

Canada 150 placemat

CUT FABRIC:

- Interfacing and Backing fabric – 12" x 18" (30.5 x 45.7 cm)
- Background 9 ¼" 12" (23.5 x 30.5 cm)
- Strips measuring between 1 ¼" to 2" x 13" (<33 cm)

ASSEMBLE PLACEMAT:

1. Sew strips together lengthwise, staggering each new strip by 1" (2.5 cm) from the edge of the last. Continue to sew until combined strip widths reach 14" (35.6 cm). Next, turn piece at 45 degrees and trim two pieces measuring 5" x 12" (12.7 x 30.5 cm)
2. Sew background to both side pieces created in step 1, lengthwise.
3. Print maple leaf Canada 150 logo. Draw over logo with Sulky Transfer Pen, then place right side down centered on Background piece. Press with iron to transfer.
4. "Draw" using Double Fold Bias tape over the shape of the logo. Use glue stick and pins to temporarily adhere in place.
5. Edgestitch binding from step 4 in place.
6. Sandwich Backing piece, interfacing, and front. Bind with Extra Wide Double Fold binding tape, using clips to secure as you go.
