### A Pilgrimage to the Holy Mountain

Through the generosity of a kind benefactor, two hieromonks from the Hermitage of the Holy Cross travelled to Greece and Mount Athos for a pilgrimage in May. They stayed for a week on Mount Athos, traveling by ferry and bus or walking the hiking trails, and taton Church where the "Axion Estin" icon is located, Koutloumousiou Monastery, and also the Skete of St. Andrew (all of which are in or near Karyes, the capital of Mt. Athos). 

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In conjunction with the publication of the Life & Akathist of our patron saint last year, we L commissioned a new icon of St. Panteleimon to be painted by the iconographer whose artwork was featured on the cover of the new booklet. Natalia Popel, the iconographer who resides in Moscow, eagerly accepted the commission and completed the icon over the course of the previous year. The new icon measures about two feet wide and three feet tall. As in the original icon, the central image of St. Panteleimon is surrounded by 16 scenes from the saint's life.

The brotherhood joyful received the new icon during Great Lent, and after adorning the icon with a beautiful gilded frame, installed it in St. Panteleimon's shrine in the monastery church during Bright Week. The serenity and grace of this icon greatly consoles the brotherhood and the pilgrims who come to pray before this holy image. We thank our friends and benefactors who helped bring this icon to our monastery. May St. Panteleimon keep us all under his protection!

## **Announcing the Annual Celebration of the Feast of St. Panteleimon at the Hermitage**

The Hermitage of the Holy Cross invites you to celebrate the feast of the Holy Great Martyr and Healer Panteleimon with the brotherhood and fellow pilgrims of the monastery. His Grace, Bishop Irenei of Sacramento, CA will preside for the feast. Saint Panteleimon is the patron and protector of the Hermitage, and in recent years his Feast has become a second day of pilgrimage for our friends (after our main Pilgrimage Weekend - see below). A Festal Vigil will be served on Tuesday evening, and on Wednesday morning there will be a water blessing and Hierarchal Divine Liturgy, followed by a procession and Moleben to Saint Panteleimon.

At the Moleben, and for seven days thereafter, we will commemorate names of the sick and suffering (both Orthodox and non-Orthodox) who are in need of St. Panteleimon's aid. We are including a commemoration slip and remittance envelope, with which you may submit names, together with your alms, before the August feast.
