One of the most anticipated new releases this year is our **2016 The Drake**. It has garnered a lot of attention since James Halliday awarded it **98 pts** in his **2023 Wine Companion**.

From the exceptional 2016 vintage and using the best barrel of cabernet and shiraz from the vintage, we feel this represents outstanding value for money. When you consider it was in the top handful of cabernet/shiraz blends in the Halliday Companion, with the wines around it valued between \$200 and \$900 a bottle, at \$80 it's a bargain!

We have a plethora of other new releases at the moment including the ever reliable and popular **2020 Bernoota** and **2020 Cabernet Sauvignon**. Both were gold medal winners at our Langhorne Creek Wine Show earlier this year and scream `Langhorne Creek'.

The **2021 Section 54 Shiraz** is a fitting follow up to the highly acclaimed 2020 Section 54 Shiraz that received 97 points from Halliday. The 2021 vintage is one of those great years and Greg is super excited about the blends he's put together from this vintage.

Our **2021 Reserve Chardonnay** was awarded the Best White Wine Trophy at our Langhorne Creek Wine Show back in May. This is the 6th occasion it has done so, and Greg thinks this could be the best chardonnay he has produced to date.

We are also thrilled to be releasing a bunch of wines from the super cool 2022 vintage. Our **Old Vine Grenache** and **Nero d'Avola** have just gone to bottle and look superb. Unfortunately, we have limited supplies of both and with them vying for most popular luncheon red at Lake Breeze, it may be a race to see which sells out quickest!

Our **2022 Rosato** and **2022 Vermentino** have just been released in time for the spring and summer festivities. Both are drinking dangerously and in its only wine show appearance, the 2022 Vermentino, was a bee's whisker away from a gold medal at the Royal Adelaide Wine Show with a silver medal and 94pts.

Along with Greg being shortlisted for the Winemaker of the Year, we have once again been given the highest rating of 5 red stars and we're still holding on to the fact we were the 2022 Best Value Winery of the Year.

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VINEYARD REPORT

After two frost events in two years, this spring we have invested in two new static frost fans for the vineyard. They automatically switch on when the temperature drops below 2°C and can each cover 7-8 hectares. We are fortunate to not have experienced any frost events of note this year, the fans have only activated on a few occasions.

This is the third year in a row that Australia has experienced a La Niña event. Whilst our rainfall has been slightly higher than normal, most of the big rains again have fallen on the east coast of the country.

All indicators are showing a later than average harvest, with Langhorne Creek experiencing much cooler conditions than usual.





Grapes for Good global acclaim

We are thrilled that the Langhorne Creek **Grapes for Good** wine trail was announced as a winner at the **2023 Best of Wine Tourism Awards** in Argentina.

After winning an Excellence Award in Adelaide, we were thrown onto the world stage, amongst 11 wine capitals including Bordeaux and San Francisco/Napa Valley.

Our Grapes for Good partnership with five other Langhorne Creek wine producers supports the conservation efforts at the nearby Monarto Safari Park.

Since November 2021, we have raised over \$30,000 for the conservation programs for endangered species at the park.

When you're in Langhorne Creek next, follow the trail to each winery to collect the six Grapes for Good wines. Or visit Monarto Safari Park, it is only 30 minutes from us and is the largest open-range safari park outside of Africa.
