- People with mental health problems should be given the opportunity to live in their own homes and communities.

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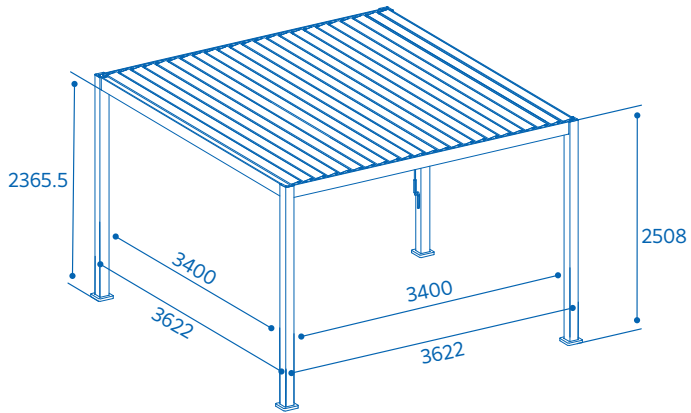
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





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







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


# ASSEMBLY

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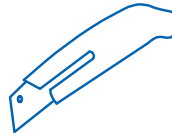
## STEP 1

Check that no parts are missing from the four boxes. Ensure you have the required tools and safety equipment shown in figure 1.

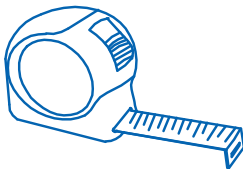

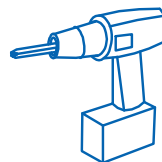

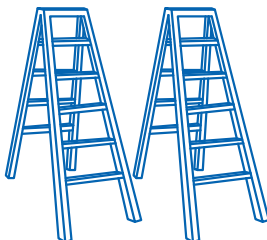

## STEP 2

Slide a collar (I) over the bottom of one of the posts (A) as shown in figure 2, with the rounded part of the collar facing towards the top of the leg. Position base plate (J) over the bottom of the leg section and affix to the leg using 6 bolts (O). Repeat this process for the other three legs.

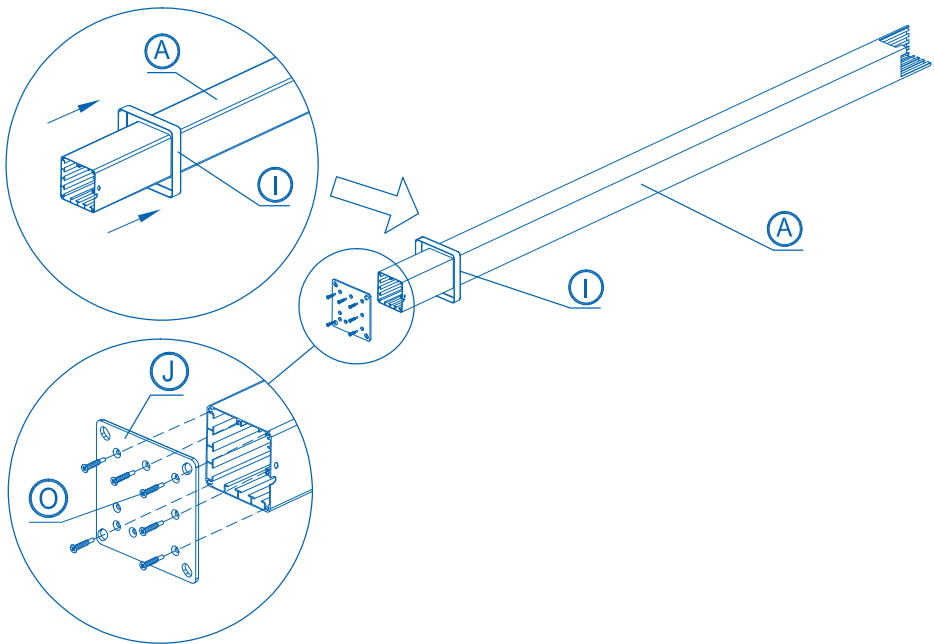

# ASSEMBLY

## STEP 3

Lay two of the leg sections (A) on the ground as shown below. Take the (B1) rail and slide each end into position in the grooves along the top of the leg sections. Use large allen key (Y) to affix the four screws on each corner.

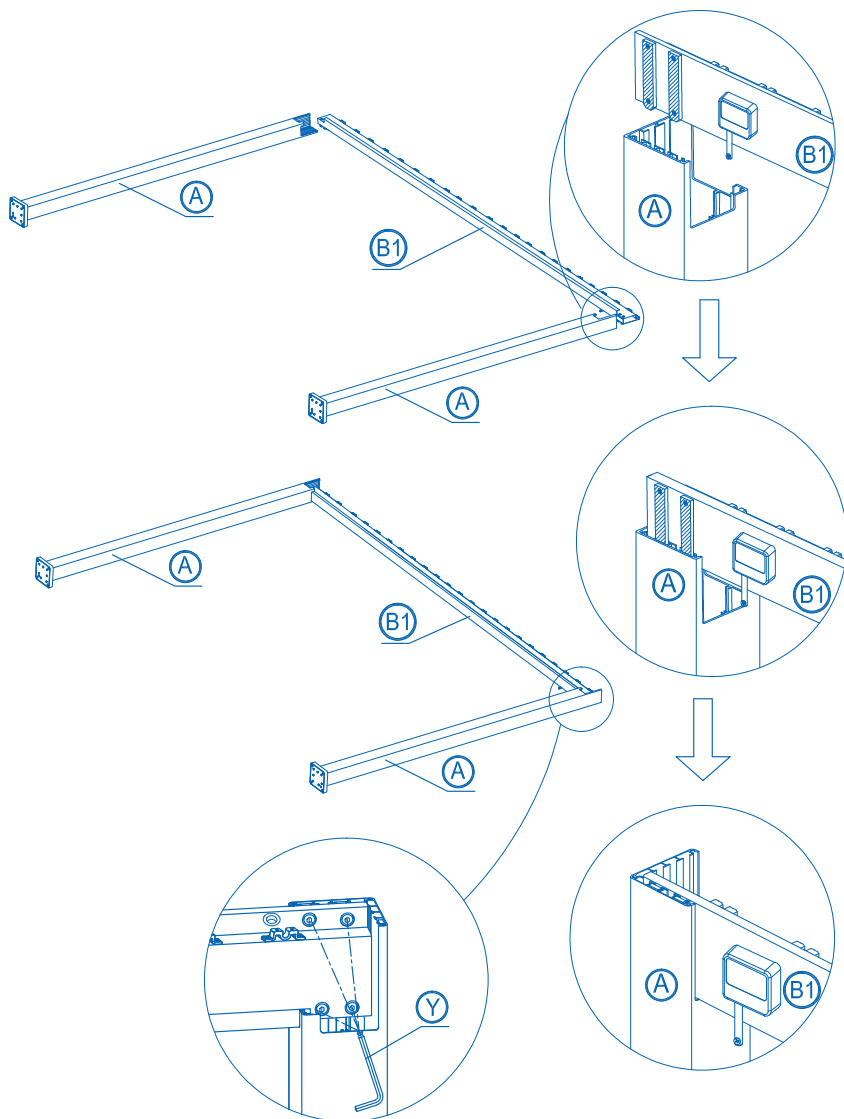

## STEP 4

Lay down the other two leg sections (A) on the ground as shown. Take the (B2) rail and slide each end into position in the grooves along the top of the leg sections, just like the previous step. Use large allen key (Y) to affix the four screws on each corner.

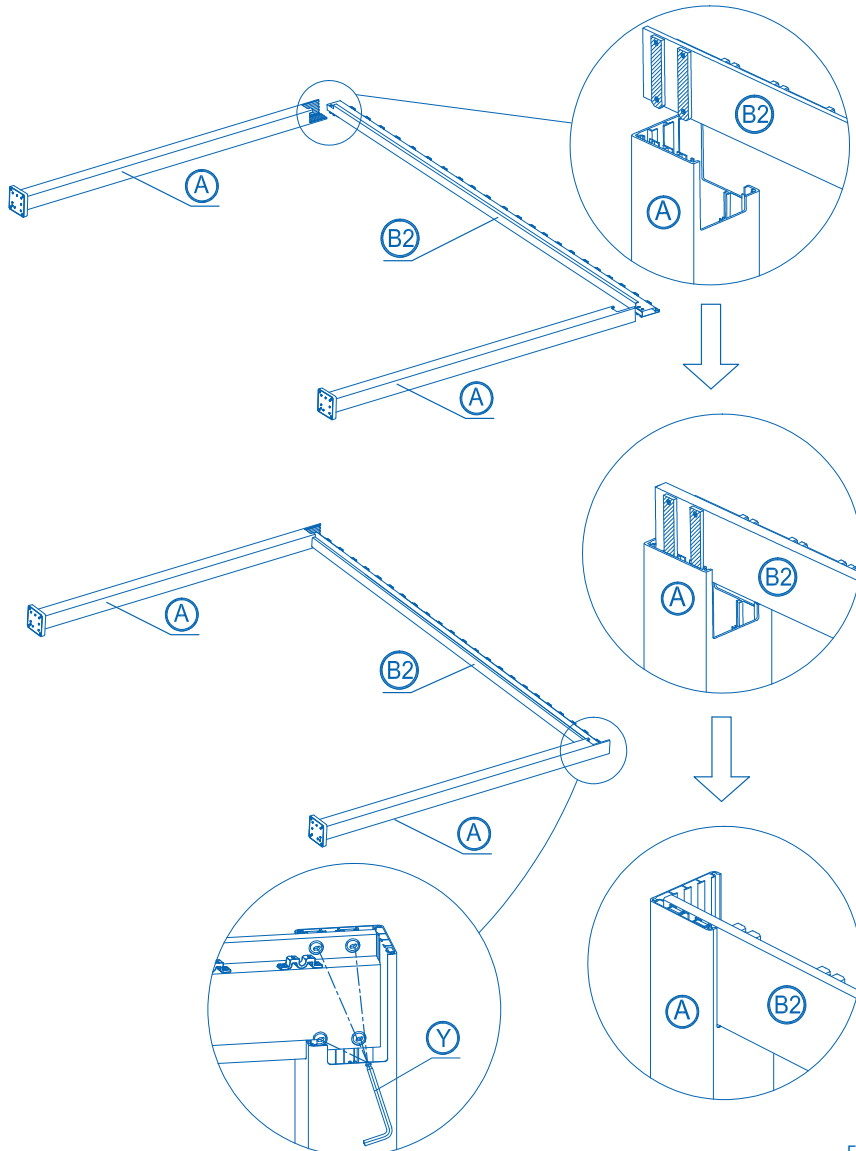

## STEP 5

Working with at least one partner and ensuring everyone is wearing a hard hat, set up two ladders. Lift up one side wall (made up of two legs and a rail) and raise one end of the beam (C) above the opening on the leg section (A). Carefully slide the guides on the beam (C) down into the slots on the leg section (A). Use large allen key to drive in four more screws.

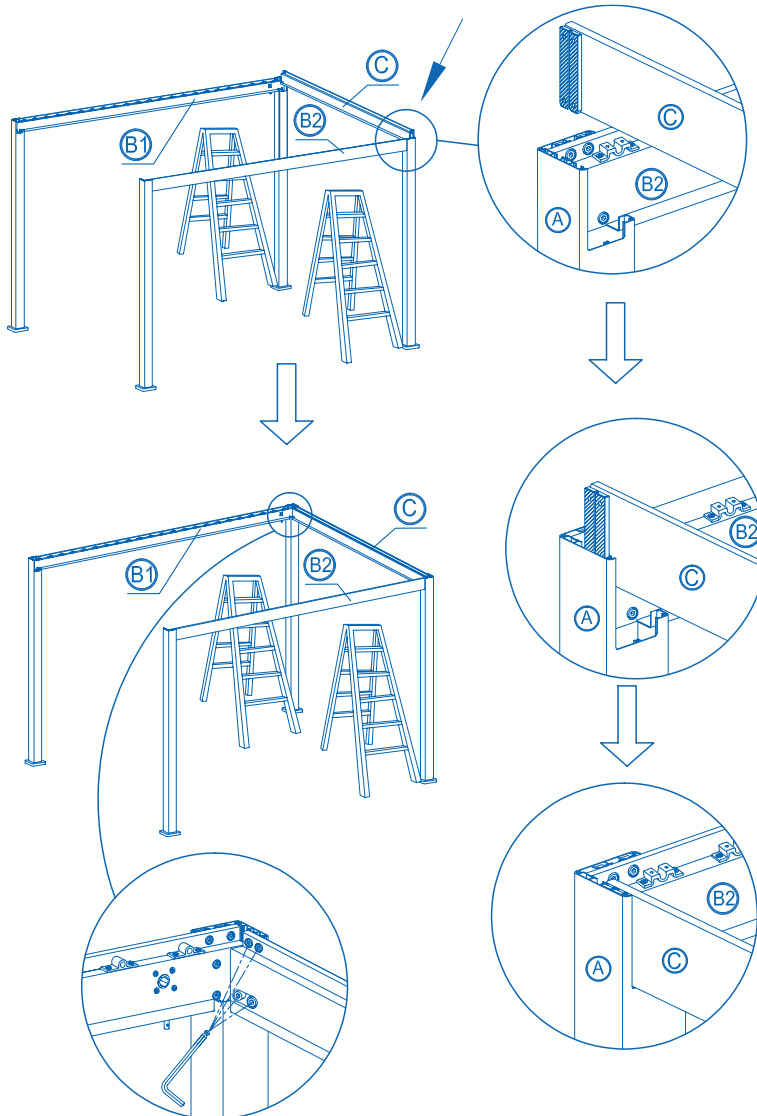

## STEP 6

Move the ladders to the other side of the structure. Install the other beam (C) onto the open end, using the same method as in Step 5.

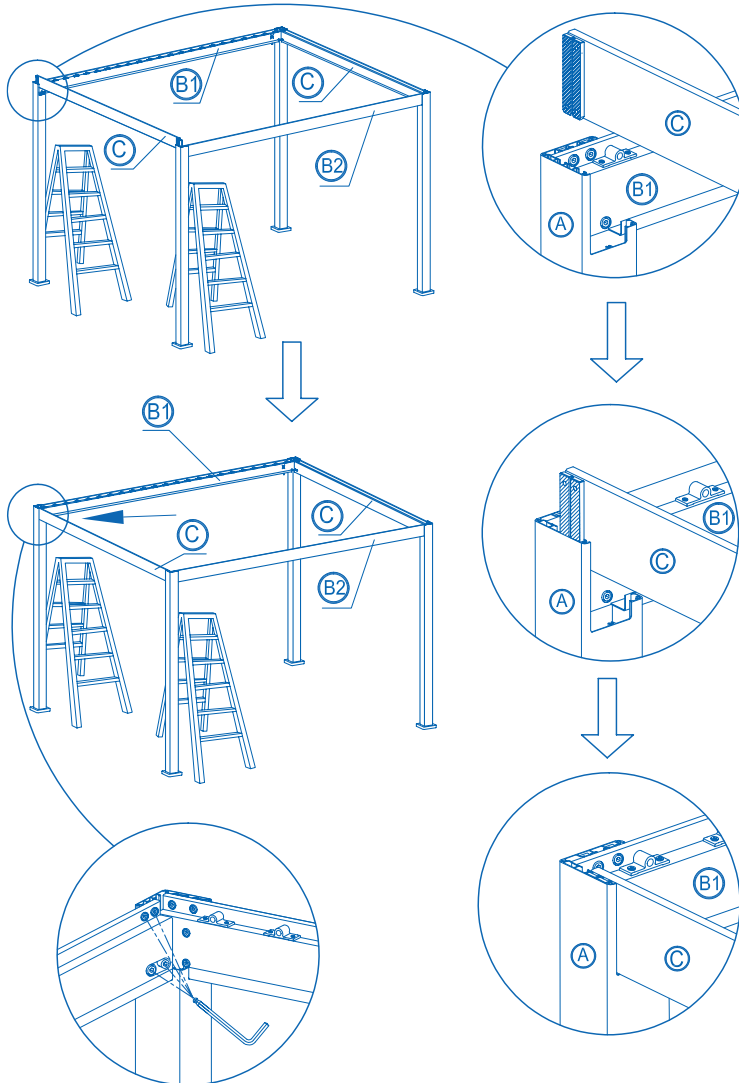

## STEP 7

Find the corner below along the B1 rail with the crank pin hanging down. Remove the screw from the crank pin temporarily. Slide the crank mechanism (V) over the pin, lining up the holes. Drive the screw through both parts. Insert the hook of the crank handle (H) through the crank mechanism (V).

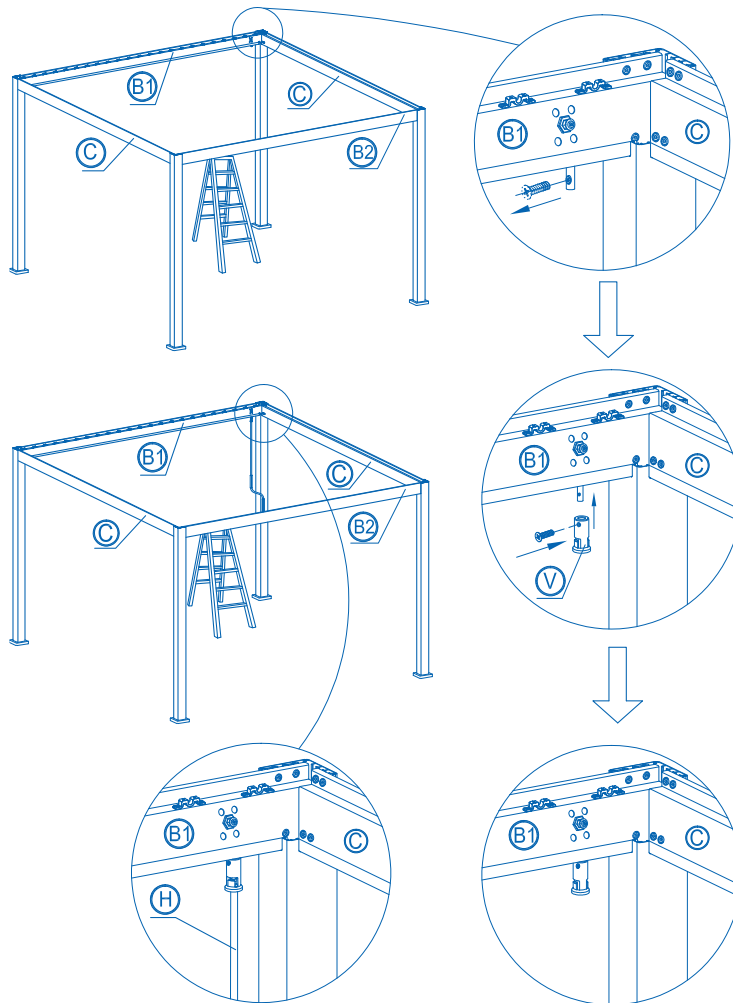

## STEP 8

Take one of the louvres (D) aside and position as shown below, with the large opening facing up and in front of you. Take the louvre arm plate (L) and position it on the inside of the left end of the louvre. Use two of the 25mm screws (Q) to affix the controller to the louvre.

Find one of the louvre plates (K) and position it on the inside of the right end of the louvre. Screw the plate in place using two more of the 25mm screws.

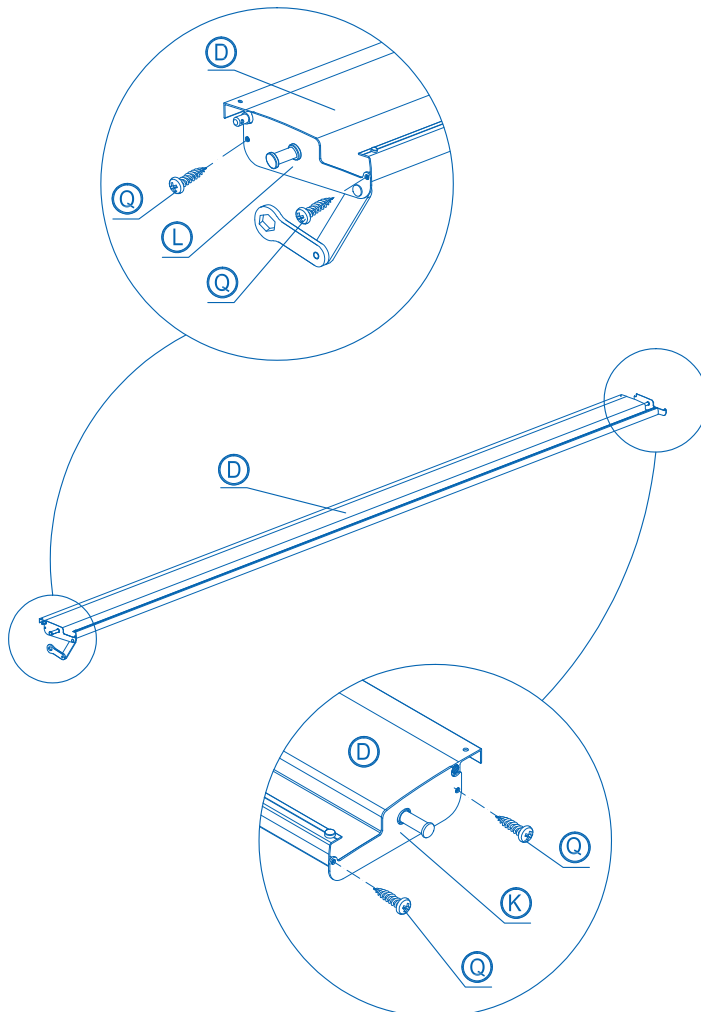

## STEP 9

Remove the crank bolt from the (B) beam using the Allen key (X). Position the louvre at the top of the gazebo with the attached arm (L), lining up the louvre arm (L) with the crank socket on the (B) beam, just above the crank handle (second cradle position). Place the pin on the other end of the louvre in the second cradle position on top of the B2 beam.

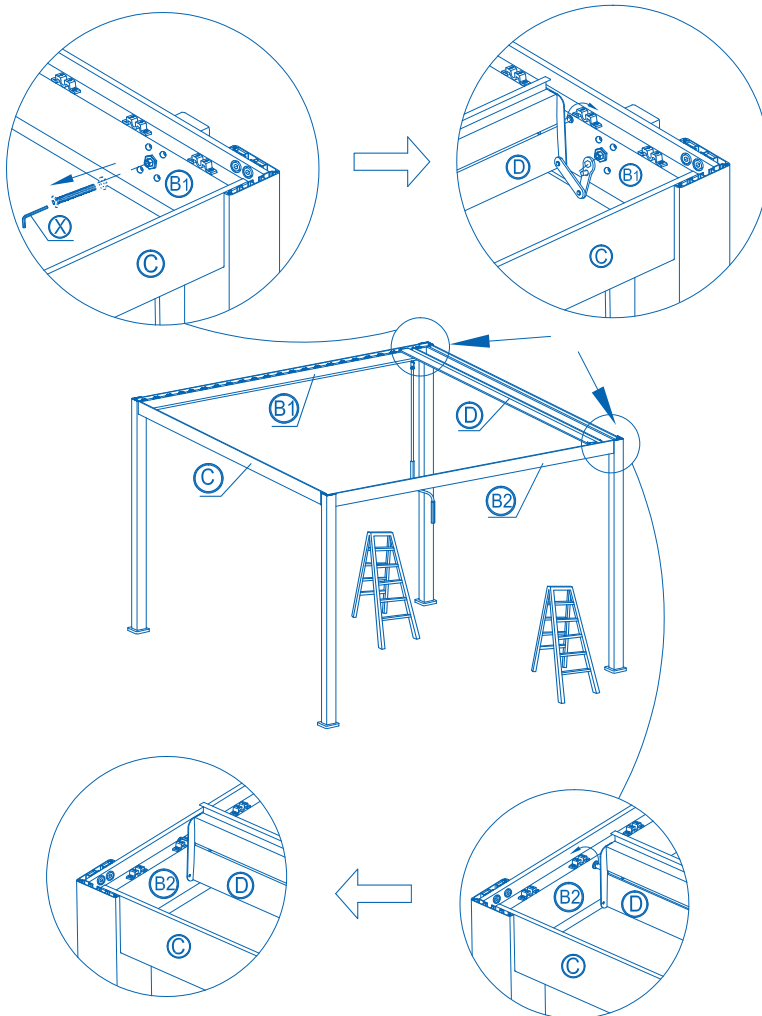

## STEP 10

Ensure the louvre arm (L) is in the correct position (as per illustration).  
Re-insert the louvre bolt and tighten with the Allen key (X).

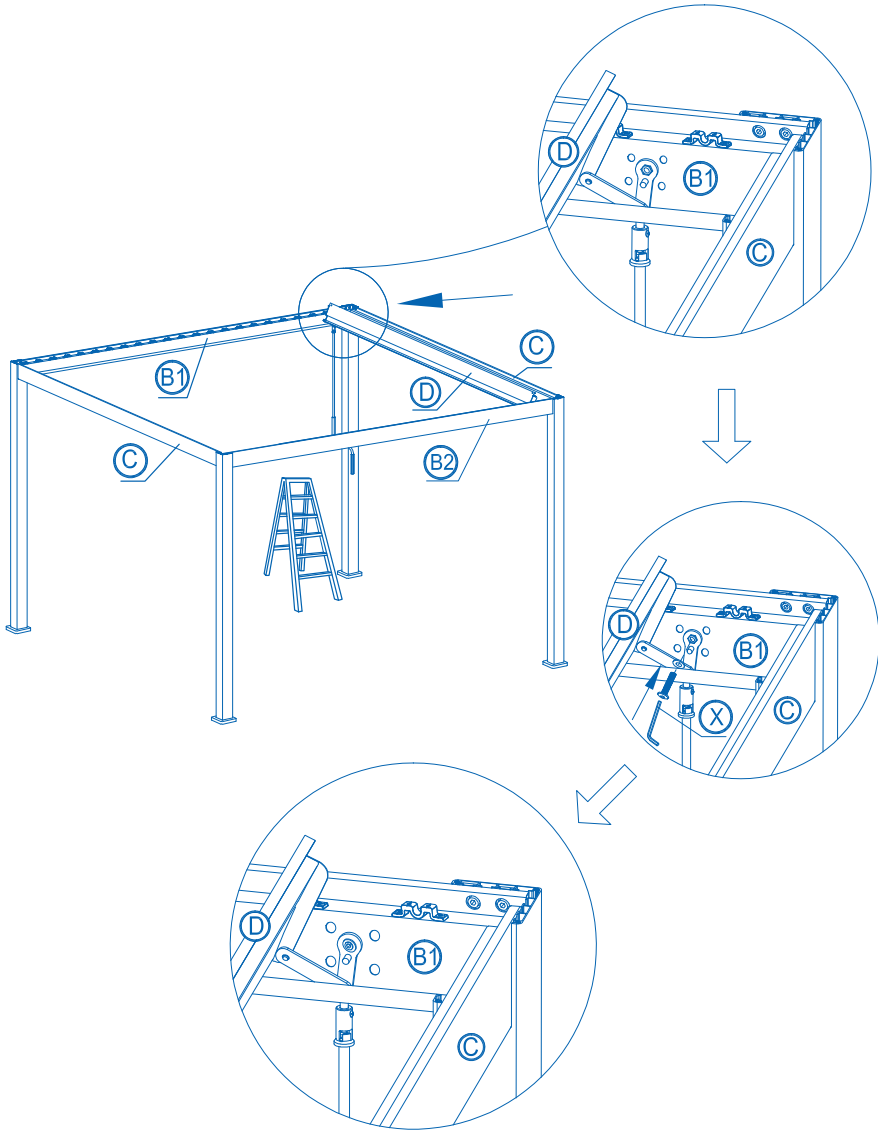

## STEP 11

On the other side of the louvre, secure the louvre pin into the second position slot by placing a small cover (M) on top of the slot section, lining up the holes. Screw the cover in place using two M5 screws (P).

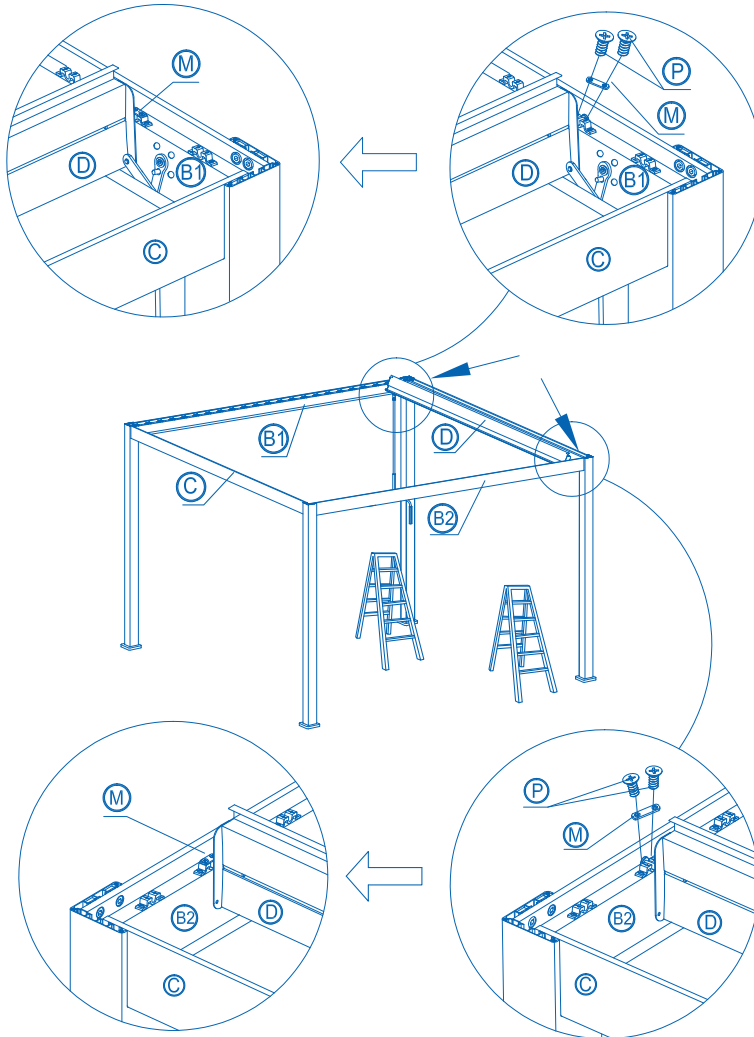

## STEP 12

For each of the remaining 22 louvres, position a louvre plate (K) on the inside of each end. Affix each of the plates into place using two 25mm screws (Q).

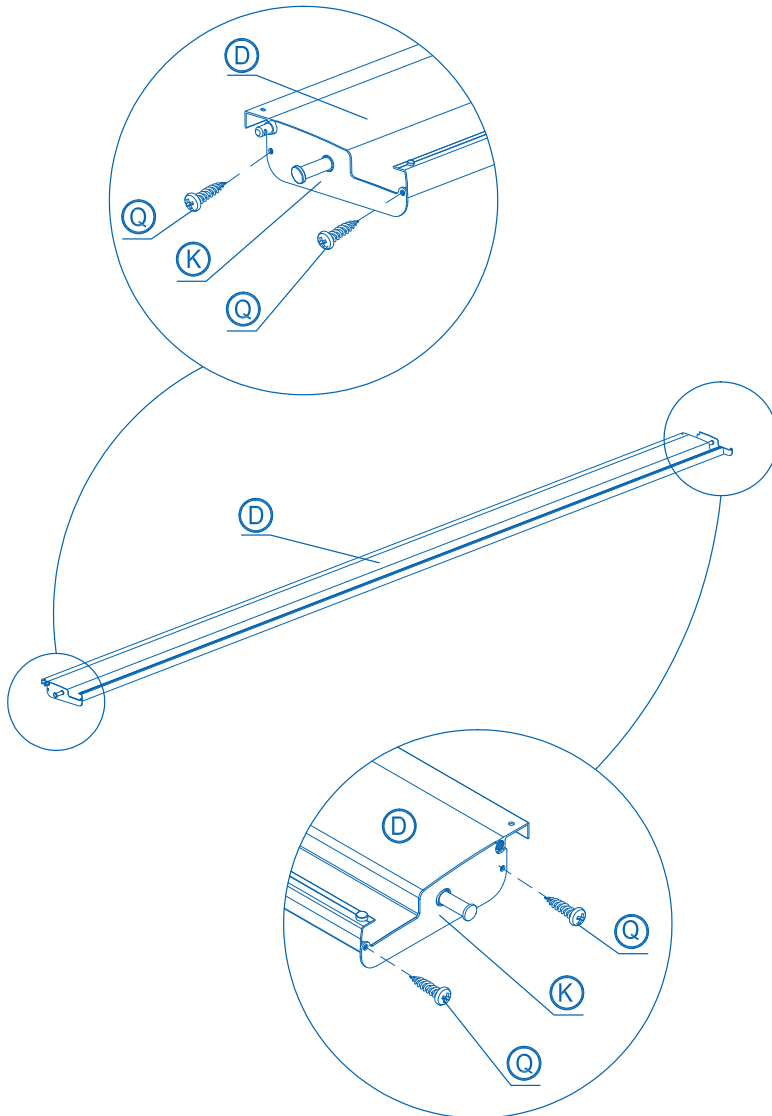

## STEP 13

Install one of these louvres into the first position, next to the beam. Ensuring this louvre is in the same orientation as the one already installed, insert the pin on the crank handle end into the first hole position on the B1 rail. Place the pin on the other end of the louvre into the first position slot. Place a small cover (M) on top and screw down in place using two M5 screws (P).

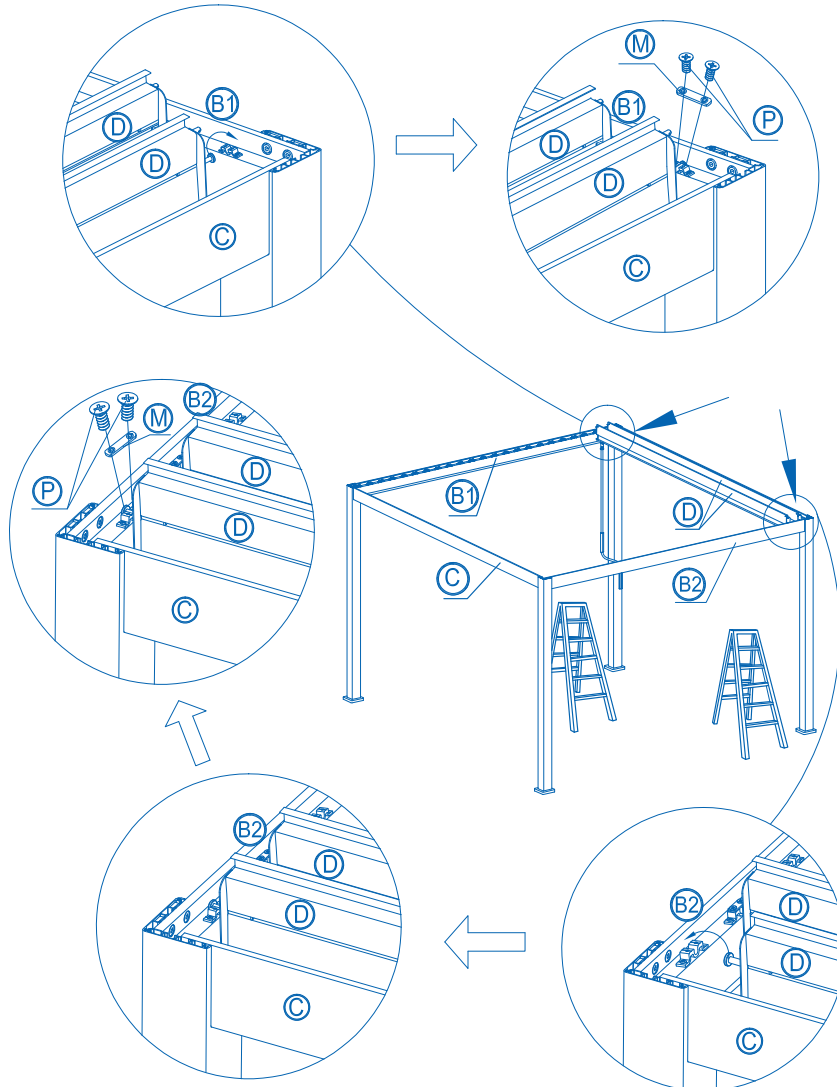

## STEP 14

Carefully twist the crank handle to ensure the louvre already installed in the second position is rotating correctly (note, the louvre in the first position is designed to remain closed). Rotate the louvre and leave it open in a vertical position.

Install the remaining louvres in the same way as before. Ensure each louvre is in the same orientation, insert the pin on one end of the louvre into the hole on the B1 rail, place the other pin into the slot on the opposite end and screw down the small cover (M) with two M5 screws (P).

Adjust the driving louvre in a vertical position.

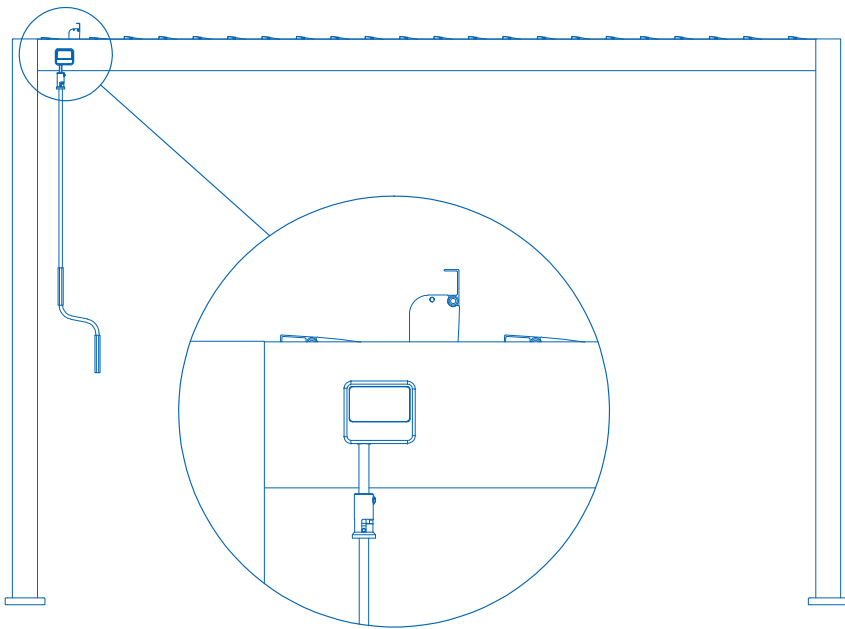

## STEP 15

Once all louvres are correctly installed, take the louvre guide rail (G) and line up the holes with the free louvre pins on the crank handle side. Put the louvre guide rail over the pins as shown below. Push the straight section of a split pin (s) through the small hole of each pin protruding through the guide rail.

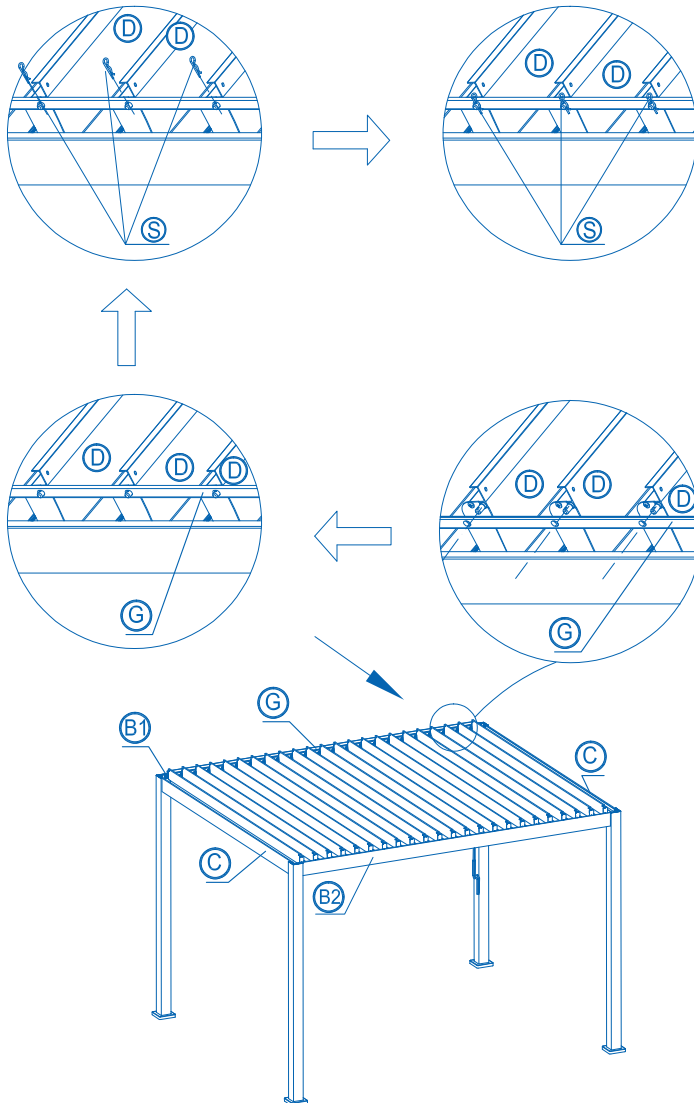

## STEP 16

Position a right-angle plate (N) on top of one of the corners. Use three 19mm screws (R) to affix it into place. Repeat for the remaining corners.

## STEP 17

Secure the feet of the gazebo into the ground. For a hard surface such as concrete or tile, drill holes into the surface through the holes in the feet and install the supplied anchor bolts (W). For other surfaces, use another suitable fastener to secure the gazebo down.

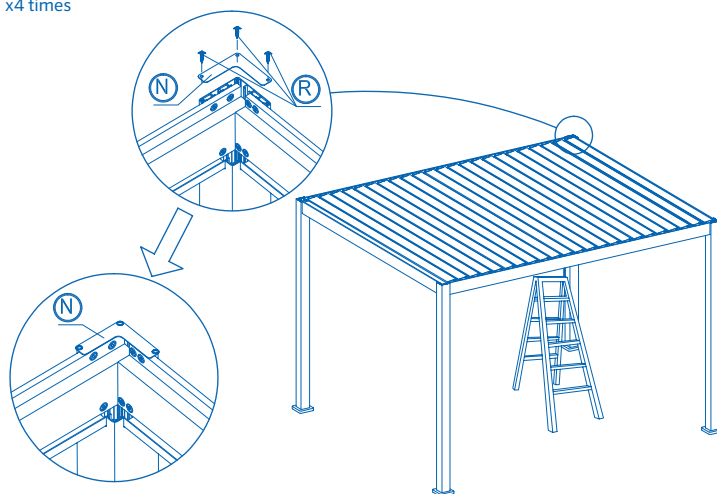

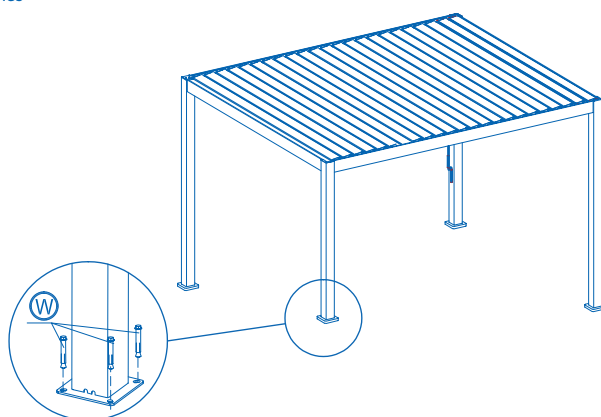

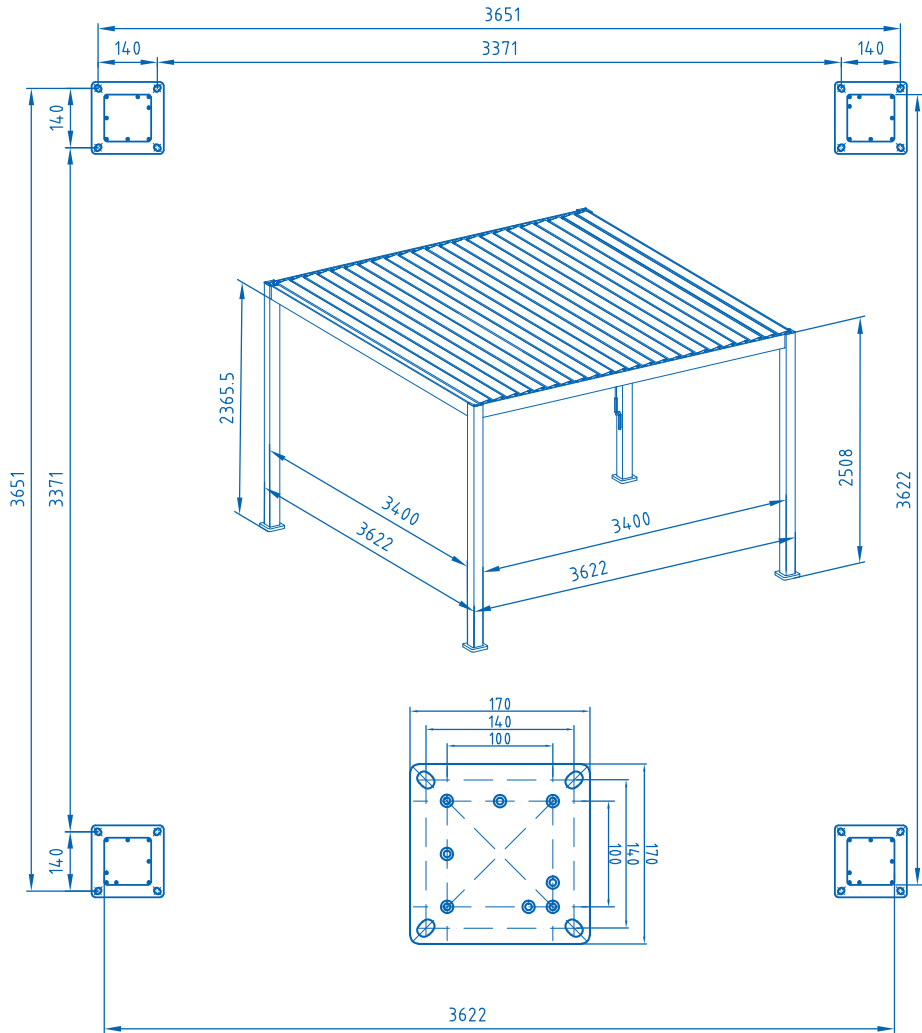

## PRODUCT WARRANTY AND LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

Coolaroo products are manufacture by Gale Pacific Limited ACN 082 263 778 (Gale). Gale provides the following warranty in relation to Coolaroo products ("Product").

The benefits of this warranty are in addition to any rights and remedies imposed by Australian Consumer Law, NZ Consumer Guarantees Act 1993, and state and federal legislation that cannot be excluded. ### WARRANTY

Gale warrants that, subject to the exclusions and limitations below, all parts of the manufacture and assembly of the Product will be free from defects in materials and workmanship for a period of five (5) years for the frame from the date of purchase.

If a defect appears in the Product before the end of the warranty period and Gale finds the product to be defective in materials or workmanship, Gale will, in its sole discretion, either:

- a) replace or repair the Product or the defective part of the Product free of charge; or
- b) refund the purchase price of the Product.

Gale reserves the right to replace defective parts of the Product with parts and components of similar quality, grade and composition where an identical part or component is not available.

The warranty will not apply where:

- a) the Product has been altered or modified by someone other than Gale or its authorised agent;
- b) the alleged defect in the Product is within acceptable industry variances;
- c) Gale cannot establish any fault in the Product;
- d) the defect in the Product has arisen due to the customer's failure to install and use the Product in accordance with the instructions provided;
- e) the defect in the Product has arisen due to the customer's request to customise the Product;
- f) the Product has been subject to abnormal conditions, including environment, temperature, water, fire, humidity, pressure, stress or similar.

The warranty does not extend to:

- a) damage or defects caused by normal wear and tear,
- b) water or sun damage; or
- c) any other damage caused by the customer placing other equipment, furniture or material in close proximity to the Product.

Gale makes no express warranties or representations other than set out in this warranty.

The repair or replacement of the Product or part of the Product is the absolute limit of Gale's liability under this express warranty.

### WARRANTY CLAIMS

This warranty is not transferable, and applies only to the initial purchaser of the installed Product.
