2013 LYS Crochet Pattern



Garden Trellis Scarf

Designed by Clare Cronkleton

Yarn: Noro Taiyo Sock (459 yds)

Hook: 2.5 mm "B"

Gauge is not important.

Legend

sl st: slip stitch sk: skip sp(s): spaces ch: chain
sc: single crochet dc: double crochet hdc: half double crochet tr: treble crochet

Trellis Mesh Pattern:

● In first row: dc, ch 2, sk 2 ch, dc in next ch.
Subsequent rows: dc, ch 2, and dc in next st.

Picot Chain-edging Pattern:

* ch 5, sl st in 3rd ch from hook, ch 2 and join into flower with sl st; rep from * all around the edge of flower (during construction of scarf).

Scarf Body

Flowers and leaves are joined with a Trellis Mesh pattern (*see legend for specifics*). The scarf tapers at leaf ends in an organic manner growing asymmetrically from a center foundation ch. Unconventional construction techniques such as chaining across back of completed trellis make each scarf an adventure in creation, just like a garden. The sample scarf body is approximately 52" long. Each flower is added with a Picot Chain-edging pattern (*see legend for specifics*).

Start:

Create a minimum of 4 flowers of each flower motif, and a minimum 2 leaf motifs: (see Flower & Leaf Motifs at end of pattern).

With a leaf, sl st join and ch 275. Join leaf 2 with a sl st. Turn and begin rounds, down 1 side of the chain and up the other with the Trellis Mesh.

Rnd 1: Sl st into next 7 ch, sc into next 5 ch, hdc into next 3 ch, dc in next 2 ch, ch 1, skip 1 ch, dc, ch2, skip 2, dc in next stitch across the span of scarf until near the other leaf, taper by Trellis Mesh, then 2 dc, 3 hdc, 5 sc, 3 Sl st. Working on the opposite side of base ch; sl st in next 5 ch, sc in the next 5 ch. Ch 5 and join flower with Picot Chain-edging. Sl st back down joining ch sc into body of the scarf. Hdc in next ch, ch 1, sk 1 st, dc *ch 2, sk 2 st, dc in next stitch, repeat from* tapering at end by replacing dc with hdc, sc and then a sl st.

Rnd 2: Ch 1 and sl st across back of scarf, ready to taper the trellis. Add the next flower after 3 ch-2 sps. With ch 5, encompassing flower with a Picot Chain-edging and returning to the body of the scarf joining with sl st into last completed dc and continuing with Trellis Mesh to 5 ch sps before end. Add flower, ch 8 for a longer stem. Taper end as in previous round and ch sl st across back of scarf. Add next flower after 11 ch-2 sps and continue on to 14 ch-2 sps before end of round. Add another flower, tapering the scarf to end at flower 1.

Rnd 3: Ch 1 and sl st across back of scarf preparing to taper the trellis. Add the next flower after 6 ch-2 sps. Add flower with a ch stem and Picot Chain-edging. Work the Trellis Mesh down length of scarf. **Taper and then add next flower at 13 ch-2 sps from end. Ch 1 and sl st across the back. Repeat from ** adding last flower without ch stem and continue tapering mesh across the next 5 ch-2 sps.

Rnd 4: Ch 1 and sl st across back of scarf, tapering the Trellis Mesh across 3 ch spaces adding 1 last flower at the other end of the scarf. Chain 1 and sl st across back. Taper mesh at both ends, and complete this side of the scarf.

Rnd 5: Taper the Trellis Mesh across center portion of scarf. Ch 1 and sl st across the Trellis Mesh all the way back to start of scarf.

Rnd 6: Work the Trellis Mesh the entire length of scarf, sl st into back of flower stems where needed.

Rnd 7: Work Picot Chain-edging to end of round.

Flower Motifs modified from "Granny Square Book: Timeless Techniques...." By Margaret Hubert

p. 68 - Gracie Square

First 3 rounds of this pattern are worked from the wrong side.

- Ch 4, join with a sl st to form a ring.
- Rnd 1 (WS): Ch 5 (counts as dc, ch 2), [1 dc, ch 2] 7 times in ring, join with a sl st to 3rd ch of beg ch-5 (8 ch-2 sps).
- Rnd 2 (WS): (Sl st, 2 dc, sl st) in each ch-2 sp around. Join with a sl st in same place as first sl st (8 groups of 2 dc).
- Rnd 3 (WS): Ch 9 (counts as dc, ch 6), sk next 2 dc. 1 dc between next 2 Sl sts, ch 6, sk next 2 dc, rep from * 6 times, join with a sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch-8. Turn (8 ch-6 loops). Turn.
- Rnd 4: Ch 3, 3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc in ch 6 space. *dc in next dc, 3 dc, ch2, 3dc. Repeat from * in each ch 6 space. Join with a sl st in beginning ch.

p. 88 - Christiane

- Ch 8, join with a Sl st to form a ring.
- Rnd 1: Ch 3 (counts as dc here and throughout),
- 23 dc in ring, join with a sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch-3 (24 dc).
- Rnd 2: With right side facing, ch 3, 1 dc in each of next 2 dc, ch 5, sk next st, *1 dc in each of next 3 dc, ch 5, sk next dc, rep from* 4 times. Join with a sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch-3 (6 ch-5 sps).
- Rnd 3: Ch 1, starting in same st, 1 sc in each of next 3 dc, *(2 sc, ch 2, 2 sc) in next ch-5 sp, rep from * 5 times, join with a sl st in first sc (6 ch-2 sps). Turn.
- Rnd 4: With right side facing, ch 3, 1 dc in each of next 4 sc, 3 dc in next ch-2 sp, *1 dc in each of next 7 sc, 3 dc in next ch-2 sp, rep from * 4 times, 1 dc in each of next 2 sc, join with a sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch-3 (60 dc).

p. 64 - Irish Rose

- Ch 6, join with a sl st to form a ring.
- Rnd 1: Ch 5 (counts as dc, ch 2), [1 dc, ch 2] 7 times in ring, join with a sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch-5 (8 ch-2 sps).
- Rnd 2: Ch 1, [1 sc, 1 dc, 1 tr, 1 dc, 1 sc] in each ch-2 sp around, turn (8 petals).
- Rnd 3: With wrong side facing, ch 1, 1 sc in next dc in rnd 1, * ch 3, working behind sts in rnd 2, 1 sc in next dc in rnd 1, rep from* 6 times, ch 3, join with a sl st in first sc, turn (8 ch-3 sps).
- Rnd 4: With right side facing, ch 1, (1 sc, 2 dc, 1 tr, 2 dc, 1 sc) in each ch-3 sp around, join with a sl st in first sc, turn (8 petals).
- Rnd 5: With wrong side facing, * ch 4, working behind rnd 4, sl st in next sc in rnd 3, rep from * around, join with a sl st in first ch of beg ch-4, turn (8 ch-4 sps).
- Rnd 6: With right side facing, ch 1, (1 sc, 2 dc, 3 tr, 2 dc, 1 sc) in each ch-4 sp around, join with a sl st in first sc. Fasten off .

Leaf Motif from “Lacework for Adventurous Crocheters” by Margaret Hubert: p. 97 – Ridge leaf

Notes: When working the ridged leaf; do not count the turning ch 1 as the first st; when turning, do not skip the first st. Starting with row 2, work sts in back loops throughout.

- Ch 11.
 - Row 1: 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook, 1 sc in next 8 ch, 5 sc in last ch. Working across opposite side of foundation ch, 1 sc in each of next 7 ch, turn.
 - Row 2: Ch 1, 1 sc in each of first 9 sc, 3 sc in next sc, 1 sc in next 9 sc, turn.
 - Row 3: Ch 1, 1 sc in each of first 10 sc, 3 sc in next sc; 1 sc in next 8 sc, turn.
 - Row 4: Ch 1, 1 sc in each of next 9 sc, 3 sc next sc, 1 sc in next 9 sc, turn.
 - Row 5: Ch 1, 1 sc in each of next 10 sc, 3 sc in next sc, 1 sc next 8 sc, turn.
 - Row 6: Ch 1, 1 sc in each of next 9 sc, 3 sc in next sc, 1 next 9 sc, turn.
 - Row 7: Ch 1, 1 sc in each of next 10 sc, 3 sc in next sc, 1 sc next 8 sc, turn.
 - Row 8: Ch 1, 1 sc in each of next 9 sc, 3 sc in next sc, 1 sc next 9 sc, turn.
 - Row 9: Ch 1, 1 sc in each of next 10 sc, 3 sc in next sc, 1 sc next 10 sc, end off.
- Ch 6, join with a Sl st to form a ring.
