This year our makers have responded to the theme of Nurture and their works reflect the current social environment, the influence of the pandemic and the climate crisis; and the need to look after each other and our world.

Nurture: Craft ACT annual members exhibition, showcases contemporary expressions of craft and design uniting time-honored techniques with modern interpretations. Craft ACT artists have created work that embodies the wellbeing benefits of creativity and making by hand. Curated by Craft ACT, this exhibition highlights current trends in contemporary craft and design in Australia by accredited practitioners from the ACT and surrounding region.



## Highlights include:

- o *C:/Ovid*, by Caren Florance, an artist book made to bear witness to a very strange time, the many Covid lockdowns.
- River oak (casuarina cunninghamiana) stool and botanical illustration, by Jeremy Brown, celebrates the street trees of Canberra, and allows appreciation of some of the more hidden aspects of its natural beauty. *Incompatible*, by Anita McIntyre, evokes a true sense of place as Mcintrye's continuous exploration of narratives through space and time.
- o *Seedlings*, by Gerhard Herbst, as a metaphorical representation for both our present and future worlds.
- o *Inner World*, by Robyn Campbell, aims to create a meditative, serene space where the tangible and intangible connect.
- Loopholes, by Barabara Rogers, incorporating innovative shibori techniques with traditional resist-dye process to create subtle varied patterns and rhythms within their work.
