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Designed for Yarn Along the Rockies 2014

This lacey cowl is light and ethereal, the perfect accessory for cool evenings when the temperature dips. The lace pattern is simple and easy to remember, making it a great introduction to lace and satisfying to knit. This Fancy Tiger pattern was designed by us for the 2014 Yarn Along the Rockies yarn crawl. It features Quince & Co's Piper yarn, a 100% Texas grown yarn made with Texas Merino wool & Texas kid mohair. This yarn is available in-store at our Denver location. Other yarns which we offer online that would make a great substitute are the Fibre Co's Meadow, Malabrigo Lace or Madelinetosh Prairie.

PORT ISABEL COWL PATTERN

MATERIALS


1 skein Quince & Co Piper. Sample in color Odessa

TOOLS 16" size US 6 circular needle stitch marker darning needle

GAUGE 20 sts & 40 rows = $4^{"}$ in lace pattern

SIZE 26" around and 15" long

ABBREVIATIONS k2tog: knit 2 stitches together



PORT ISABEL COWL

CAST ON CO 132 sts. Place a stitch marker and join in round.

RIBBED BORDER

Rnd 1-6: (K4, p2) to end of round.

LACE SECTION

Rnd 1: [(K2tog, YO) twice, K2] to marker.

* Remove your stitch marker, slip the last knit stitch from your right needle to left needle, place marker, slip this stitch back to right needle. You have moved the marker back 1 stitch.

Rnd 2: Knit all sts to marker.

Repeat these two lace rounds (moving marker after every Rnd 1) until cowl measures approximately 14". Make sure to reserve enough yarn for the remaining ribbed border (6 rounds).

END RIBBED BORDER

Round 1-6: P1, (K4, P2) to last 5 sts, K4, P1.

Bind off knitwise. Weave in ends.

Block your cowl, and enjoy!
