
## FANCY XX TIGER XX CRAFTS



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#### Designed for Yarn Along the Rockies 2016

The Hops Cowl is designed for us by the amazing Miriam Felton. The pattern uses traveling slip stitches, garter and reverse stockinette stripes for a motley menagerie of textures. The swaying lines and nubby silhouettes remind us of summer hops flowers in the garden.

This cowl knits up with ease—using only one color at a time keeps the stitching simple. The slipped stitches do all the work for you in this cute color-work look. Knerd String's line-up of garment-friendly, locally hand-dyed hues.

# HOPS COWL PATTERN

#### FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Small (shown): 7" deep x 28" circumference Large: 7" deep x 56" circumference (can be worn long or doubled)

#### YARN

2 skeins (1 each of 2 colors) Knerd String Fingering Weight (438y/100g) Shown in: Color 1: Oyster Bay Color 2: So Foxy Enough for two small cowls or one large cowl. Make a pair of mirrored cowls for you and your best friend!

### **NEEDLES & NOTIONS**

US 5 (3.5 mm) circular needle (or size needed to obtain gauge), (24" length for small cowl or 40" length for large cowl) stitch marker cable needle tapestry needle

GAUGE 24 sts & 60 rows =  $4^{"}/10$  cm in garter stitch



#### **ABBREVIATIONS**

CO: cast onslip st from CCN: cable needleK: knitCross sl st over knit RIGHT:P: purlSl next st to the CN, hold to back, sl1 wyib, k1 from CN.RND: RoundSL: Slip a stitch,	the CN, hold to front, p1, CN to RH needle. 1, inserting the needle 1 remains untwisted
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## HOPS COWL

With Using C2, CO 192 (384) sts.

Place marker for beginning of rnd, and join in the round being careful not to twist.

Work from chart, Rnds 1-50, then repeat Rnds 3-50 (Rnds 1 & 2 are the edging).

Repeat Rnds 3 & 4 of chart once more.

Work Rnds 1 & 2 again and bind off.

Block and weave in ends.
