FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

- Fabric 1—7/8 yard (includes backing)
- Fabric 2—3/8 yard (for binding and appliqué)
- Fabric 3—1/4 yard or fat quarter
- Appliqué fabrics—scraps or fat quarters
- Fusible web product—1 yard
- Muslin—5/8 yard for pillow insert
- Batting-22" x 18"
- Polyester fiberfill—24 oz.

Optional: Curlz MT 2" and 3" font machine embroidery alphabet



CUTTING DIRECTIONS

Apply fusible web to the wrong side of selected fabrics for appliqué following manufacturer's instructions.

Fabric 1:

- Cut 1— $20^{1/2}$ " x $16^{1/2}$ " rectangle for pillow front
- Cut 2—16½" x 14" rectangles for pillow back

Cut 2—2½" strips across the width of the fabric (WOF) for binding

Fabric 3:

- Cut 2—5" circles
- Cut 3-3" circles
- Cut 3—2" circles
- Cut 20-3/4" circles for scattered snow

Appliqué Fabrics:

- Cut 4—3½" squares for gifts
- Cut 3—1" x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " strips for gift ribbons
- Cut 4—bows for gift decorations
- Cut 3—scarves; trim off tails of one scarf to position it off to the side for Mr. Snowman
- Cut 2—toboggan hats
- Cut 1—top hat
- Cut 6—3/4" circles for buttons and toboggan hat pompom
- Cut 3—noses
- Cut 4-stick arms
- Cut 1—stick arm and trim to size for top hat trim
- Cut 1—pair of mittens
- Cut 4—ornament crowns
- Cut 2—3" circles for ornaments; embroider lettering on fabric before cutting shapes
- Cut 2—2" circles for ornaments; embroider lettering on fabric before cutting shapes

Muslin:

Cut 2—201/2" x 161/2" rectangles for pillow insert

SEWING DIRECTIONS

Pillow Case:

- 1. Remove paper backing from appliqué shapes.
- 2. Lay out shapes on $20\frac{1}{2}$ " x $16\frac{1}{2}$ " background fabric rectangle following diagram.
- 3. Fuse shapes in place following manufacturer's instructions.

SEWING DIRECTIONS cont.

- 4. Appliqué edges of shapes by hand or machine.
- 5. Embroider ornament hangers, eyes and mouths by hand or machine. Or draw with permanent fine point fabric marker.
- 6. Layer pillow front right side up on batting. Quilt if desired.
- 7. Trim batting even with raw edges of pillow front. Baste around edges within 1/4" seam allowance.
- 8. Press under $\frac{1}{2}$ " on one $16\frac{1}{2}$ " edge of each $16\frac{1}{2}$ " x 14" pillow back rectangle.
- 9. Press under ½" again to encase raw edge.
- 10. Stitch close to folded edge as shown.
- 11. Lay out one pillow back rectangle wrong sides upon pinning surface.
- 12. Lay out second pillow back overlapping first pillow back to measure $20\frac{1}{2}$ " x $16\frac{1}{2}$ ".
- 13. Position pillow front right side up over pillow backs.
- 14. Pin and baste around edges within $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.
- 15. Add Fabric #2, 21/2" binding strips, mitering corners.

Pillow Insert:

- 1. Pin two, $20\frac{1}{2}$ " x $16\frac{1}{2}$ " muslin rectangles right sides together.
- 2. Sew around edges leaving a 5" opening. Reinforce stitching at opening.
- 3. Turn right sides out through opening.
- 4. Stuff with polyester fiberfill.
- 5. Stitch opening closed.
- 6. Insert pillow form into completed pillow.
