INTRODUCTION


With delightful designs in the daylight and glorious glowing ghouls at night - your DIY Rock Art is sure to surprise a friend, neighbor or passerby!

COLOR MIXING

Your kit includes five colors, great for painting out-of-this world creations. Use this chart to help you mix more! White lightens up any color. And when you add black or blue to darken colors, remember that a tiny bit goes a long way!

STEP-BY-STEP: THE GALAXY EFFECT



Prepare an easy-to-clean work surface and paint mixing palette. Rinse your rock off to remove any dust, and let air dry.



Once you're happy with the look of your painted rock, let it dry completely again. Select a tattoo from the perforated sheets and peel off its clear protective layer.



Paint a dark base layer - this could be solid black, or blue and black mixed together to get navy.



Place the tattoo face down on your rock. Get it damp with a sponge or cloth and hold firmly for about 30 seconds.



Use the sponge brush to add layers of white, pink and blue, making sure to leave some solid streaks of black showing through.



Gently peel off the backing of the tattoo, wipe off any excess water and then let dry again.



Splatter white paint by flicking the bristles of your brush. Then add a few white dots using the "wrong" end of your paint brush to give your starry sky more depth.



Apply a generous coat of the liquid resin over top of your tattoo and all over your rock for a clear, and more weather-proof finish.

TIPS & INSPIRATION



Eyeballs & Polka Dots Your paint brush and sponge brush can make a lot of different marks on your rocks! Experiment painting with the "wrong" end of both tools to create different sized circles. You can even try finding more unique painting tools at home or in nature!





Glow-in-the-Dark Tattoos are designed to show up in the dark, so they'll camouflage into some of the lighter paint colors during the day. This makes them extra fun to hide and seek at night! Simple patterns of paint tend to work best underneath to give your rocks some pizzazz in
