In 1882, our great-great grandparents came to Dharmsala and immediately fell in love with the beautiful, lush green tea slopes and the majestic, snow-capped Himalayan peaks. That year, when they founded The Dharmsala Tea Company, the Kangra District Gazette described the tea as 'superior to that produced in any other part of India'.

Kangra Valley is as lush, beautiful and naturally endowed today as it was when George Barnes wrote in his Report on Settlements in the District of Kangra in 1855:


I know no spot in the Himalayah which, for beauty or grandeur, can be compared with the Kangra Valley and these overshadowing hills. No scenery, in my opinion, presents such sublime and delightful contrasts. Below lies the plain, a picture of rural loveliness and repose. The surface is covered with the richest cultivation, irrigated by streams which descend from perennial snows, and interspersed with homesteads buried in the midst of groves and fruit trees. Turning from this scene of peaceful beauty, the stern and majestic hills confront us. Their sides are furrowed with precipitous water-courses; forests of oaks clothe their flanks, and higher up, give place to gloomy and funereal pines. Above all, are wastes of snow, or pyramidal masses of granite, too perpendicular for the snow to rest on.



With such subliminal beauty and peace surrounding our tea gardens in Dharmsala, we have worked hard to ensure that over the decades, our tea remains evocative of our core values of simplicity, naturalness, purity, love, and sustainability.

Today, Dharmsala tea is about so much more than just tea. It's advocating a way of life. Culture, philosophy, art, health, friends and nature intersect in Dharmsala, a place that inspires and moulds our values, a place with which our family has been associated for over 135 years. Inspired by the legendary traditions of Indian weddings, our Tradition Collection suggests both a celebration of the rich traditions of our culture and a vision of the future. Aptly reconciling established and modern, contemporary syling of Indian weddings, the teas in this collection are a product of flawless craftsmanship instituted over a century ago. Each leaf from our tea bushes has been finely and gently plucked by our pluckers, and then hand-crafted meticulously to create masterful blends. In the process, our teas deftly capture the innermost spirit of Dharmsala.

Our Tradition Collection for weddings revolves around traditional Indian elements – rose (gulab), marigold (genda) and jasmine (mogra or kaliyan) and spices, herbs and dry fruits such as holy basil (tulsi), turmeric (haldi), saffron (kesar), cardamom (elaichi), and almonds (badam) – and weaves intricate, beautiful, handcrafted blends out of them.

We know weddings are a special occasion, and more importantly, a deeply personal mile stone. It's a celebration and coming together of people, friends, and families. And so we offer the brides and grooms-to-be a set of customised tea blends that can be packaged in personalized designs to celebrate the uniqueness of their life stories, their relationships and their hopes and dreams for each other.

Holy basil (tulsi) is the central, sacred element of the ceremonial wedding, the Tulsi Vivah, in the ancient Hindu scriptures, signifying the end of the monsoon and the beginning of the wedding season. Considered the "Queen of Herbs", tulsi also has great spiritual healing properties.

Ingredients: Tulsi (Vana & Rama), with the option of marigold flowers.

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
