## Installation Instructions

- Make sure the bike is completely cool before starting the installation. Make sure the bike is secure on the sidestand or ideally a rear service stand.
- 2. Remove the right, rear number plate panel.
- 3. Remove the stock exhaust system.
- 4. Install the TBR header.
- Place a bead of the hi-temp sealant on the outside edge of the header that goes into the canister. Slide the TBR canister onto the end of the header. Wipe off the excess sealant that will squeeze out.
- 6. Use the OEM bolt to secure muffler assembly to subframe.
- 7. Make sure everything is aligned and tighten all hardware.
- 8. Before you run the bike, clean off all fingerprints and dirt, as any oily residue will etch the metal and become somewhat permanent when the system gets hot. Run the bike and enjoy. It is normal for some white smoke to appear the first time you start the bike. This is packing/ manufacturing oil from inside the pipe burning off. Check for gaps or leaks. If you find a leak, a little high temperature silicon sealant should fix it. After your first ride, recheck all fasteners for tightness.
