When Your Class Begins

With the commercialism attached to the Christmas season, be prepared to immediately focus your children's attention on the birth of Jesus. Greet them at the door with something intriguing: a bag of hay or some carpenter's tools. Display a child-size shepherd's staff and leather pouch. Show an unusual gift box like one the wise men might have carried. If you capture the children's curiosity, you will be able to direct their minds toward Jesus—the best present ever given to our world.

Unit 1 Bible Memory Activities

From the *Resources* CD printable files, display the unit 1 Bible Memory poster in several places around the room, making it accessible to all teachers. Make extra copies of the poster for children to color and decorate with stickers. Sing the unit 1 Bible Memory song, "We Came to Worship Him." Teach the children the Bible Memory motions also found on the CD.

Make copies of the *Resources* CD rebus printable file. Use the rebus to help nonreaders learn the Bible Memory.

Send home the family letter found on the CD. Ask parents to reinforce the Bible Memory words each day throughout the week.

The music on the CD is reproducible. Send a CD home with each child so parents can sing the songs with their children all week long!

Seasonal Unit Project—Please God Snowflakes

Make several copies of the snowflake from the *Resources* CD for children to cut out and glue onto 5" squares of colored paper. Hang snowflakes from the ceiling, and tell the children that when you see them doing things that please God, you will hang more snowflakes. Encourage them to work to fill the ceiling with snowflakes during the unit.

Unit 1 Learning Center—Station S-T-A-R

Create a unit center called Station S-T-A-R (pronounce each letter), complete with a news desk, chairs, a sign naming Station S-T-A-R, a digital voice recorder, pencils, and paper. Prepare the microphone included on the *Resources* sheet 3. Decorate the desk with several big stars. Use the 3-D star pattern on the CD to make stars from yellow construction paper or card stock and hang from the ceiling. The children will visit this center each week to tell or hear good news about Jesus.

Service Project Ideas for Pre-K & K Children

With parents' permission, have your children be door greeters for adult worship. Or have them stand at the classroom door and greet their classmates as they enter.

Ask church members to donate old Christmas cards that picture Jesus' birth. Providing paper, glue sticks, blunt-tip scissors, and washable markers, let children glue pictures to paper to create their own cards.

Purchase photo albums with clear pockets. Cut pictures and messages from recycled cards to fit inside the album pockets. Let children fill their albums with pictures and messages about Jesus' birth. The albums and cards will make wonderful gifts for shut-ins or people who live in nursingcare facilities.

Allergy Notice

Before class, print and fill out the Allergy Notice from the *Resources* CD for each snack that is served. Post it visibly for parents to take note. And always check your own children's information.

Mark name tags so volunteers can easily identify dietary needs.

An Angel Announces Jesus' Birth

Lesson 1



Scripture: Matthew 1:18-24; Luke 1:26-38, 46, 47 **Bible Memory:** Matthew 2:1, 2

"Jesus was born in the town of Bethlehem. . . . 'We came to worship him.'" (*ICB*) "Jesus was born in Bethlehem. . . . We . . . come to worship him." (*KJV*) **Focus:** ♥ We can share good news about Jesus.

Heart to Heart Teacher Devotion

Sometimes surprises—even happy ones—can be frightening. Mary and Joseph were both surprised and frightened by Gabriel's visit and his announcement. Yet as startling as Gabriel's announcement was, Mary and Joseph both yielded to God's plan as delivered by the heavenly messenger. May we, like that young couple, accept God's plan as well, a plan announced in His Word and one that we now announce to the children.

Bible Background for the Teacher

Nazareth was an insignificant village in Galilee, but God sent a messenger to two residents of that village. Mary and Joseph were engaged to be married. At that time, an engagement was such a sacred commitment that only a bill of divorcement could break it. The appearance of the angel to Joseph confirmed that the child who was being carried by Mary was of divine origin. The angel told both Mary and Joseph that the expected child should be named Jesus.

Getting Started (10-15 minutes)



Use one or more of these learning centers to help children explore good news.

Welcome

- Use your Scout puppet to greet the children.
- Place a name tag on each child and gather necessary information from the adult bringing the child; then guide the child to a learning center.
- Provide a container in which children can place their offering money.

Quick Step Tell-a-Friend Megaphone

SAY: Today we are going to learn about an angel who told some good news about Jesus. When we have good news, we like to share it with our friends. Let's make megaphones. Explain what a megaphone is used for. Then • we can share good news about Jesus. That's the best news to share!

Announce through your megaphone something good that has happened. Let children take turns announcing their good news. Applaud each announcement.

ASK: How did you feel when you shared your good news? Who else might like to hear your good news?

Station S-T-A-R (unit center)

Before class, print out name tags and cut yarn into 18" lengths. SAY: The Bible tells us about a time when an angel gave good news to a woman and a man. Sometimes your parents watch TV to hear news. Let's visit our news station, Station S-T-A-R, where the news is always good. At Station S-T-A-R, • we can share good news about Jesus.

Lead children to Station S-T-A-R, where they will make name tags to be used throughout the unit. Let them add stickers and write their names. Cover tags with adhesive covering. Punch holes and thread yarn to tie as lanyards. Help children explore what happens in a newsroom-people talk into microphones, people write news articles, and so forth. Using the microphone, interview the children.

ASK: Have you ever visited a radio or TV station? What good news would you tell a news reporter to say?

Bible-Times Home



SAY: Today we will learn about a young woman named Mary. Maybe Mary was at home dusting furniture when she got some good news. When we are at home, • we can share good news about Jesus with others. Let's build a house like the one Mary might have lived in.

Show the house scene. Then use the shoe box to create the inside of a house. Help the children put blocks inside for tables or chairs or beds and use scissors to cut bits of material for blankets or tablecloths or dustcloths. As they play, talk about good news they hear at home.

ASK: What good news does your mother say in the kitchen? What good news can you say about Jesus?

Especially for 4s!

Instead of a shoe box, provide a toy playhouse and people figures.

Focus We can share good news about Jesus.

Save all visuals for reuse throughout the quarter.

Bible Discovery (20-25 minutes)



Use all these activities to help children tell about a time when Mary and Joseph heard good news.

Sing and Pray

Sing "Happy Birthday, Jesus" and "We Came to Worship Him."

PRAY: Dear God, help us hear some of the best news ever told. In Jesus' name, amen.

ASK: Do you have good news to share? Talk into this microphone, please. Interview each child.

SAY: Listen and you will hear very good news from God that an angel shared with Mary and Joseph.

Bible Time

Have children show happy or surprised faces when indicated. SAY: In the Bible book of Matthew, chapter 1 (show Matthew 1), we read that Mary (show Mary) made God happy because she loved Him and always tried to obey Him. Show happy faces. Mary was making plans to marry a man named Joseph. Show Joseph. Joseph loved and obeyed God too.

Remove Joseph; show angel with Mary. One day, God sent an angel named Gabriel to Mary. Gabriel said, "Greetings! The Lord is with you." Mary was surprised! Show looks of surprise. Mary did not understand why Gabriel had come.

Gabriel said, "Don't be afraid. God is pleased with you. He is going to give you a baby boy. You are to name the baby Jesus."

The angel told Mary that this baby would be a special child. Mary was happy. Show happy faces. Mary told the angel she would do whatever God wanted her to do. Remove Mary and angel.

Lay Joseph in front of house. Joseph was sleeping. Have children close their eyes. In a dream, an angel told Joseph to marry Mary and to name the baby Jesus. The angel said this baby would save people from their sins. When Joseph awoke (stand Joseph next to angel; have children open their eyes), Joseph did what the angel said to do.

Show Mary and Joseph together. Mary and Joseph were happy to hear the good news that Jesus was to be born. Show happy faces.

Bible Review

Hold up story figures. Ask questions and have children point to the figure that gives the correct answers.

ASK: Who brought the announcements from God? Who was going to have a baby? Who heard the angel in a dream? Who did what the angel said to do?

Bible Memory Matthew 2:1, 2

Before class, print and display the motions from the CD.

SAY: • We can share good news about Jesus when we say our Bible **Memory.** Help a child point to each word in Matthew 2:1, 2 in your Bible as you say it. Begin teaching the motions as you say the verse in short, rhythmic phrases, allowing children to repeat each phrase after you.

Grow and Go (15-20 minutes)



Use one or more of these learning centers to help children share good news they know about baby Jesus.

Focus • We can share good news about Jesus.

Quick Step Bible Beanbag Toss

SAY: Just like the angel Gabriel, • we can share good news about Jesus, Let's share some good-news words from today's Bible lesson.

Have the children sit (or stand) in a circle. Gently toss the beanbag to one child and say, "Gabriel." Have that child toss the beanbag to another person and say another word from the Bible story. (Words that might be said: Mary, Joseph, angel, Jesus, baby, afraid, surprised, happy, special.)

ASK: What good news about Jesus can you tell a friend this week? What are some ways you can share good news about Jesus? Prompt children to name ways, such as drawing and sharing pictures, talking about Jesus, singing about Jesus.

Pick-and-Tell Game

Before class, put the four picture cards in the bag.

SAY: Let's play a game with some Bible story picture cards. • We can share good news about Jesus.

Have children take turns pulling picture cards from the bag, using the cards to tell some good news about Jesus. (Examples: "This card shows Mary. She was happy to be the mother of Jesus." "Good news! This is Joseph. An angel told him to name the baby Jesus.") If a child pulls the card that says Jesus!, the child can tell any good news about Jesus.

ASK: What made Jesus such a special baby? (He is God's Son. He came to save people.)

What good news can you tell about baby Jesus? Who are you going to tell the good news about Jesus to?



Have children take turns selecting cards. When a card is shown, ask the children to name who or what is on the card. Then use that card to verbalize for the children some good news about Jesus.

Sing Out!

SAY: • We can share good news about Jesus. Let's learn a song to help us do that.

Listen to the Bible Memory song, "We Came to Worship Him." Review the words with the children. Then give them their Tell-a-Friend megaphones. Encourage them to sing loudly so that others will hear the words.

ASK: Do you feel happy when you sing about Jesus? Who can you sing this song to and tell about baby Jesus?

Closing the Hour

• Be sure children who are leaving now have their activity projects and a copy of today's Heart Tugs. Mention to the parents the "Angel Tells Good News" maze they can do with their child. Keep name tags to use throughout the unit. Note: A Family Together Time page is available online for families to download. See www.heartshaper.com.

More! Getting Started (10-15 minutes)



Use one or more of these learning centers to help children explore good news.

Transition Time

- Greet new arrivers, giving each a premade Station S-T-A-R name tag.
- Show a torn-up newspaper. SAY: Scout is sad because he chewed up a paper that had good news written inside. Let's cheer up Scout by telling good news about Jesus. Let children take turns doing so.
- Serve a snack. Follow your church's policy for restroom breaks.

Good News Jump

SAY: In today's Bible story, we are learning about a family who had good news to share. Let's play a game to see if we can tell good news.

Have the children sit in a circle. Say a statement. If the statement is good news, the children can jump up. If the statement is not good news, they can remain seated. (Possible statements: We are going to a party. We have to go to the grocery store. My mommy just had a baby. It is time for bed. We are learning about baby Jesus today.)

ASK: Do you have good news you want to share? Allow children to tell good news. Other children can jump up after the news is told.

• We can share good news about Jesus. That is the best news of all!

Good News Show-and-Tell

Before class, place the items in the bag.

SAY: I have some things in this bag that will tell us some good news. Let's see if you can guess what the things are.

Let each child reach into the bag, feel one item, and try to identify it. Pull out the items to show whether the children's guesses were right. After all guesses, let the children guess what the good news is.

ASK: What good news might people read in a newspaper? (birth, wedding, or event announcements)

What good news can you tell with a baby blanket and baby doll? (A baby has been born.)

We can share good news about Jesus. News about Jesus is the best news to tell!

Station S-T-A-R (unit center)

SAY: In today's Bible story, we will hear how an angel gave good news to Mary and Joseph. Let's visit Station S-T-A-R, where the news is always good. We'll do a maze and take the angel to find Mary.

Lead the children to Station S-T-A-R. Speak into the microphone to give instructions for the Heart Tugs activity.

- ASK: What good news do you think the angel was coming to tell Mary? What good news can you tell someone? Let children tell good news using the microphone.
- We can share good news about Jesus. That's the best news of all!

Especially for 4s!

Draw a broken line along the right path and let 4s trace over it.

Focus We can share good news about Jesus.

Save all visuals for reuse throughout the quarter.

Teaching Tip

Some children may think a statement is good news, while others may not. Remind children that it is OK to have different opinions.



Whisper prompts to children who may struggle to name an object.

More! Sing and Pray

Sing "Happy Birthday, Jesus."

PRAY: Dear God, help us to hear the good news that Mary and Joseph heard. In Jesus' name, amen.

Use all these activities to help children tell about a time when

Whisper and SAY: Did you ever have a friend tiptoe up behind you and then (louder and faster) say hello all of a sudden? The Bible tells us in the book of Matthew, chapter 1 (show Matthew 1), that the angel Gabriel surprised Mary and Joseph with some good news. But he didn't sneak up behind them! Let's find out what happened.

Bible Time—Another Way!

Display the teaching picture, and say the Bible-story action rhyme below with a natural speaking voice or with a military cadence. Have the children repeat each line after you as they copy the motions. Once you begin a motion, maintain it while the line is repeated.

Down from Heav'n an angel came. Point up to Heaven.
Gabriel, Gabriel was his name. Point both thumbs to your chest.
"Mary, Mary," Gabriel cried. Clap hands in approval.
"A girl like you is hard to find. Put hand over eyebrows and look around.
God will send a baby boy. Fold arms to rock a pretend baby.
Mary, you will have much joy. Point to smiling mouth.
Call Him Jesus, God's own Son. Point up.
You're His mother! You're the one!" Hug self.
In a dream the angel spoke. Lay head on hands as though sleeping.
Joseph heard and then awoke. Stretch as though waking up.
He took Mary as his wife. Hook arms with person beside you.
Cared for her through all his life. Turn around with arms linked.
Mary and Joseph God did choose. Point to each child.
Gabriel gave them good, good news! Applaud loudly.

More! Bible Review

Repeat the rhyme and have children act it out. Each time the rhyme is repeated, different children can play the parts of Gabriel, Mary, and Joseph. Use props to indicate who they are: a halo made of tinsel for the angel, a broom for Mary, a pillow for Joseph.

ASK: What was the angel's name? (Gabriel)

What good news did the angel tell Mary and Joseph? (Jesus would be born.)

More! Bible Memory Matthew 2:1, 2

Before class, print and display the motions from the CD.

Have children sit in a circle. Read the Bible Memory from the Bible and review the motions. Sing "We Came to Worship Him" as the opened Bible is passed around the circle.

More! Bible Discovery (20-25 minutes)

Mary and Joseph heard good news.

More! Grow and Go (15-20 minutes)



Use one or more of these learning centers to help children **share** good news they know about baby Jesus.

Quick Step Scout's Good News

Scout comes out, carrying the ribbons. He is very excited. SAY: **Scout**, why are you so excited? What do you have there? Scout shows the ribbons. Then he whispers to you. Oh, this is good news! Let's tell the children.

When Scout was out for his morning run (Scout pretends to run), he heard lots of laughing and happy talk. Scout stopped to see what was happening. Scout stops. He walked into his friend's backyard, and guess what he saw? Let children guess. Puppies! Seven puppies! How many boy puppies were there, Scout? Scout hands you the blue ribbons one at a time as the children count them. How many girls? Count the pink ribbons.

The children in the family were so happy, they were giving pieces of ribbon to announce the good news. When the children saw Scout, they said, "Scout, you're a good friend. You can have some ribbons too!"

Scout gets excited again. Scout, you brought the ribbons for us to see. Now you have shared the news with us. Thanks for sharing the news. Pat Scout on the head.

ASK: Who shared good news with Scout?

We can share good news too. ♥ We can share good news about Jesus. What good news about Jesus will you share this week?

An Angel Visits

Before class, print copies of the coloring page.

SAY: The angel Gabriel shared good news with Mary and Joseph. Let's color a picture that shows Gabriel telling good news. We can give our pictures to other people, and then Ψ we can share good news about Jesus.

As children color their pages, talk about the Bible story. Let children spread glue on the angel's hair or clothing, and then sprinkle glitter on it. Have children show their pictures and share something about baby Jesus.

ASK: What good news did Gabriel tell Mary and Joseph? Who will you give your picture to? What good news about Jesus will you tell?

Especially for 4s!

Help the children put on the glue. Allow them to put the glitter wherever they desire—not just on the hair or clothing.

Saying Good-bye

• As children wait for parents, repeat the Bible Time—Another Way! action rhyme.

• Be sure children have projects made in class, but keep their name tags to use throughout the unit. Give parents this week's *Heart Tugs*. Encourage them to ask their children to share with them some good news about Jesus. Note: A *Family Together Time* page is available online for families to download. See www.heartshaper.com. Just for You

Ten Commandments for Teachers

One

Understand that teaching children is a holy calling of eternal value; pray for each child and ask for loving wisdom as you prepare. (Being prepared says you care.)

Two

Get down at a child's eye level; show love and welcome by your touch, words, and smile. Teach respect by showing respect. (Your actions will teach far more than your words.)

Three

Make suggestions more often than you give commands; phrase directions positively. (A child must know what he or she *can* do in place of what he or she *cannot* do.)

Four

Be a teacher of great vision. See the most active, the most difficult, or the most withdrawn child not as a problem, but as a person to be loved into God's family. (Remember and repeat often that God loves and has good plans for each one.)

Five

Give acceptable choices and set reasonable limits; stick to them and keep your word when you make a promise. (Limits foster a child's sense of security.)

Six

Realize that your interaction is always needed, even when children are absorbed in an activity. (Stay nearby to guide conversation; listen, show love, and ask open-ended questions to help children understand and apply Bible truths.)

Seven

Be quick to see, describe, and thank a child for right actions. (Describing a child's actions helps the child put meaning to concepts like fairness and kindness.)

Eight

Remember that children learn by doing, so provide active ways for children to learn. (Have several activities ready when the first child arrives, so children may choose.)

Nine

Know what is typical behavior for children and guide children toward desirable behavior. (Children are not always able to see how their actions affect others.)

Ten

Remember how easily children absorb our attitudes and how watchful they are of our actions and reactions. (Our attitudes and actions will either affirm or deny the truth of our words!)
