

Instructions For: Towel Bear

Materials used:

- 1 Sunday Bath Towel in Soft Greige
- 1 Sunday Hand Towel in Soft Greige
- 1 hair elastic or rubber band

Steps:



1. Start by folding down the long ends of the bath towel.



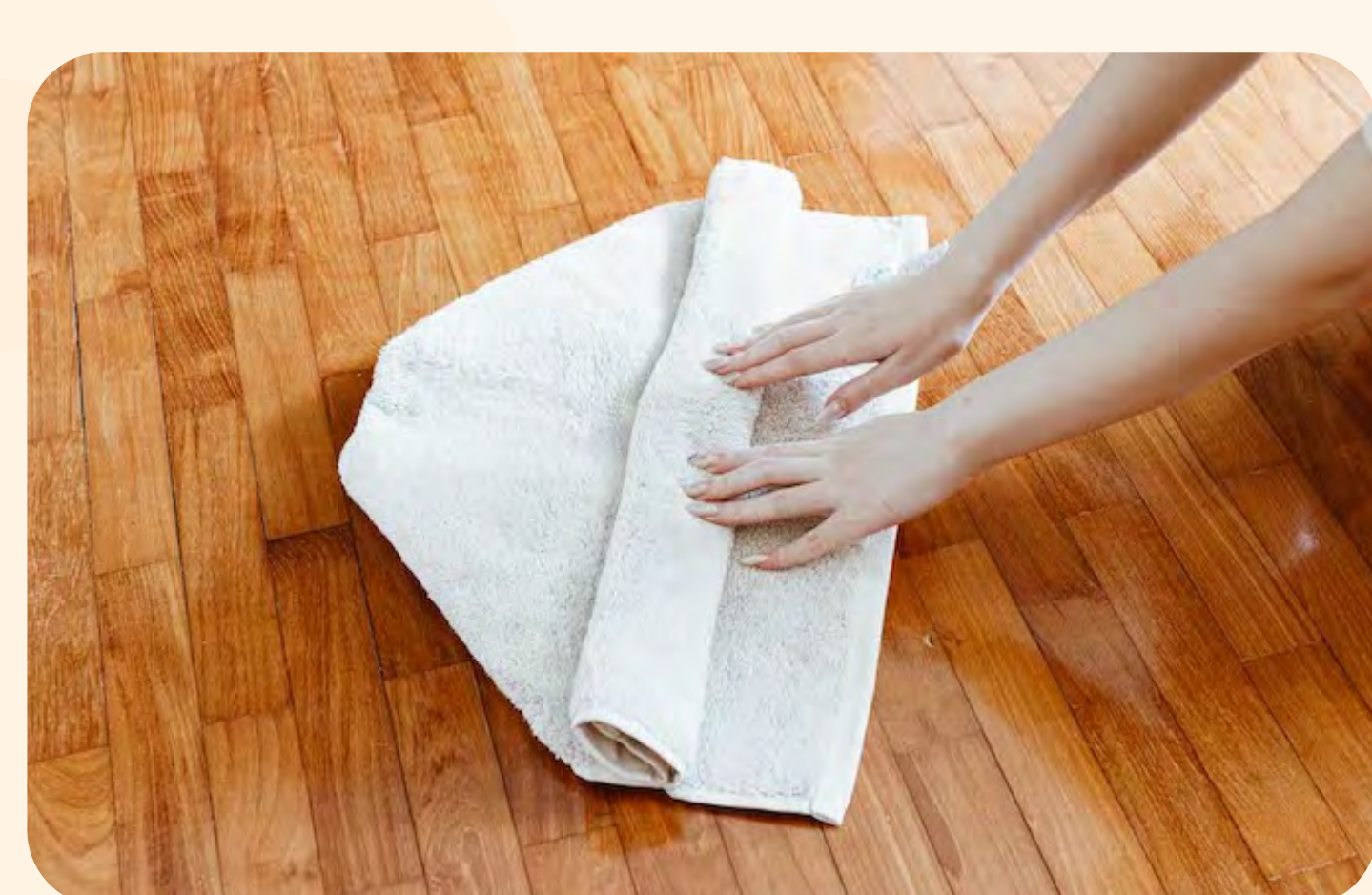
2. Roll in the shorter ends of the bath towel tightly. This should form two rolls that meet in the middle of the towel.



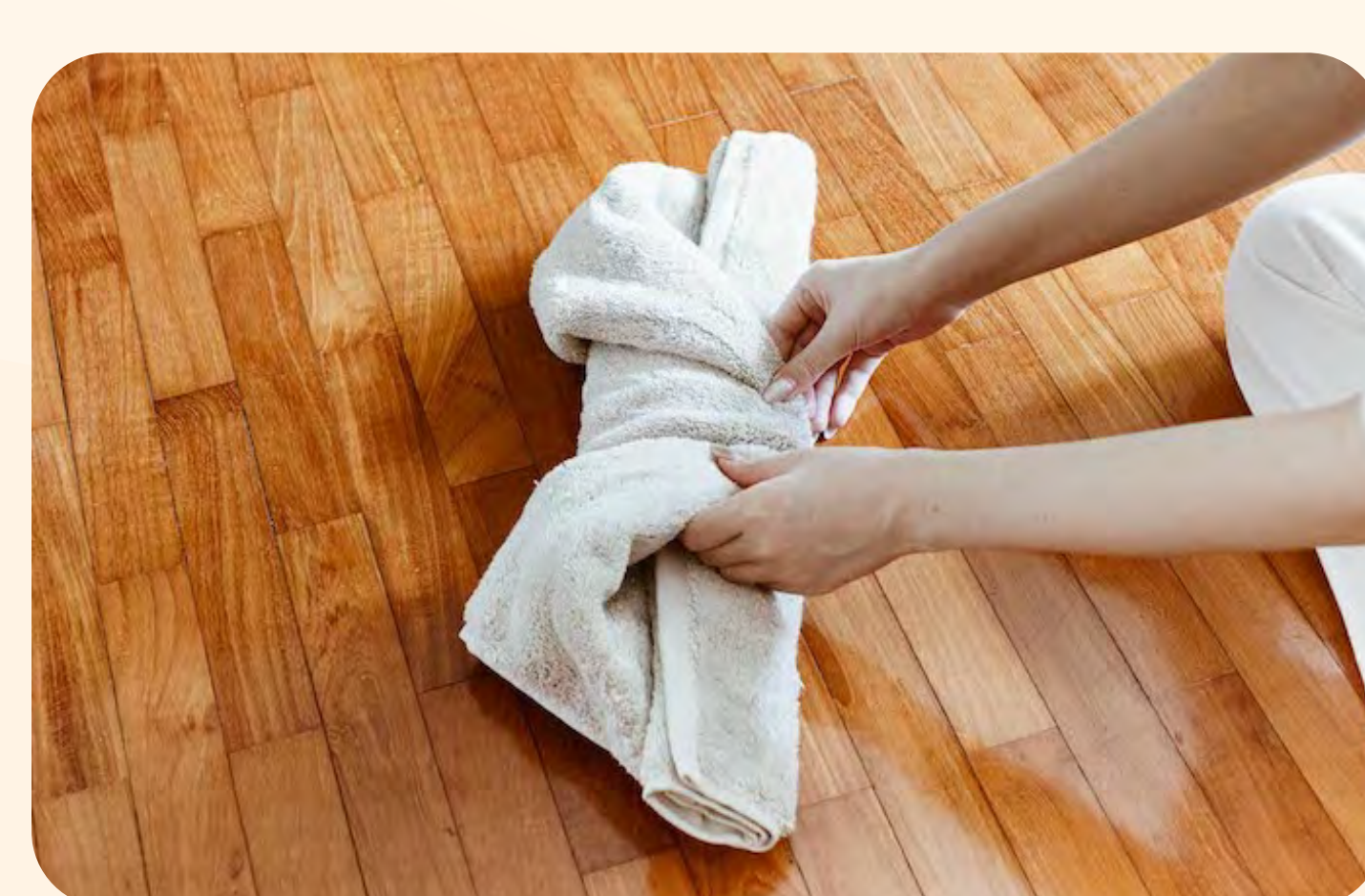
3. Flip the rolled bath towel over and fold it into half lengthwise. Then, stand the bath towel up on one of its folded edges, such that its four rolled corners are facing the front. This will form the body of the bear.



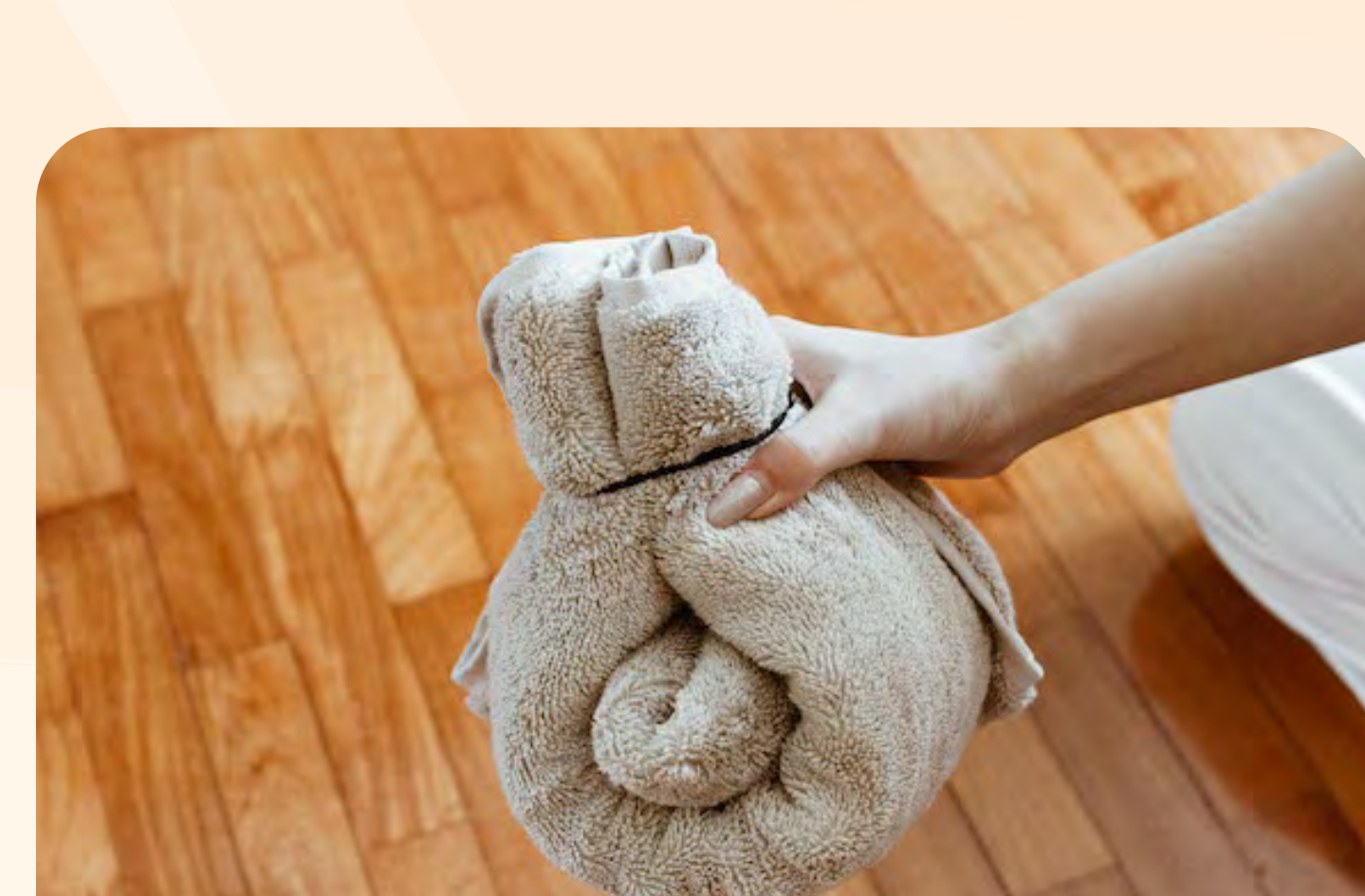
4. Taking the hand towel, fold over the breadth of the towel until it's about a quarter away from the opposite end. Then, fold down two corners towards the middle to form two right-angle triangles.



5. Flip the hand towel over. You should find two layers at its shorter end. Fold down the top layer thrice, with each fold measuring about 2 to 2.5 inches.



6. Next, fold the bottom towel layer over the top layer. Then, fold the triangle above over the combined layers.



7. Pick up the hand towel and fold it into half like so, to create the bear's head. Tie the loose ends together with a hair tie/ rubber band.



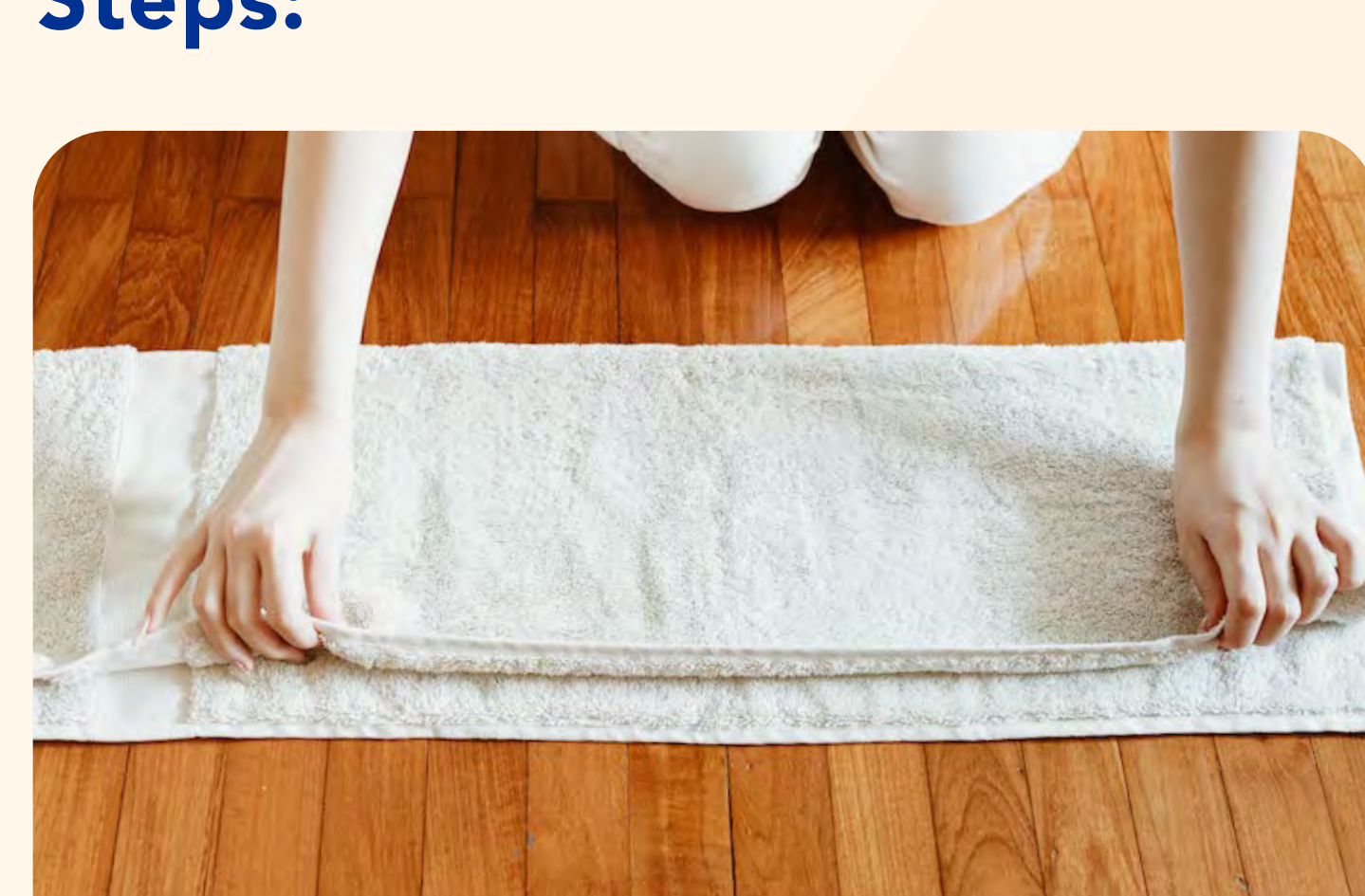
8. Position the bear's head on top of its bath towel body. You may press the 'limbs' of the bear together to secure its shape, as well as conceal the hair tie/rubber band at the base of its head.

Instructions For: Towel Baby Penguin

Materials used:

- 1 Sunday Bath Towel in Artic Silver
- 1 Sunday Hand Towel in Artic Silver
- Small clothespin (optional)

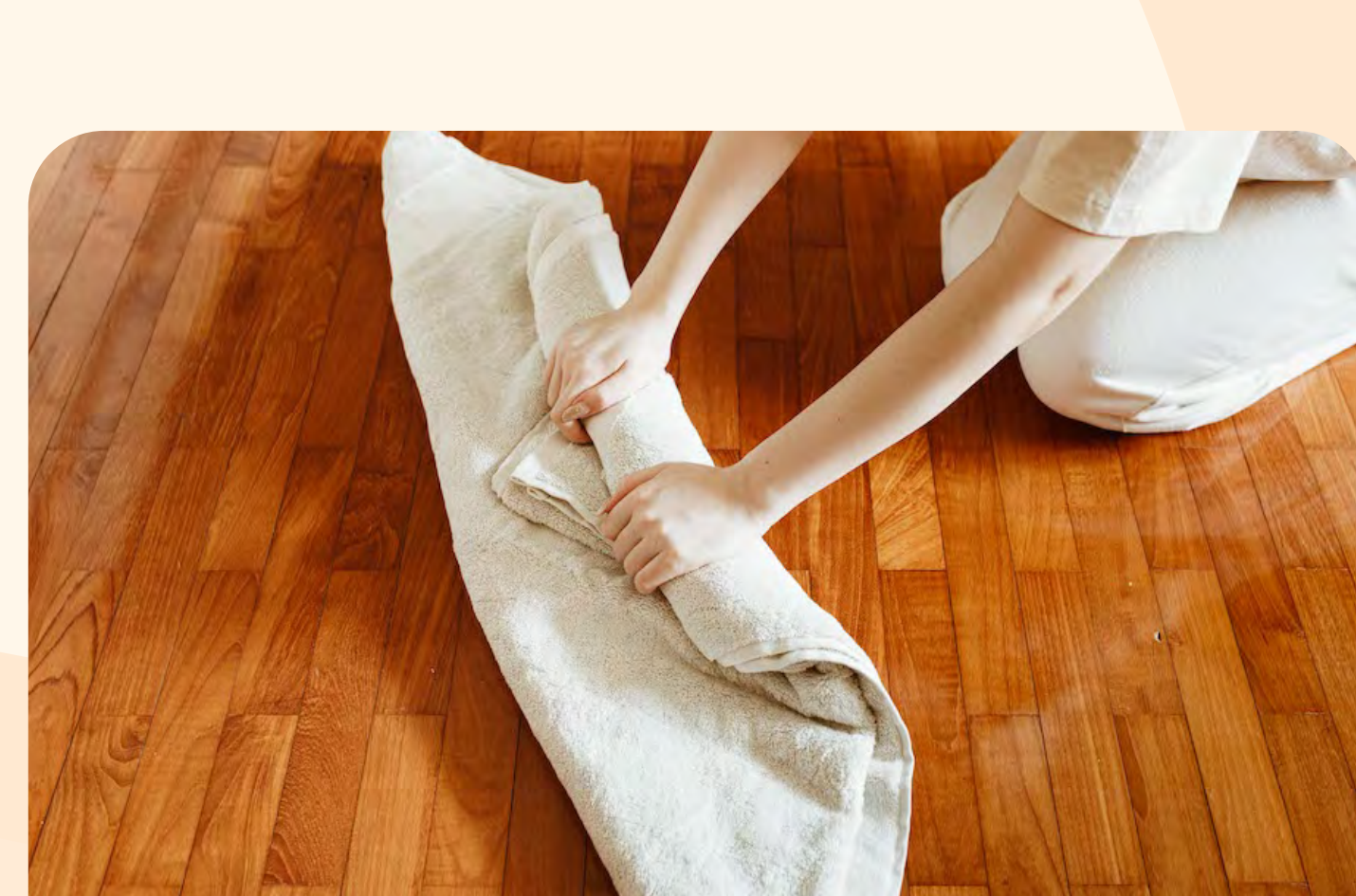
Steps:



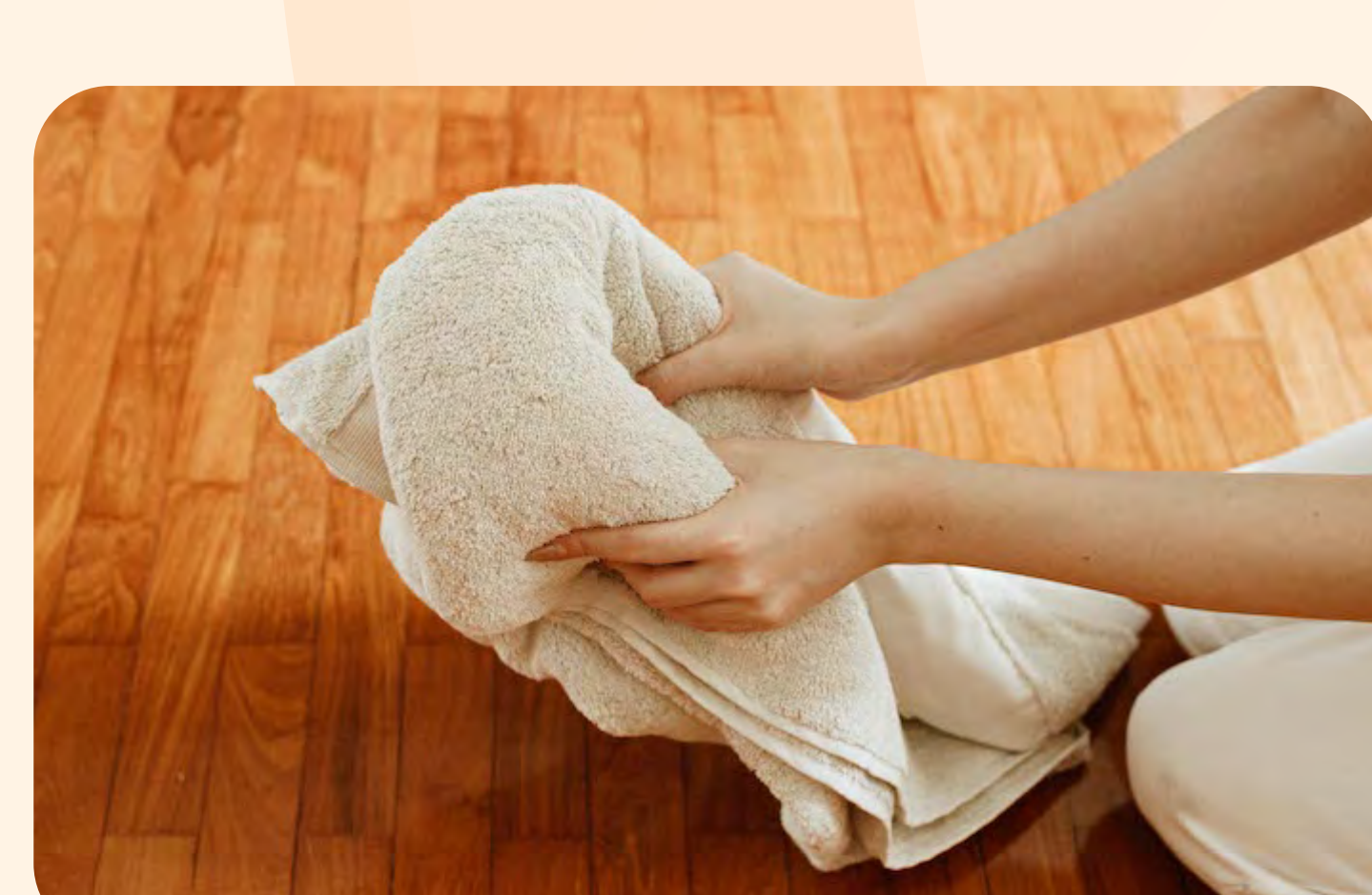
1. Start by folding the hand towel into half breadthwise. Set this aside.



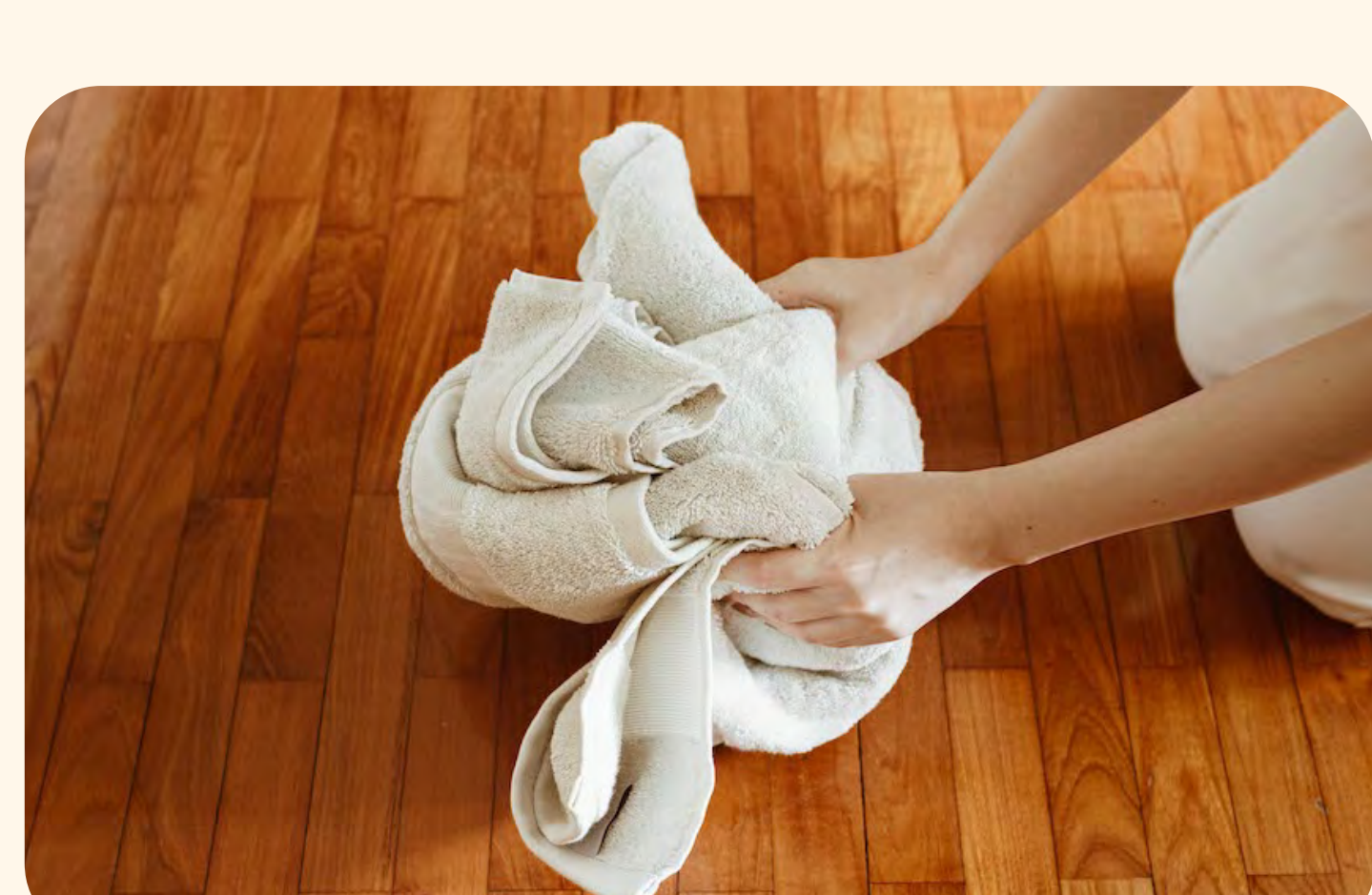
2. Take the bath towel and fold it into half lengthwise. Then, fold one corner of the bath towel towards the opposite corner. This should create a triangle.



3. At the end of the triangle where both corners meet, fold down to form a small triangle. Fold the base of this small triangle next, as shown. The corners of the bath towel should be left sticking out.



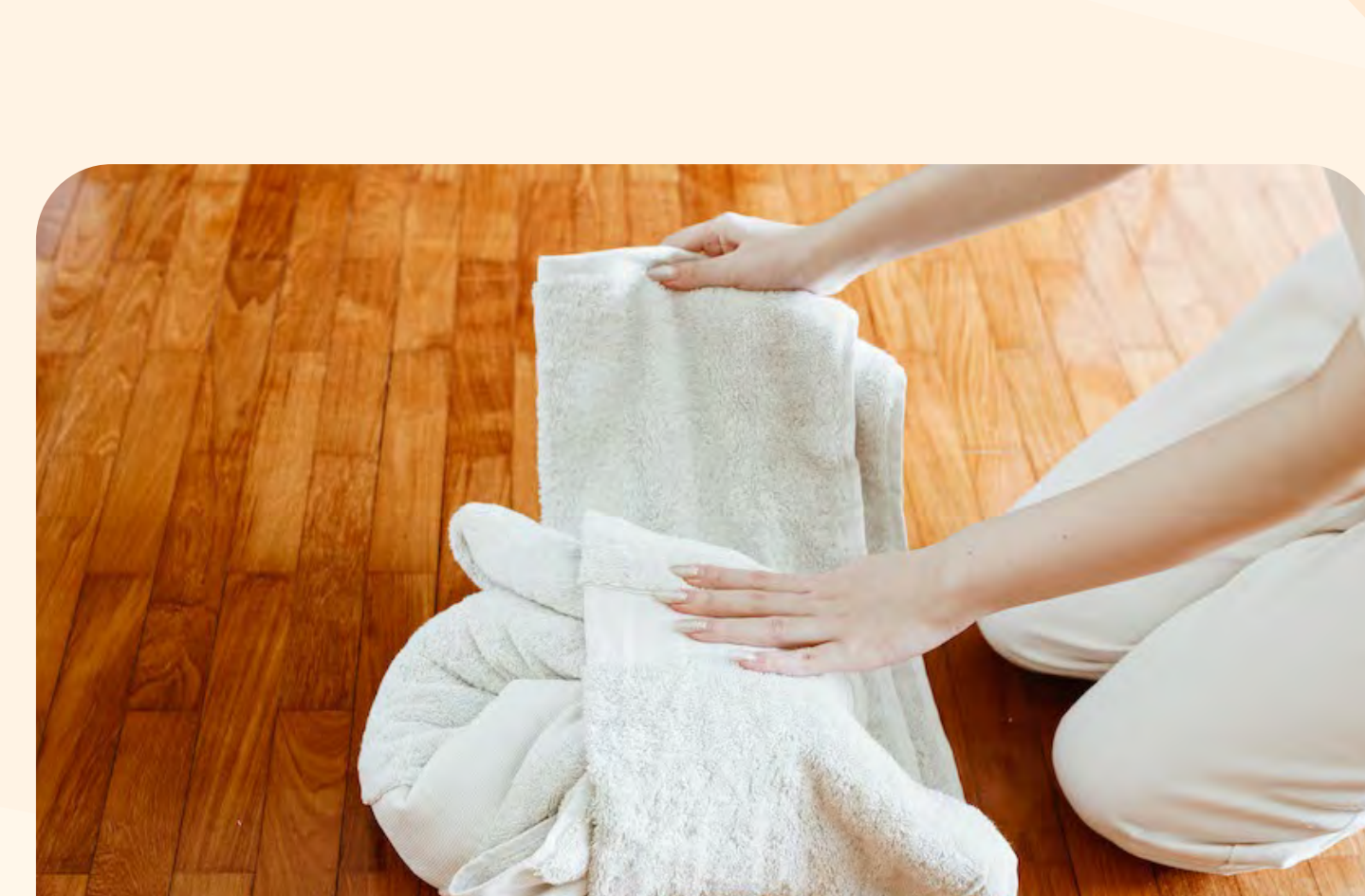
4. Pick up the bath towel and fold it into half, as shown. This should create (1) the head of the baby penguin with a beak formed from the corners of the bath towel, and (2) two downward pointing 'wings' formed from two ends of step 1's triangle.



5. Fold up both 'wings' so they are positioned beside the head of the baby penguin.



6. Using your hands, hold the wings and head of the baby penguin together from the back, as shown. This helps to keep the shape you have created. Next, lay the baby penguin onto the hand towel face down.



7. Wrap one end of the hand towel over the other and fasten them together by tucking one layer under the other, or using a clothespin. Flip the towels over and you have your baby penguin!

Instructions For: Towel Elephant

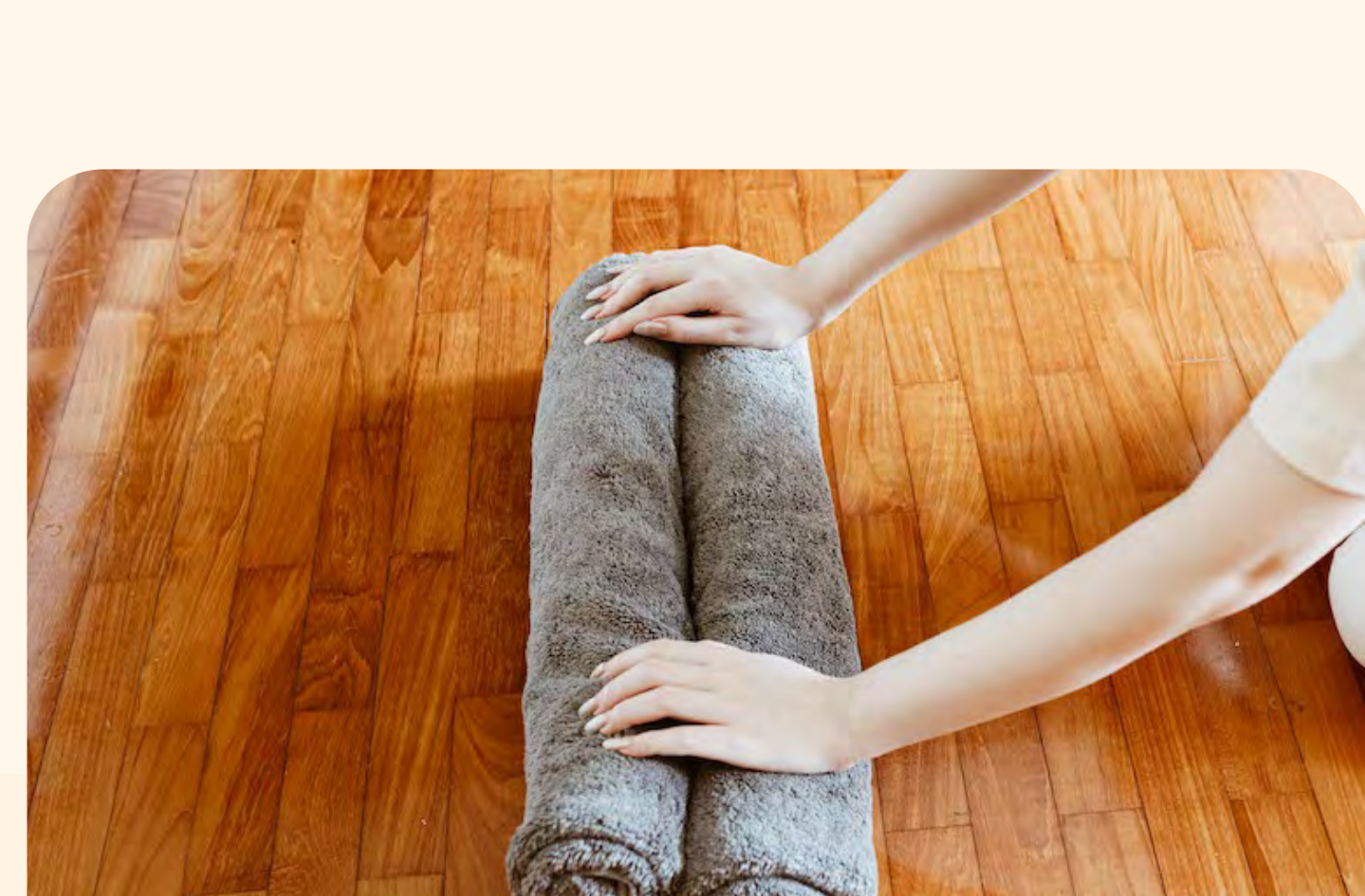
Materials used:

- 1 Sunday Bath Towel in Midnight Grey
- 1 Sunday Hand Towel in Midnight Grey
- Small clothespin (optional)

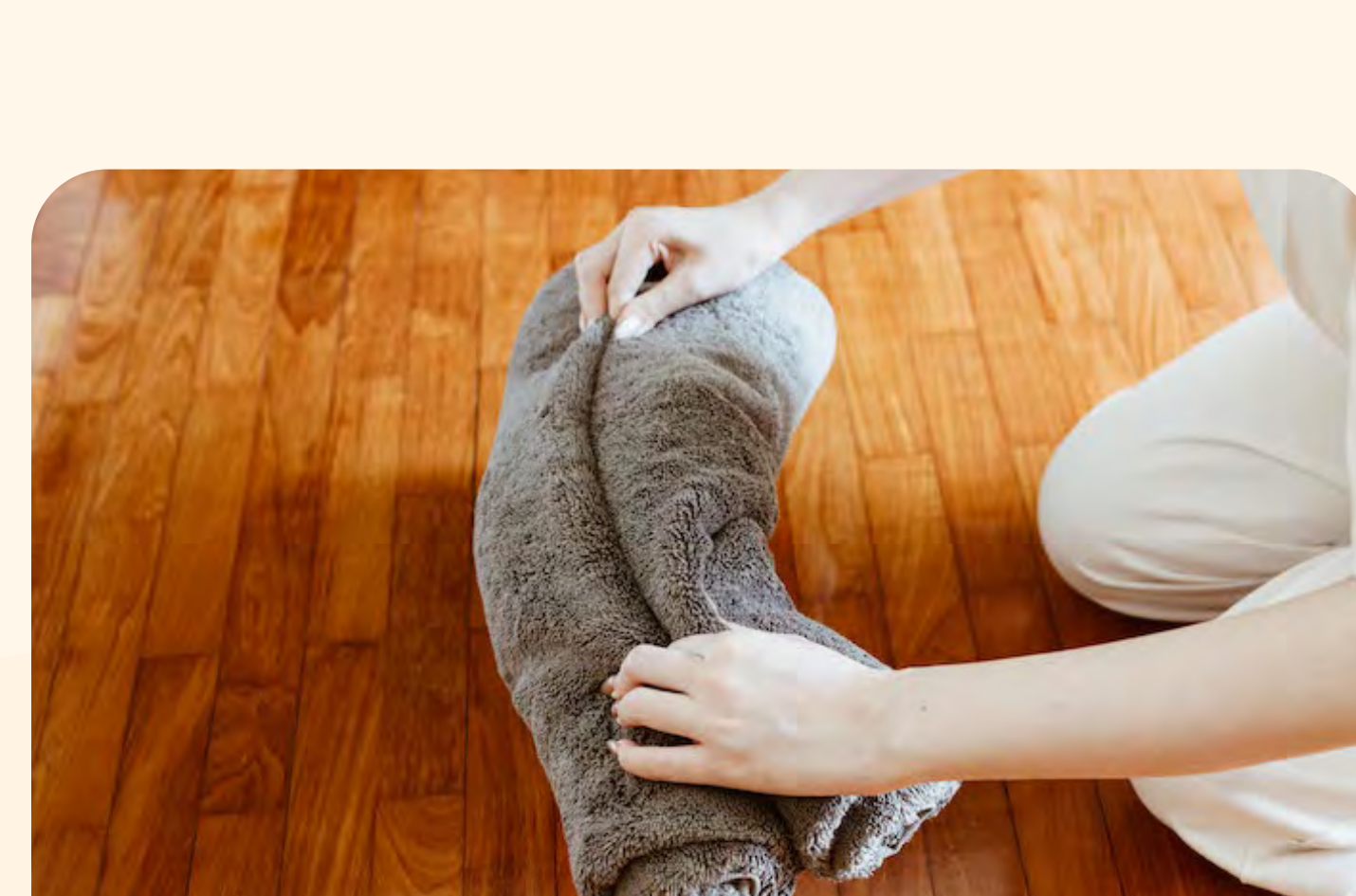
Steps:



1. Start by folding down the long ends of the bath towel.



2. Tightly roll in the shorter ends of the bath towel. This should form two rolls that meet in the middle of the towel.



3. Flip the rolled bath towel over and fold it into half lengthwise.



4. Stand the bath towel up on its four rolled corners. This will form the body of the elephant.



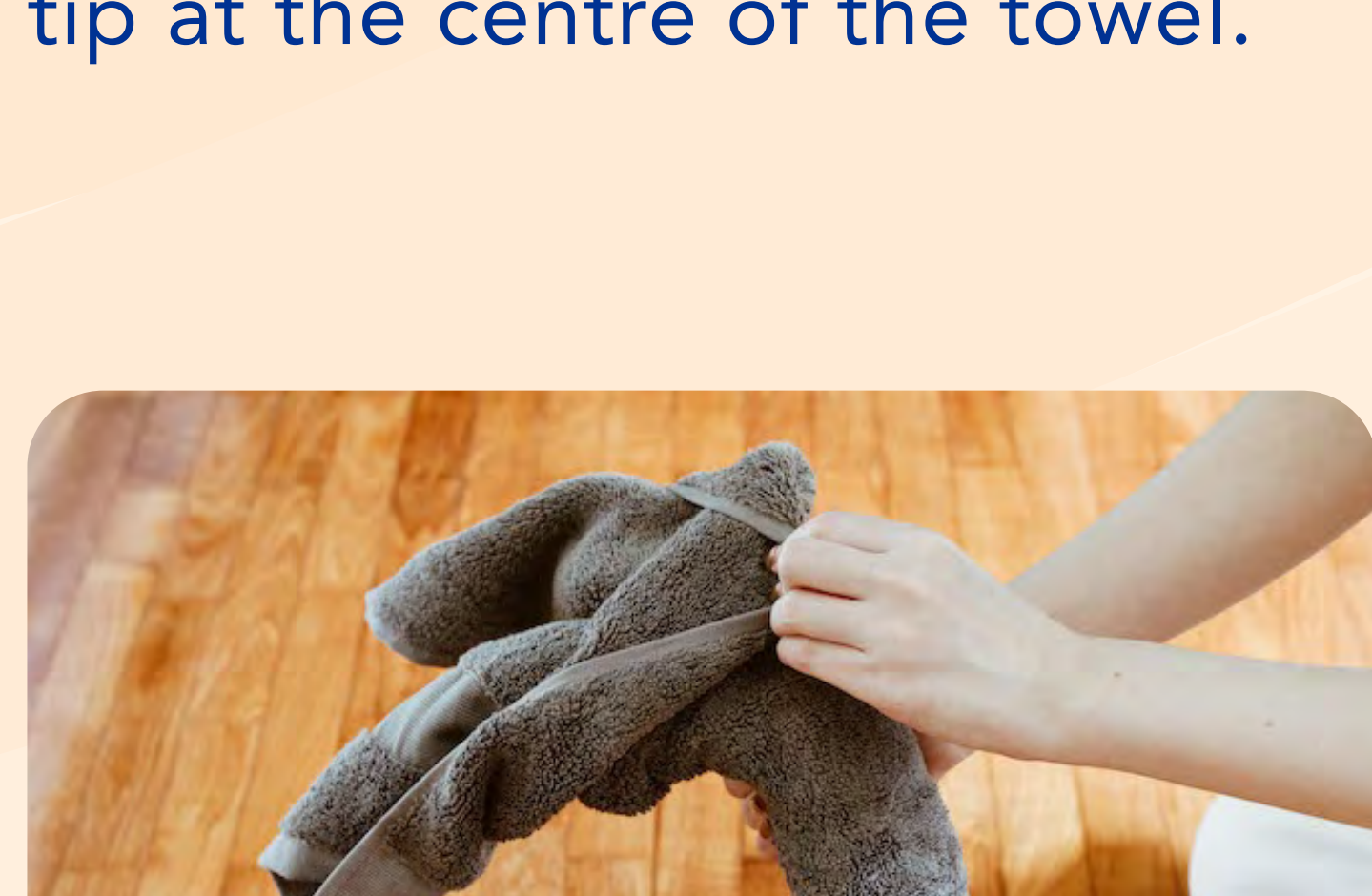
5. Taking the hand towel, fold down two corners to create equal, slanted triangles. The top of the triangles should meet in a sharp tip at the centre of the towel.



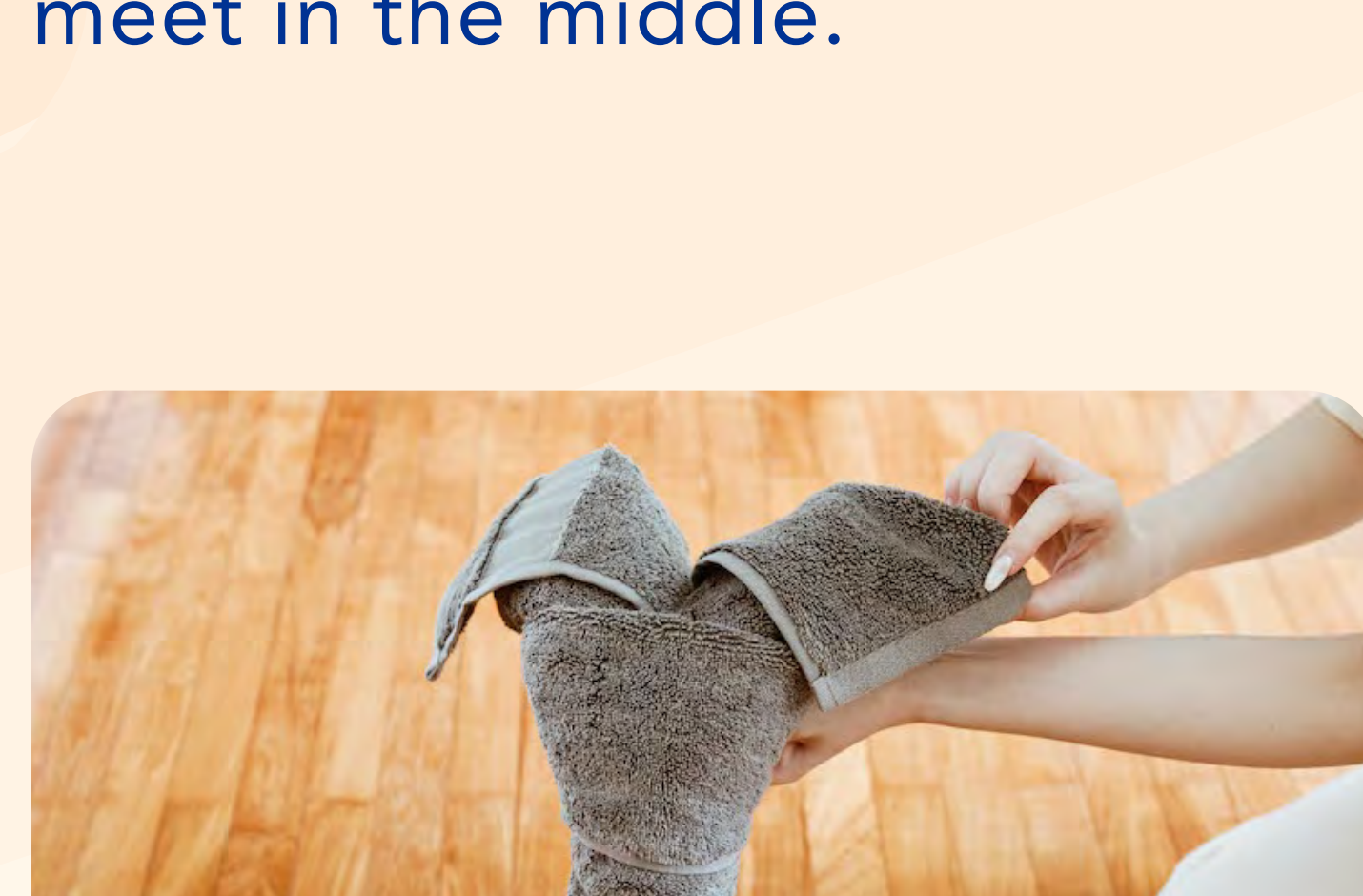
6. Tightly roll the slanted edges of both triangles diagonally towards the centre of the towel. Both rolls should meet in the middle.



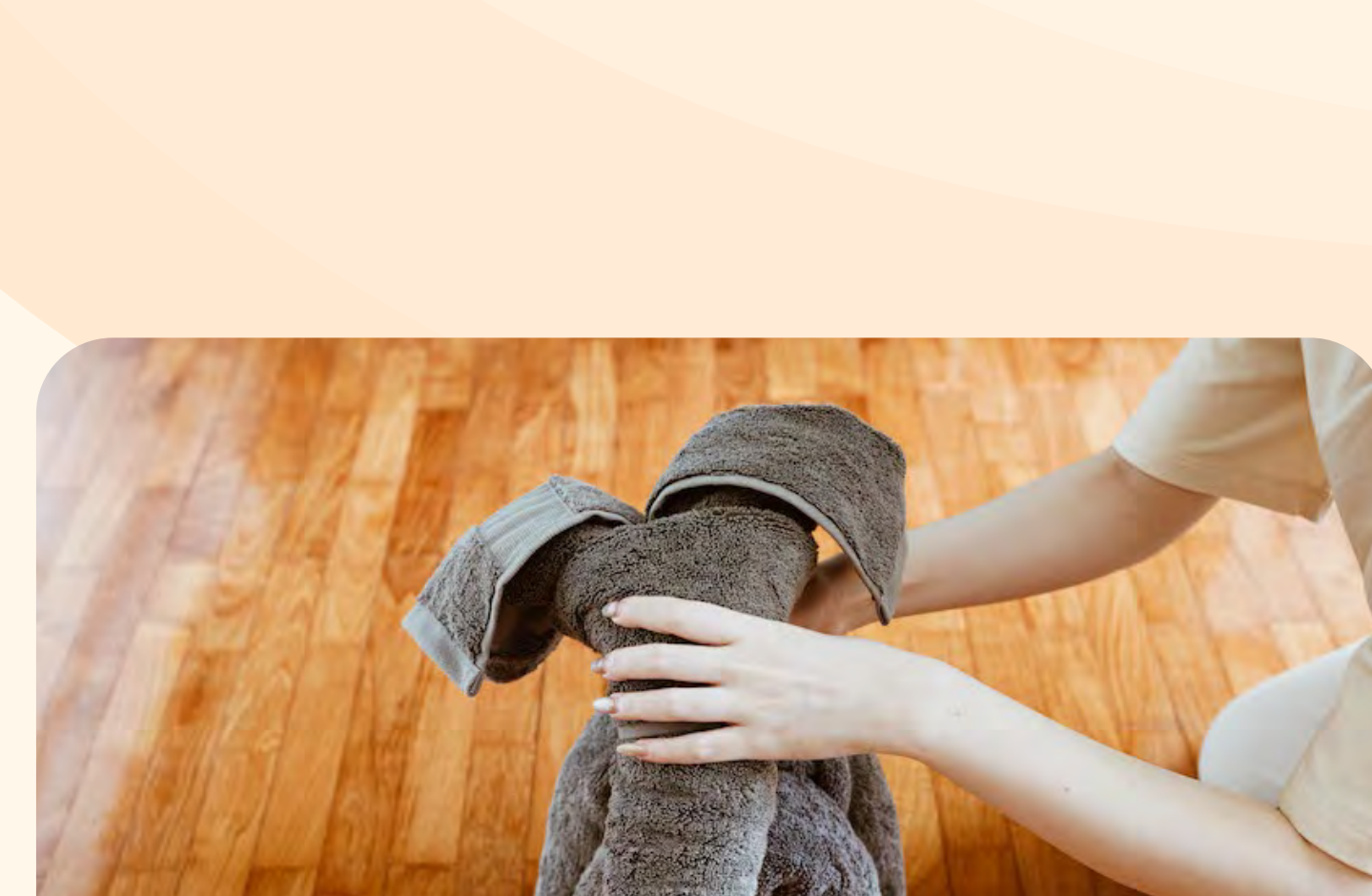
7. Pick up the hand towel so the sharp tip is pointing to the ground. This will be the head of the elephant.



8. Fold down the layer beneath both upright corners to create a cuff. Then, pinch the edges of the cuff together at the back of the elephant's head. You may also fasten them in place with a clothespin.



9. Continue keeping the cuff held together as you turn each upright corner inside out, as shown. This will form the 'ears' of the elephant.



10. Place the head of the elephant on top of its bath towel body, then bend its trunk into shape!
