
## **What To Ask Your Doctor**

## 9 MONTH CHECKUP - CHECKLIST YEAR CHECKUP - CHECKLIST Primitive reflex check Crawling on all fours in a typical pattern (not with one leg up or scooting on the Walking or showing signs of being ready bum!) to walk Pulling to stand Standing without help Cruising along furniture Eating and engaging with a variety of foods and textures Pincer grasp development Shows fear, becomes upset when main Making / imitating sounds such as caregiver leaves "mamama" and "dadada"

Recognizes name and the word "no"

Pointing to objects in the environment

Transfers toys from one hand to another

Tolerating a variety of sensory input:

textures, sounds, visuals, etc. (No adverse

Plays peekaboo

reactions)

Recognizes familiar faces

Assisting with dressing

Imitating gestures like waving

Pointing with index finger

Plays hide-and-seek type games -

looking for objects that you hide

Engages in container play - taking items

Imitating words

in / out
