### 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

#### **General notes**

#### INHALATION:

Remove from exposure to fresh air. If breathing has stopped or is difficult, administer artificial respiration and oxygen if available. Seek medical attention immediately.

#### **5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES**

SUITABLE EXTINGUISHING MEDIA: Water spray, BC-powder, Carbon dioxide (CO2)

UNSUITABLE EXTINGUISHING MEDIA: Do not use the direct water jet on burning material.

**SPECIAL HAZARDS ARISING FROM THE SUBSTANCE /MIXTURE:** In case of insufficient ventilation and/or in use, may form flammable/explosive vapor-air mixture. Solvent vapors are heavier than air and may spread along floors. # 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

#### 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

#### PRECAUTIONS FOR SAFE HANDLING:

Use only in well-ventilated areas. Due to danger of explosion, prevent leakage of vapors into cellars, flues and ditches. Ground/bond container and receiving equipment. Use explosion-proof electrical/ventilating/lighting/equipment. Use only non-sparking tools.

#### HANDLING AND STORAGE:

Use splash goggles or face shield when eye contact is possible. Respiratory protection is not generally required, if desired use NIOSH approved organic vapor respirator. Use chemical resistant gloves as needed to avoid prolonged or repeated contact. Store in a cool, dry, well ventilated area away from all sources of heat or flame.

Places which are not ventilated, e.g. unventilated below ground level areas such as trenches, conduits and shafts, are particularly prone to the presence of flammable substances or mixtures. Vapors are heavier than air, spread along floors and form explosive mixtures with air. Vapors may form explosive mixtures with air.

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL PRECAUTIONS:**

Keep away from drains, surface and ground water. Retain contaminated washing water and dispose of it. If substance has entered a water course or sewer, inform the responsible authority.
