day Registration"</u>.
- "1st Day Registrations" (those postmarked by 8/15/2019) are given "preferential" treatment in the assignment of classes. But that does NOT guarantee that just because you are in that group that you will receive your first-choice class for every day or any day. For example, assignments are impacted by the popularity of a class your first choice may also be the first choice of 50 others. But I do believe that you will be pleased with your assignments and will be quite happy with the project you complete.
- On Tuesday evening this year, we are going to switch it up a bit by a fun night of socializing and playing Bingo.
 Details can be found on page 12 of this brochure. Pre-registration is required and the cost for both (the social
 reception and the Bingo event) is \$25 (in addition to your retreat registration fee). A hot buffet of various
 appetizers will be offered. Weather permitting, the social reception will be outside on the patio but Bingo will be
 moved indoors to take advantage of better lighting and sound control.

Registration Forms must be mailed. **Your registration is NOT considered complete if the registration fee is not included.** <u>Your registration fee includes a buffet lunch for each day you are registered for classes</u>.

REGISTRATION FORMS:

The Registration Form with your class selections is the *ONLY* acceptable application and must be sent via USPS. Emails, texts, and any other means of submitting class choices will not be accepted. Please indicate a minimum of 3 choices, in order of preference, for each day you are registered (also the Wednesday evening class time frame). If you do not indicate at least 3 choices and the classes you have indicated are full, you may not be assigned classes for that day. Making only one choice will not guarantee you space in that class. Do not select classes that you are not willing to take. Once classes are assigned (October 1, 2019), you will receive an <u>EMAIL</u> with your schedule of classes. *All notifications to you will be via email*. We do not utilize USPS for mailing of any hard copy forms to you.

Complete the Registration Form in its entirety along with your class selections. Return the signed and dated form along with payment for the *Registration Fee and the Tuesday Beach Basket Bingo* (if you plan to attend). Class fees will be payable after you are notified of your assigned classes.

CLASS SELECTIONS:

When choosing your basket classes, please note the skill level, tools required, and time allowed to make sure you are able to meet all requirements. <u>Please remember that it is not fair to the instructor or the other students to take a class that is beyond your skill level of expertise and that you are not ready to handle</u>. Some classes may have special tools required. Also note the dimensions of the project as some may be larger or smaller than they appear in the featured photo. Some classes may offer more than one project within the same class. Others may offer color options. Please make sure you have made all your choices, or one may be assigned for you.

Skill Levels:

Beginner – The beginner weaver has little to no experience and has woven only a few baskets. They need practice with basic weaving techniques, bases, and shaping. These weavers are acquiring skills to become proficient in over/under weaving, start/stop weaving, twining, and rim lashing as well as learning to control shape.

Beginner/Intermediate – Having gained basic weaving skills, this skill level introduces new pattern weaves such as twill and different rim and lashing finish variations. Larger baskets and patterns with specific weaving instruction are included at this level.

Intermediate – Intermediate weavers have gained proficiency in weaving techniques. They are able to begin with ease and little instruction and have mastered basic weaving techniques. They do not need direction for setting up bases, twining, completing over/under weaves, or creating rims using the specific materials mentioned in the class description.

Advanced — Advanced weavers are proficient. They have mastered most weaving techniques and are ready to be challenged. Teachers are confident these students will not need assistance with basic weaving skills. Advanced weavers often design their own baskets and are quite experienced in most techniques.



CLASS ASSIGNMENT POLICY:

Classes will be assigned randomly with a weighted preference to those received by August 15, 2019. However, **NO ONE** is guaranteed their first choices of classes, but every attempt will be made to insure you are happy with your assignments. Do not sign up for classes that you are unwilling to take. You will be notified **by email** on approximately October 1, 2019 of your class assignments.



PAYMENT FOR CLASSES:

Payment for your assigned classes must be received by **October 31, 2019**. Checks are to be made payable to each respective teacher and dated February 4, 2020. <u>Each check should have your name, plus the teacher and class name noted on the comment line.</u> The class fee checks should be mailed to:

Failure to receive payment for your assigned classes by the October 31st deadline may result in cancellation from the weaving retreat and forfeiture of your registration fee.

Canadian Registrants ... You must submit checks made payable to the teacher for your assigned classes. If you desire, attach a note to the checks indicating that you will bring cash to the class to substitute for the funds.



MARKETPLACE:

A Marketplace will be held in the weaving room on Wednesday evening from approximately 5:30 until 6:30 pm. Teachers and registered attendees (who have reserved paid table space with their registrations) will have patterns, supplies, kits, and basketry related items available. The teacher's email addresses and websites have been indicated by their name on Page 23. Please visit their websites and let them know if you would like them to bring you something specific.



VENDORS:

In addition to the teachers who may have kits, patterns, etc. available to browse and purchase at their teaching pods, there will be three vendors with booths to purchase basket weaving and pine needle coiling supplies from during the retreat.

SILENT AUCTION:

WHAT TO BRING:

To make the most of your weaving experience, it is essential to have the proper tools and equipment. It is suggested that you bring a dishpan or bucket, an old towel, sharp clippers or strong scissors, small and large packing tools, an awl or ice pick, several clips or clothespins, flexible measuring tape, water spray bottle, needle nose pliers, pencil, sandpaper, cable ties of various sizes, and a sharp pocket knife. Make a note of any special tools that may be needed in your class selections. Some of these items may be difficult to travel with so it would be appreciated if you would kindly share if necessary with those in your classes.



SHIPPING SERVICE:

There are various options available within close proximity if you need a shipping service for your completed projects (including a FedEx Office Print & Ship Center and a UPS Store).



REFUND AND CANCELLATION POLICIES:

If you must cancel from a specific class or from the entire weaving retreat, your request must be made in writing (email to beckybechtel@gmail.com) and received <u>BEFORE</u> January 1, 2020. A cancellation fee of \$30 will be applied to your refunded registration.

NO REFUNDS OF REGISTRATION FEES OR TEACHER FEES WILL BE MADE AFTER JANUARY 1, 2020. After January 1, 2020, you will be entitled to your kit from your assigned classes. You may have someone pick them up for you or asked for them to be shipped (shipping costs at your expense).

101TA – LADDER WOVEN WRAP BRACELET

Tuesday – 4 Hours – 8 am until 12 Noon – Class Fee: \$45 (Plus Beads)

Dimensions: Sized to Fit Wrist

All Levels of Weavers * Pam Talsky

This is a fun project! Your wrap bracelet is woven on a leather cord (a variety of colors to choose from) with stone or glass beads of your choosing (prices average from \$5 to \$20 per bracelet). It's a hot fashion statement right now and they're not only fun to weave ... they are lovely to wear too. A selection of roundels, charms, drops, and buttons also available to choose from.

Special Tools Required: Sewing Scissors. Ott Light is helpful.

102LA - I LOVE COLOR WHISK BROOM

Tuesday – 4 Hours – 8 am until 12 Noon – Class Fee: \$52 Dimensions: Sizes will vary.

All Levels of Weavers * Bev Larson

Love color? Then you will love making your whisk broom. The Tri Color Whisk is inspired by a Japanese broom having three colors. The Toe Sock Broom is named after the colorful toe socks we all love. There will be color choices in both the broom corn and the cording.

Special Tools Required: Basket shears and towel. Other tools will be provided by the instructor.

103RI – CLASS ACT

Tuesday – 4 Hours – 1 pm until 5 pm – Class Fee: \$53

Dimensions: 13" Length x 7 ½" Width x 9" Height w/o Handle

All Levels of Weavers * Bonnie Rideout

This classy basket is an eye catcher with the bold overlays. Easy and fun to weave! Class Act is a nice sized basket that can be used anywhere in your home or office. Techniques include start / stop weaving, filling a base, twining, and using overlays. The accent color is black and a pretty leather-like buckle finishes it off.

Special Tools Required: Standard weaving tools.

104TA - PINE NEEDLE SAMPLER CANISTER

Tuesday – 12 Hours – 1 pm until 5 pm (class continues Wed.)

Wednesday 8 am until 5 pm – Class Fee: \$185

Dimensions: 4" Diameter x 9 ½" Height

Intermediate * Pam Talsky

Expand your knowledge of stitches and techniques! Over a dozen stitches are used on this canister including incorporating beads. Those with basic experience will learn new stitches and improve their coiling. Students select from either a footed cherry or walnut base and choose from a selection of beads. The canister uses close to 1# of needles! The sampler will hold your needles and provide a reference for stitches in future coiling projects.

Special Tools Required: Sewing Scissors. Ott Light is helpful.



105BR - NANTUCKET GLASS CANISTER

Tuesday – 6 Hours – 10 am until 5 pm – Class Fee: \$115 Dimensions: 5" Diameter x 5" Height All Levels of Weavers * Trisha Brown

Weave this airtight glass canister with a maple base, rim, cover lid, and staves. Students will have knob options to choose from in class. This attractive canister can be used as a cookie jar, candy dish, or even for pet treats.

Special Tools Required: Will be supplied by the instructor.



106BE – "MELINA" BEADED TABLE BASKET

Tuesday – 8 Hours – 8 am until 5 pm – Class Fee: \$65 Dimensions: 9" Diameter x 6 1/2" Height Intermediate * Becky Bechtel

Beading experience is not required to complete this light-catching and eye-catching table basket. Students will begin on a pre-finished hardwood base. The twill weave will be highlighted by triple twining that makes use of seed beads that students will string themselves. The basket is finished with triple lashing.

<u>Special Tools Required</u>: A beading tray will be very helpful. Other tools will be supplied by the instructor.



107McB - ROUND SWEETGRASS w/SIDE HANDLES

Tuesday – 8 Hours – 8 am until 5 pm – Class Fee: \$95
Dimensions: Size Will Vary

All Levels of Weavers * Barbara McCormick

In this class, you will create a sweetgrass basket that has a variety of uses. The basket is coiled with sweetgrass and southern long leaf pine needles and is lashed with strips of palmetto. Techniques taught will enable students to design a variety of shapes and sizes with an emphasis on the side handle design. No water required.

<u>Special Tools Required</u>: Scissors. Other tools will be supplied by the instructor.



108McP - GATHER AT MY TABLE

Tuesday – 8 Hours – 8 am until 5 pm – Class Fee: \$48

Dimensions: 16" Length x 9" Width x 4" Height x 12" w/Handle

Beginner / Intermediate * Peggy McCarson

A rectangle hoop is used in this design. Weavers will gently upset natural reed sides to follow the shape of the hoop handle. Students will learn how to make rounded corners by adding spokes. You will have a choice of flat and flat oval reeds for the sides. Finish the basket with a handle wrap of your choice. Time permitting, students can explore other handle wraps on paint sticks.

Special Tools Required: Standard weaving tools.

Bring with you to the retreat ... water container & spray bottle (please share with your neighbor), basket weaving tools (noting special class needs), cash, checkbook or credit cards (shop the vendors, teachers, and silent auction), a silent auction donation (seed money for next year), and a positive attitude and patience (others in your class have questions too).



109DU - RIVERS

Tuesday – 8 Hours – 8 am until 5 pm – Class Fee: \$89
Dimensions: 12" Diameter x 10 ½" Height
Intermediate / Advanced * Jeanne Dudley

This beautiful large basket is a partial double wall style woven with natural and space dyed reed. The basket is woven with a double grooved 10" round wooden base. It is finished with wooden bushel basket handles. This basket was designed with the inspiration from Anne Coleman's work. Natural and various space dyed reeds to choose from in class. Color choices in class.

Special Tools Required: Standard weaving tools.



110TE – WISP OF THE WILLOWS

Tuesday – 8 Hours – 8 am until 5 pm – Class Fee: \$115 Dimensions: 2 ¾" Diameter x 5" Height Intermediate * Karen Tembreull

Students will thread a base of Cedar bark through a vintage spigot handle. An overlaid hexagonal base is added. The basket is twined with iris leaves or soft rush and wrapped twined with Willow bark and cotton cord. An additional wisp of Basswood cordage and fleece may be added. A cordage demo will be presented. The rim is a nice braided border.

Special Tools Required: Standard weaving tools.



111CI – SPIRAL STORAGE

Tuesday – 8 Hours – 8 am until 5 pm – Class Fee: \$97 Dimensions: 16" Length x 12" Width x 7" Height Intermediate * Char Ciammaichella

This storage basket is started by inserting natural and black spokes into a wood base. Techniques include 3 and 4 rod twining, a 3/3 twill weave and a unique rim and handle attachment. Students will decide to show more black or more natural when starting the twill. The copper accent is woven in after the basket is finished.

Special Tools Required: Standard weaving tools.

This is an attractive basket with uniquely attached leather handles. The design features 2/1 twill weave, overlays, 3 rod wale with step ups, and stacked weaving.
