HARVEST FESTIVAL PONCHO

CROCHET: BASIC

Harvest Festival Poncho is a classic yet modern garment that is filled with the granny st and accented with the knit st. It's quick to make and is SUPER easy to work up (Just 2 rectangles!) Not to mention it drapes beautifully and is the most perfect layering piece that offers warmth and style.

good Yarn

Materials

*included



XS/S: 6 cakes of Viscose & Cotton Baby Yarn (M/L: 7, XL/5X: 8)

Additional Materials



US G/6 / 4 mm, US H/8 / 5 mm, and US J/10 / 6 mm crochet hook



Scissors

Tapestry Needle



Stitch Markers

Designer Notes

- Beginning ch 2 counts as 1 dc
- "Space" refers to the space between the dc sets on previous row
- Knit St place hook between the 2 vertical bars that look like a V located on the front side of work, push hook to back of work, y/o, pull up a loop, y/o again, pull through both loops
- Poncho is made by seaming 2 large rectangles together

abbreviations

CH(S): chains

BLSC: back loop single crochet

ST(S): stitch(es)F/O: finish offRS: right side of work

SLST: slip stitch **WS:** wrong side

X: times

Finished Dimensions

Size:

Recommended Bust: XS/S (30-36"), M/L (37-42"), XI/2X (43-50"), 3X/5X (51-61")

Dimensions (XS/S):

Finished Length (Neck to Bottom): 26" Finished Wingspan: 35" Neck Opening: 11"

Gauge: 16 sts x 8 rows = 4" (5 mm hook)

Row 1: sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each ch across Row 2: ch 2, dc in same st, *skip 2 sts, 3 dc in next st*, repeat ** across until 3 sts remain, skip 2 sts, 2 dc in last st, turn

Repeat rows 3 & 4 from RECTANGLE

Need Help

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Pattern

Note: The stitch count should be the same at the end of each row.

Rectangle (make 2)

With 5mm hook (or hook needed to obtain gauge) ch 62 (65, 71, 74)

Row 1: sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each ch across, turn --- 61 (64, 70, 73) sts

Row 2: ch 2, dc in same st, *skip 2 sts, 3 dc in next st*, repeat ** across until 3 sts remain, skip 2 sts, 2 dc in last st, turn --- 61 (64, 70, 73) sts

Row 3: ch 2, skip 1 st *3 dc in space (see notes), skip 3 sts*, repeat ** across until there are no more spaces, 1 dc in last st, turn --- 62 (65, 71, 74) sts
Row 4: ch 2, dc in same st, *skip 3 sts, 3 dc in space*, repeat ** across until 1 space (or 4 sts) remains, 2 dc in last st, turn --- 61 (64, 70, 73) sts
Repeat rows 3 & 4 until panel reaches approx. 28 (30, 32, 34)" long, and f/o

Assemble:

We will now be folding and seaming our 2 rectangles together

Step 1: Lay out both rectangles on a flat surface like so and seam together using a slst

Step 2: Grab the end of the of the rectangle on the right and fold over on itself approx. 4" (see diagram below)

Step 3: Leaving approx. 4" on the backside of the other rectangle, fold over the first rectangle and align it next to the first rectangle forming a heart shape like so

Step 4: Use st markers to hold in place, make sure the WS is facing you and seam together using slst

Neck Ribbing (optional):

Switch to 4mm hook (or 1 mm hook smaller than hook needed to obtain gauge). With RS facing you, attach a new strand of yarn to one of the V's on the neckline and ch 35

Row 1: sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each ch down, when you reach the neckline, skip the first st that you just made a ch into, slst 2x, turn --- 34 sts **Row 2:** skip the 2 slsts, blsc into each st back up, turn --- 34 sts



Row 3: ch 1, blsc in each st down, slst 2x, turn --- 34 sts

Repeat rows 2 & 3 until you've worked around the neckline. With RS facing you, slst the first and last row of ribbing together and f/o

Border:

Switch to 6 mm hook (or 1 mm hook larger than hook needed to obtain gauge) With RS facing you, attach a new strand of yarn to one of the seams at the bottom of the poncho

Row 1: ch 1, sc loosely around by placing 2 sc in every ch 2/dc and 3 sc at every corner, slst into first st

Row 2: ch 1, knit st around placing 3 sc in every corner, slst into first st (see Notes on page 2 for knit st instructions)

Repeat previous row as many times as desired (I personally repeated it twice) and f/o

Finishing:

Weave in all ends and block (optional)

P.S. If you have leftover yarn, you can always add fringe!

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
