

REGISTRATION:

Registration is now open. To register you must complete the REGISTRATION FORM which can be found at the following:

- The final two pages of this document.
- "Florida Basket Weavers" Facebook group page.
- Website www.WeavingInTheSunshineState.com.

Each registration **postmarked** by August 31, 2023, is considered a "1st Day Registration".

- "1st Day Registrations" are given preferential treatment in the assignment of classes.
- This does **NOT** guarantee that you will receive your first-choice class for every day or any day. For example, assignments are impacted by the popularity of a class your first choice may also be the first choice of 50 others.



SUBMITTING YOUR REGISTRATION FORM:

- Registration Forms MUST BE MAILED. The Registration Form is the **ONLY** acceptable application and must be sent via USPS, FedEx, or UPS. *Emails, texts, and any other means of submitting class choices are not accepted*.
- Indicate a <u>MINIMUM OF 3 CHOICES</u>, in order of preference, for each class period. If you do not indicate at least 3 choices and the classes you have indicated are full, you may not be assigned classes for that day. Making only one choice will not guarantee you space in that class. Do not select classes that you are not willing to take.
- Do not include Class Fees at this time. Class fees will be payable after you are notified of your assigned classes (which will be *emailed* to you on approximately October 1, 2023).
- The Registration Fee must be included. A guild membership is NOT a pre-requirement.

CLASS SELECTIONS:

- Note the skill level, tools required, and class times to make sure you can meet the requirements.
- Note the dimensions of the project. Some may be larger or smaller than they appear in the featured photo.
- Some classes offer color options. Mark your choices on the Registration Form.
- There is a difference between expanding your skill set and choosing classes beyond your skill level (levels noted below). It is unfair to the instructor and other students to take a class that is beyond your level of expertise. Everyone wants you to be successful in completing your class project while not dominating the instructor's time for one-on-one explanations of techniques it is assumed you already have knowledge of. Expertise in one weaving medium does not necessarily translate to the same level in other materials.

Skill Levels:

<u>All Levels</u> – For the beginner weaver who has little to no experience and may need practice with techniques or shaping, all the way to advanced students.

<u>Beginner/Intermediate</u> – Having gained basic weaving skills, this skill level introduces new pattern weaves such as twill and different rim and lashing variations. Larger baskets and patterns with specific weaving instruction are included at this level.

<u>Intermediate</u> – Intermediate weavers have gained proficiency in weaving techniques. They can begin with ease, require little instruction, and have mastered basic weaving techniques. They do not need direction for setting up bases, twining, completing over/under weaves, or creating rims using the specific materials mentioned in the class description.

<u>Intermediate/Advanced</u> – These weavers are quite skilled in most techniques and may only require assistance with difficult or unique designs and shaping. Most weaving in class can be done independently and without specific instruction.

<u>Advanced</u> – Advanced weavers are highly proficient and experienced. They have mastered most weaving techniques and are ready to be challenged. Teachers are confident these students will not need assistance with basic weaving skills.



CLASS ASSIGNMENT POLICY:

Classes are assigned randomly with weighted preference to those postmarked by August 31, 2023. However, **NO ONE** is guaranteed their first-choice classes. Every attempt is made to ensure you are happy with your assignments. Do not sign up for classes that you are unwilling to take. You will be notified **by email** on approximately October 1, 2023, of your class assignments.



PAYMENT FOR CLASSES:

Payment for assigned classes must be received by **October 31, 2023**. Checks are to be made payable to each respective teacher. Failure to receive payment for your assigned classes by the October 31st deadline may result in cancellation from the weaving retreat and forfeiture of your registration fee.

Canadian Registrants ... You must submit checks made payable to the teacher for your assigned classes. If you desire, attach a note to the checks indicating that you will bring cash to the class to substitute for the check.





Frequently Asked Questions:



- 1. <u>I only weave a certain type of baskets (Nantucket, pine needle, etc.) and do not want any other type of classes. How do I meet the requirement of "must select a minimum of 3 per class period"?</u> We ALL have a preference for of the type of basket we wish to have a class for. Consider that you may enjoy learning a new type of weaving or that skills learned in one might also be useful in your preferred method. You are welcome to make a note on the Registration Form of your preference, but only <u>making one choice per class period will greatly impact the possibility that you do not receive ANY class assignment for that time frame. Period</u>.
- 2. <u>How do I sign up for multiple classes on the same day (half day classes)?</u> Example ... If your 1st choice class for Tuesday is a half day class and you desire a full day of classes assigned, mark your Registration Form with a #1 morning class and a #1 afternoon class. Your #2 option may either be a #2 morning class and a #2 afternoon class OR a #2 full day 8-hour class. Repeat for your #3 choice(s). You only want a half day of classes? Simply indicate it on the Registration Form.
- 3. <u>What are "Standard Weaving Tools"?</u> Refer to "What to Bring" on page 5 of the brochure. A great video to watch for new weavers that also shows the tools and their uses can be found at Beverly Ashton Vickers YouTube.
- 4. <u>What does my "Class Fee" include?</u> Your class fee includes all materials required to make the project indicated including a written pattern. In some cases, more than one completed project is included. Many teachers will have extra class kits available to purchase. Contact the teacher for availability and associated costs.
