A PIZZA MY QUILT BLOCK

MATERIALS

*All fabrics are American Made Brand Cotton Solids

Fabrics

19" x 19" piece Dark Aqua (background)

7" x 14" piece Dark Yellow (mozzarella)

6" x 9" piece Light Caramel (crust)

5" x 5" piece Brick (pepperoni)

Etc.

1/2 yard paper backed fusible web

1/2 yard tear away interfacing

Black thread

FINISHED SIZE

18" square

INSTRUCTIONS

APPLY FUSIBLE WEB

Follow manufacturer's instructions on fusible web to apply it to the backside of your three smaller pieces of fabric (Dark Yellow, Light Caramel, and Brick.)

CUTTING

Find your pizza pattern pieces on the next page. Notice some shapes are overlapping to save paper. You may choose to trace each piece onto a separate paper first. With right side of fabric and right side of pattern facing up, trace and then cut out as follows:

From Brick, cut pepperoni pieces:

- P1
- P2
- P3

From Light Caramel, cut crust pieces:

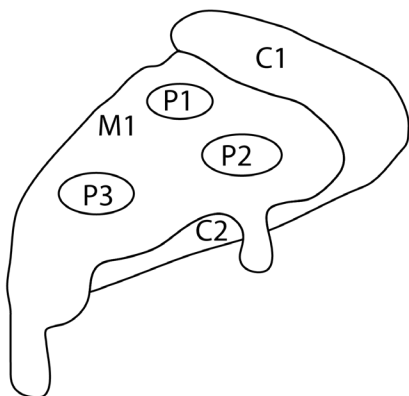
- C1
- C2

From Dark Yellow, cut mozzarella piece:

- M1

ASSEMBLY DIAGRAM

Aqua Background



BLOCK ASSEMBLY

Arrange all pepperoni, crust and mozzarella pieces in the center of turquoise background square, according to assembly diagram. Fuse in place.

Use tear away interfacing behind your work as you sew (follow manufacturer's instructions for interfacing). Machine appliqué using black thread and a satin stitch or zig-zag stitch. It's a good idea to test on a fabric scrap first.

*zig-zag stitch on sample was set at 4.0 stitch width and 0.2 stitch length.

Once stitching is finished, remove interfacing. Press and trim block to 18 1/2" x 18 1/2".

And done! Join with other Row-by-Row blocks, or use your pizza block however you please!
