In particular, Nic, our local stonemason has done an amazing job with the limestone sourced from just up the road.

We've been lucky to have a great group of tradies who got along brilliantly (most of the time) despite the work site resembling 'The Block' some days. With 'The Mayor' plying them with coffee and the odd bit of tucker from Brad in the kitchen, I reckon it's one of the better builds they've worked on.

COVID-19 has meant restrictions on dancing, 'vertical consumption' and border closures, which has added to the usual consternation on frocks, flowers and photos. The committee at the Royal Adelaide Wine Show (which Greg chairs) persevered and to their credit successfully held the judging and tastings under COVID-safe conditions. It proved to be the biggest show for some time, with more than 2800 wines entered.

Our 2018 Section 54 Shiraz and 2018 Bull Ant Cabernet Merlot both picked up gold medals.

Our Cabernet has now been a finalist in the coveted 'Outstanding Wines of Provenance' class four times over the last 10 years. As they say; "always a bridesmaid but never the bride".

This year it was our 2004, 2012 and 2018 Cabernets being recognised as one of the five finalists. As the name suggests, our cabernet has great provenance, of which we are duly proud of. Greg says he plans on winning this if it's the last thing he does!

Our 2020 Old Vine Grenache has just been released and is a beautifully fragrant, mid weight wine with some nice crunchy acidity. The popularity of this wine from our 1932 plantings, is off the charts lately.

Sadly, our cracking 2020 Vermentino has nearly sold out, hence the limits on the order form. Unfortunately, two consecutive vintages of low crops have left us short.

The 2019 Reserve Chardonnay is a stunner, one that Greg says he prefers over our award winning 2018 vintage. It has a wonderful balance of fruit and oak, texture and grapefruit like acidity that makes it a joy to drink.

The provenance of our Cabernet Sauvianon speaks for itself and the 2018 vintage is no exception.


Huon Hooke rated our 2018 Cabernet Sauvignon as the number one Cabernet Sauvignon on the Fleurieu Peninsula in his The Real Review tasting. It was then selected to be part of his virtual tasting.

Wine scribe, **Nick Butler** described it as: "A deeply purple glass-stainer. Pure and pristine showing violets, blueberries and mulberries - lovely and fresh, largely uncluttered. Sinewed and structured with long, ripe tannins. Tobacco leaf and cedar in the mix. This is very young and full of life. A beautiful cabernet." 95 pts.
