Extreme Sampler Fabric Requirements

The class sample was made using a scrappy approach, based on colour families. The number of colour families is your choice.

For example- taupe, brown, blue and cream background were used as the four colour families in the class guilt.

Within <u>each</u> colour family, <u>multiple fabrics</u> ranging from light to dark in tonal and small prints were used. Using multiple fabrics within each colour family adds interest and depth to the blocks.

The only consistent yardage of the same fabric is in the alternate, plain squares between the pieced blocks (blue and brown in the class sample).

Total Fabric Required

For reference, the colours of the fabrics used in the class quilt are listed as well.

Yardage of the same fabric (used in the alternate, plain squares): Alternate squares (blue in class sample)	
Colour families- using multiple fabrics (light to dark) in each:	
Backgrounds (cream in class sample)approximate total	4m
Colour 1 (taupes in class sample) approximate total	3m
Colour 2 (browns-excluding alternate block-in class sample) approx. total	3m
Colour 3 (blues-excluding alternate block- in class sample)approx. total	3m

Recommended Tools

Specialty rulers and notions can help with accuracy. They are not essential, but can make quilting easier.

If you don't have the tools listed below, wait for class- they will be demonstrated and you can decide if you want them at that time.

If you have the tools, bring them along to class.

- Freezer paper (I will supply, if required)
- Easy Angle ruler for half square triangles
- Magic Wand for half square triangles
- Wing Clipper for flying geese
- Quilt in a Day Flying Geese ruler
- Template plastic- firm
- Purple Thang or Awl
- Add a Quarter ruler for paper piecing
- Square 2 for square in a square
- Bias bars for applique
