## Stars in a Box - Class Supply List

This quilt is meant to be scrappy so using a large assortment of fabrics works well- charm squares are ideal. Lap quilt is approx. $54 \times 66$ and baby quilt is approx. $40 \times 48$.

## Fabric Selection and Requirements

Use a good assortment of fabrics for the best result. Avoid using stripes, plaids or directional fabrics, unless you can "ignore" the end result if they end up off center/upside down.

You can make the quilt in a more controlled way by limiting the number of colours in the quilt (for example, using a variety of blue fabrics in the squares with an assortment of yellow rectangles, and navy sashings), but make sure that you use a number of different fabrics in each colour to make the quilt more interesting.

## Lap Quilt (54×66)

- 80 Charm squares (5" squares)- usually 2 packs
- 6 assorted Fat quarters (to be used with the charm squares in the block) and the cornerstones or .2 m of 6 different fabrics
- 2.5 metres for stars, sashing and borders
- Backing- 3 m - not required for class work
- Batting- 1.5 m - not required for class work


## Baby Quilt (40x48)

- 80 Charm squares_(5" squares)- usually 2 packs
- 1.5 m for stars, sashing and borders
- Backing- 1.5 m - not required for class work
- Batting-1.2m-not required for class work

Sewing machine (with manual) and usual sewing supplies:

- New needle in machine, neutral $100 \%$ cotton thread
- Good blade in rotary cutter, cutting mat
- Scissors, pins, sewing supplies
- 7 re-sealable plastic bags (zip lock type)
