4. FIRST AID MEASURES

General notes

Do not leave affected person unattended. Remove victim out of the danger area. Keep affected person warm, still and covered. Take off immediately all contaminated clothing. 5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

SUITABLE EXTINGUISHING MEDIA: Water spray, BC-powder, Carbon dioxide (CO2)

UNSUITABLE EXTINGUISHING MEDIA: Do not use the direct water jet on burning material.

SPECIAL HAZARDS ARISING FROM THE SUBSTANCE /MIXTURE: In case of insufficient ventilation and/or in use, may form flammable/explosive vapor-air mixture. Solvent vapors are heavier than air and may spread along floors. Places which are not ventilated, e.g. unventilated below ground level areas such as trenches, conduits and shafts, are particularly prone to the presence of flammable substances or mixtures.

7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

PRECAUTIONS FOR SAFE HANDLING:

Never keep food or drink in the vicinity of chemicals. Never place chemicals in containers that are normally used for food or drink. Keep away from food, drink and animal feeding stuffs.

OTHER USE PRECAUTIONS: Use local and general ventilation. Avoidance of ignition sources. Keep away from sources of ignition - No smoking. Take precautionary measures against static discharge. Use only in well-ventilated areas. Due to

danger of explosion, prevent leakage of vapors into cellars, flues and ditches. Ground/bond container and receiving equipment. Use explosion-proof electrical/ventilating/lighting/equipment. Use only non-sparking tools.

HANDLING AND STORAGE:

Use splash goggles or face shield when eye contact is possible. Respiratory protection is not generally required, if desired use NIOSH approved organic vapor respirator. Use chemical resistant gloves as needed to avoid prolonged or repeated contact. Store in a cool, dry, well ventilated area away from all sources of heat or flame.

Places which are not ventilated, e.g. unventilated below ground level areas such as trenches, conduits and shafts, are particularly prone to the presence of flammable substances or mixtures. Vapors are heavier than air, spread along floors and form explosive mixtures with air. Vapors may form explosive mixtures with air.
