

SEED STITCH CLUTCH

Materials

- * included
- 2 cakes of Darn Good Fancy Twist Yarn

Additional Materials

- * not included
- US 10.5 (7 mm) knitting needles
- Scissors and tapestry needles

Abbreviations

K: knit **P:** purl

St(S): stitch/es PSSO: pass slipped stitch over

K2tog: knit two stitches together **P2tog:** purl two stitches together

KFB: knit in front and back of same stitch



Pattern Notes

- Finished Dimensions: Approximately 10" W x 5.5" H
- Gauge: 4x4 = 13sts by 23 rows
- This piece is worked flat, then seamed on two sides to create an envelope-style clutch

PATTERN

Cast on 30 sts

Row 1: *K1, P1* Repeat across, ending with a P (30 sts)

Row 2: *P1, K1* Repeat across, ending with a K (30 sts).

Rows 3-70: Repeat rows 1 and 2. (30sts)

Row 71: K, P2tog, *p, k* repeat ** to last three sts, k2tog, p (28 sts)

Row 72: P, K2tog, *p,k* repeat ** to last three sts, P2tog, k (26 sts) **Row 73:** K, P2tog, p, *k, p* repeat ** to last three sts, P2tog, p (24 sts)

Row 74: P, k2tog, *p, k* repeat ** to last three sts, P2tog, k (22 sts)

Row 75: K, P2tog, *p, k* repeat to last three sts, P2tog, p (20 sts) Row 76: P, k2tog, *p, k* repeat ** to last three sts, P2tog, k (18 sts)

Row 77: K, P2tog, *p, k* repeat ** to last three sts, P2tog, p (16

sts) **Row 78:** P, k2tog, *p, k* repeat ** to last three sts, P2tog, k (14 sts)

Row 79: K, P2tog, *p, k,* repeat ** to last three sts, P2tog, p (12 sts)

Row 80: P, k2tog, *p, k* repeat ** to last three sts, P2tog, k (10 sts)

Row 81: K, P2tog, *p, k* repeat ** to last three sts, P2tog, p (8 sts)

Row 82: P, k2tog, p, k, P2tog, k (6 sts)

Row 83: K, P2tog, P2tog (4 sts)

Row 84: K,P2tog, k (3 sts)

Row 85: P2tog, k (2 sts)

Row 86: P2tog (1 sts)

Finishing:

Lay your single piece flat with the right side facing up. Fold the bottom third of the fabric up (stopping the fold just before the decreases) and seam up each side using a whip or mattress stitch. Flip right side out.

Optional: Add a decorative tassel to the point of the bag closure with remaining yarn or in a contrasting color. To create a tassel: Cut 12 inch lengths of yarn, and bundle together. Fold the bundle of yarn in half, and use another 12" strand of yarn to secure the bundle at the halfway point. Use one more 12" length of yarn to wrap one inch below the center point, securing both ends of the bundle together.

Optional: To promote stability and limit stretch, line the bag with a fabric liner.
