

# You and Your Safe-Laser System Apple

IPhones do not presently support navigation by Bluetooth keyboards. You can type using a Bluetooth keyboard, but other controls are not possible from a Bluetooth keyboard.

## Navigating your iPad

---

To navigate your iPad using the Safe-Laser System the first time, you must open the Settings, tap General and go to the Accessibility portion and flip the VoiceOver switch to On. From here, use your arrow keys and the select key to navigate your iPad. You may also use a variety of shortcut key combinations to help navigate the system faster.

## Navigating your Computer

Navigating your Apple Computer can be done using the mouse keys function on your Safe-Laser System. You may also use the arrow keys and enter. A variety of shortcut key combinations may also be used to help navigate the system faster.
